### Definitions of "Origination" as a noun

- *The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new.*
- *An event that is a beginning; a first part or stage of subsequent events.*



## Synonyms of "Origination" as a noun (10 Words)

- creation** The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new.  
*She treats fictional **creations** as if they were real people.*
- foundation** A coloured cream, powder, or liquid used as a base to even out facial skin tone before applying other cosmetics.  
*There is little **foundation** for his objections.*
- [founding](#) Food and lodging provided in addition to money.
- [inception](#) The establishment or starting point of an institution or activity.  
*She has been on the board since its **inception** two years ago.*
- [initiation](#) A formal entry into an organization or position or office.  
*His dullness was due to lack of **initiation**.*

**innovation** A new method, idea, product, etc.  
***Innovation** is crucial to the continuing success of any organization.*

**instauration** The action of restoring or renewing something.

**institution** A well-established and familiar person or custom.  
*A delay in the **institution** of proceedings.*

**introduction** A book or course of study intended to introduce a subject to a person.  
*Your talk will need an **introduction** which states clearly what you are talking about and why.*

**origin** The source of something's existence or from which it derives or is derived.  
*The terminology has its **origins** in America.*



### Usage Examples of "Origination" as a noun

- *There are a number of theories on the origination of the name.*
- *Mortgage loan originations were up 15 per cent.*
