- *Tailor or adapt (something) to specified circumstances.*
- *Guide (someone) in a specified direction.*
- *Align or position (something) relative to the points of a compass or other specified positions.*
- *Find one's position in relation to unfamiliar surroundings.*
- *Be oriented.*

- *Familiarize (someone) with new surroundings or circumstances.*

Specifically design a product, event, or activity for a certain public.  
*She wanted to **aim** a pun.*

### **align**

Align oneself with a group or a way of thinking.  
*The fan blades are carefully **aligned**.*

### **angle**

Direct or incline at an angle.  
*He **angled** his way into the room.*

### **design**

Make a design of plan out in systematic often graphic form.  
*She **designed** a good excuse for not attending classes that day.*

### **direct**

Aim something in a particular direction or at a particular person.  
*He **directed** the children to do their homework.*

<b>dispose</b>	Kill. <i>The Scottish champions were buoyant after they <b>disposed</b> of English champions Leeds.</i>
<b>establish one's location</b>	Use as a basis for; found on.
<b>feel one's way</b>	Grope or feel in search of something.
<b>find one's bearings</b>	Come upon after searching; find the location of something that was missed or lost.
<b>get one's bearings</b>	Communicate with a place or person; establish communication with, as if by telephone.
<b>get the lie of the land</b>	Cause to do; cause to act in a specified manner.
<b><u>intend</u></b>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>It was not <b>intended</b> that colleges should have to revise their current schemes.</i>
<b>orientate</b>	Familiarize (someone) with new surroundings or circumstances.
<b><u>pitch</u></b>	Set one's voice or a piece of music at a particular pitch. <i>A Land Rover came <b>pitching</b> round the hillside.</i>
<b>place</b>	Score a goal by a place kick. <i>Enemy officers were <b>placed</b> under arrest.</i>
<b>point</b>	Insert points in written text of Semitic languages. <i>A sign <b>pointing</b> left.</i>
<b>position</b>	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>I had <b>positioned</b> her as my antagonist.</i>
<b>put</b>	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>He was <b>put</b> in charge of civil defence.</i>
<b>set</b>	Put or set seeds seedlings or plants into the ground. <i><b>Set</b> a broken bone.</i>
<b>situate</b>	Fix or build (something) in a certain place or position. <i>Amy is now comfortably <b>situated</b>.</i>
<b><u>slant</u></b>	To incline or bend from a vertical position. <i>The early sun <b>slanted</b> across the mountains.</i>
<b><u>steer</u></b>	Be a guiding or motivating force or drive. <i>The teacher <b>steered</b> the gifted students towards the more challenging courses.</i>
<b>tailor</b>	Of a tailor make clothes to fit individual customers. <i><b>Tailor</b> your needs to your surroundings.</i>

- *We had to orient ourselves in the forest.*

- archipelago** An extensive group of islands.  
*The Indonesian **archipelago**.*
- boreal** Relating to or denoting the second climatic stage of the postglacial period in northern Europe between the Preboreal and Atlantic stages about 9 000 to 7 500 years ago marked by a warm dry climate.  
*Northern **boreal** forest.*
- continent** Any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica).  
*There are seven **continents**.*
- cosmogony** A theory regarding the origin of the universe.  
*In their **cosmogony** the world was thought to be a square flat surface.*
- direction** Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action.

<b>east</b>	The former communist states of eastern Europe. <i>The river rises <b>east</b> of Brentford.</i>
<b>eastern</b>	Relating to or characteristic of regions of eastern parts of the world. <i>An <b>eastern</b> wind.</i>
<b>europe</b>	An international organization of European countries formed after World War II to reduce trade barriers and increase cooperation among its members.
<b>global</b>	Having the shape of a sphere or ball- Zane Grey. <i>Give students a <b>global</b> picture of what is involved in the task.</i>
<b>globe</b>	Form something into a globe. <i>Orange trees clipped into giant <b>globes</b>.</i>
<b>history</b>	The continuum of events occurring in succession leading from the past to the present and even into the future. <i>A <b>history</b> of France.</i>
<b>intercontinental</b>	Extending or taking place between or among continents. <i><b>Intercontinental</b> exploration.</i>
<b>locate</b>	Take up residence and become established. <i>The company <b>located</b> some of their agents in Los Angeles.</i>
<b>location</b>	The action of locating someone or something. <i>They shot the film on <b>location</b> in Nevada.</i>
<b>north</b>	The northern part of England. <i>The <b>north</b> bank of the river.</i>
<b>occident</b>	The countries of (originally) Europe and (now including) North America and South America.
<b>occidental</b>	A native or inhabitant of the West. <i><b>Occidental</b> civilization.</i>
<b>oriental</b>	(of a pearl or other jewel) orient. <i><b>Oriental</b> countries.</i>
<b>south</b>	Move towards the south. <i>The village is a few miles <b>south</b> of Cambridge.</i>
<b>southeast</b>	The direction corresponding to the southeastward compass point. <i><b>Southeasterly</b> breezes.</i>

<b>southern</b>	In or characteristic of a region of the United States south of (approximately) the Mason-Dixon line. <b><i>Southern</i></b> cooking.
<b>southwest</b>	To toward or in the southwest. <i>The winds are <b>southwesterly</b>.</i>
<b>transnational</b>	Extending or operating across national boundaries. <b><i>Transnational</i></b> advertising agencies.
<u><b>universal</b></u>	A thing having universal effect currency or application. <i>In motor vehicles a <b>universal</b> joint allows the driveshaft to move up and down as the vehicle passes over bumps.</i>
<u><b>universe</b></u>	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>The front parlour was the hub of her <b>universe</b>.</i>
<b>west</b>	A location in the western part of a country region or city. <i>It will become windy in the <b>west</b>.</i>
<b>western</b>	A sandwich made from a western omelet. <b><i>Western</i></b> thought.
<b>world</b>	A particular period of history. <i>The outdoor <b>world</b>.</i>
<u><b>worldwide</b></u>	Of worldwide scope or applicability. A <b><i>worldwide</i></b> epidemic.
