- An event that is a beginning; a first part or stage of subsequent events.





## Synonyms of "Origination" as a noun (10 Words)

creation	The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new. <i>She treats fictional creations as if they were real people.</i>
foundation	A coloured cream, powder, or liquid used as a base to even out facial skin tone before applying other cosmetics. <i>There is little <b>foundation</b> for his objections.</i>
<u>founding</u>	Food and lodging provided in addition to money.
inception	The establishment or starting point of an institution or activity. She has been on the board since its <b>inception</b> two years ago.
<u>initiation</u>	A formal entry into an organization or position or office. <i>His dullness was due to lack of <b>initiation</b>.</i>



innovation	A new method, idea, product, etc. <i>Innovation</i> is crucial to the continuing success of any organization.
instauration	The action of restoring or renewing something.
institution	A well-established and familiar person or custom. A delay in the <b>institution</b> of proceedings.
introduction	A book or course of study intended to introduce a subject to a person. Your talk will need an <b>introduction</b> which states clearly what you are

- **introduction** Your talk will need an **introduction** which states clearly what you are talking about and why.
- **origin** The source of something's existence or from which it derives or is derived. *The terminology has its origins in America.*
