- An otherwise totally black cat with a single white whisker.
- All the staff were otherwise engaged.
- The Cosa Nostra, otherwise known as the Brotherhood.
- She thought otherwise.





# Associations of "Otherwise" (30 Words)

adversary	Someone who offers opposition. The confrontations of <b>adversary</b> politics.
also	In addition; too. Dyslexia <b>also</b> known as word blindness.
another	Any of various alternatives; some other. Put it off to <b>another</b> or some other day.
antithetical	Directly opposed or contrasted; mutually incompatible. <i>Practices entirely</i> <b>antithetical</b> to her professed beliefs.
<u>barring</u>	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
<u>besides</u>	In addition. I m capable of doing the work and a lot more <b>besides</b> .
comparison	Qualities that are comparable. No <b>comparison</b> between the two books.



contrarily	Contrary to expectations.
contrast	The difference between tones in a television picture, photograph, etc. His friend s success <b>contrast</b> ed with his own failure.
contrastingly	In a contrasting manner.
diametrical	Of or along a diameter. <i>He s the <b>diametrical</b> opposite of Gabriel.</i>
different	Differing from all others; not ordinary. <b>Different</b> parts of the country.
differently	In another and different manner. <i>Differently</i> coloured pens.
<u>discrete</u>	Individually separate and distinct. Speech sounds are produced as a continuous sound signal rather than <b>discrete</b> units.
<u>disparate</u>	Containing elements very different from one another. <i>Disparate ideas</i> .
<u>dissimilar</u>	Marked by dissimilarity. A collection of <b>dissimilar</b> nations lacking overall homogeneity.
<u>distinction</u>	A distinguishing quality. I was completely unaware of class <b>distinction</b> s.
diversity	The state of being diverse; variety. Newspapers were obliged to allow a <b>diversity</b> of views to be printed.
etcetera	Additional unspecified odds and ends; more of the same. <i>His report was full of <b>etcetera</b>s.</i>
except	Take exception to. Five classes of advertisement are <b>except</b> ed from control.
exclude	Prevent from entering; keep out. Apply flux to <b>exclude</b> oxygen.
instead	As a substitute or alternative to; in place of. <i>He didn t call rather or <b>instead</b> he wrote her a letter.</i>
<u>omit</u>	Leave out or exclude (someone or something), either intentionally or forgetfully. <i>He modestly</i> <b>omit</b> s to mention that he was a pole vault champion.
opposite	Of leaves or shoots arising in pairs at the same level on opposite sides of the stem. <b>Opposite</b> meanings.
other	Denoting those remaining in a group or those not already mentioned. The <b>other</b> evening.



perceptibly	In a noticeable manner.
<u>relatively</u>	In relation, comparison, or proportion to something else. <i>The site was cheap and <b>relatively</b> clean.</i>
<u>unlike</u>	Not equal in amount. He was very <b>unlike</b> to any other man.
unshared	Not shared. Most of those placed in hostels would prefer <b>unshared</b> independent accommodation.
<u>vary</u>	Differ in size, amount, degree, or nature from something else of the same general class. <i>The properties vary in price.</i>
