flowery Of or relating to or suggestive of flowers.

Her **flowery** perfume.

fussy Full of unnecessary detail or decoration.

He is very **fussy** about what he eats.

ostentatious (of a display) tawdry or vulgar.

An **ostentatious** sable coat.

rococo (especially of music or literature) extravagantly or excessively ornate.

His labyrinthine sentences and **rococo** usages.

showy Marked by ostentation but often tasteless.

She wore a great deal of **showy** costume jewellery.
