## Synonyms of "Ornate" as an adjective (13 Words)

- adorned** Provided with something intended to increase its beauty or distinction.  
Relating to or denoting a style of European architecture music and art of the 17th and 18th centuries that followed Mannerism and is characterized by ornate detail In architecture the period is exemplified by the palace of Versailles and by the work of Wren in England Major composers include Vivaldi Bach and Handel Caravaggio and Rubens are important baroque artists.
- baroque** *The candles were positively **baroque**.*  
Of facilities such as telephones or lavatories unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability engaged is a British term for a busy telephone line.  
*The lavish set designs are a little too **busy**.*
- decorated** Provided with something intended to increase its beauty or distinction.

<b>elaborate</b>	(of an action) lengthy and exaggerated. <i>The <b>elaborate</b> register of the inhabitants prevented tax evasion.</i>
<b>fancy</b>	(of an animal) bred to develop particular points of appearance. <i>I used to take a seat and busy myself in sketching <b>fancy</b> vignettes.</i>
<b>flamboyant</b>	Elaborately or excessively ornamented. <i>The band s <b>flamboyant</b> lead singer.</i>
<b>florid</b>	Inclined to a healthy reddish color often associated with outdoor life. <i><b>Florid</b> symptoms of psychiatric disorder.</i>
<b>flowery</b>	Of or relating to or suggestive of flowers. <i>Her <b>flowery</b> perfume.</i>
<b>fussy</b>	Full of unnecessary detail or decoration. <i>He is very <b>fussy</b> about what he eats.</i>
<b>ostentatious</b>	(of a display) tawdry or vulgar. <i>An <b>ostentatious</b> sable coat.</i>
<b>rococo</b>	(especially of music or literature) extravagantly or excessively ornate. <i>His labyrinthine sentences and <b>rococo</b> usages.</i>
<b>showy</b>	Marked by ostentation but often tasteless. <i>She wore a great deal of <b>showy</b> costume jewellery.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Ornate" as an adjective

- *Ornate rhetoric taught out of the rule of Plato.*



## Associations of "Ornate" (30 Words)

- adorned** Provided with something intended to increase its beauty or distinction.

- adornment** *Precious stones have been used for the purposes of **adornment** for over 7 000 years.*
- beaded** Covered with beads of liquid.

- beautification** The act of making something more beautiful.  
*The city commissioned the **beautification** of the tunnel with work by five artists.*
- bedeck** Decorate.  
*He led us into a room **bedecked** with tinsel.*
- brooch** Fasten with or as if with a brooch.



<b>carat</b>	A measure of the purity of gold pure gold being 24 carats. <i>22 <b>carat</b> gold.</i>
<b>chandelier</b>	Branched lighting fixture; often ornate; hangs from the ceiling.
<b>circlet</b>	A circular band, typically one made of precious metal, worn on the head as an ornament.
<b>decoration</b>	Something used to beautify. <i>Christmas tree <b>decorations</b>.</i>
<b>decorative</b>	Attractive (typically used of a woman). <i>A <b>decorative</b> artist.</i>
<b>deluxe</b>	Luxurious or sumptuous; of a superior kind. <i>A <b>deluxe</b> car.</i>
<b>diamond</b>	A card of the suit of diamonds. <i>He led a small <b>diamond</b>.</i>
<b>earring</b>	Jewelry to ornament the ear; usually clipped to the earlobe or fastened through a hole in the lobe.
<b>flowery</b>	Smelling of flowers. <i>A <b>flowery</b> speech.</i>
<b>gem</b>	Used in names of some brilliantly coloured hummingbirds e.g mountain gem. <i>This architectural <b>gem</b> of a palace.</i>
<b>gemstone</b>	A crystalline rock that can be cut and polished for jewelry.
<b>gild</b>	Decorate with, or as if with, gold leaf or liquid gold. <i>In 1436 he <b>gilded</b> and painted statues for Bruges Town Hall.</i>
<b>jewellery</b>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems). <i>A <b>jewellery</b> box.</i>
<b>jewelry</b>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems).
<b>luxurious</b>	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. <i>A <b>luxurious</b> wallow in a scented bath.</i>
<b>luxuriously</b>	In a rich manner.
<b>opulent</b>	Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality. <i>The <b>opulent</b> comfort of a limousine.</i>
<b>ostentatious</b>	Intended to attract notice and impress others. <i>An <b>ostentatious</b> sable coat.</i>
<b>pendant</b>	A necklace with a pendant. <i>I slipped the <b>pendant</b> over my neck.</i>

<b>pendent</b>	Branched lighting fixture; often ornate; hangs from the ceiling. <i>The use of jurisdiction to decide <b>pendent</b> claims.</i>
<b>precious</b>	Of great value; not to be wasted or treated carelessly. <i><b>Precious</b> memories.</i>
<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>His <b>rich</b> bass voice.</i>
<b>sumptuous</b>	Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality. <i>The banquet was a <b>sumptuous</b> luxurious meal.</i>
<b>trinket</b>	Cheap showy jewelry or ornament on clothing.
