ebony	Used in names of trees that produce timber similar to ebony e.g. Jamaican ebony or American ebony. <i>His <b>ebony</b> hair.</i>
fawn	Have fawns. <i>The forest was closed for hunting when the does were <b>fawning</b>.</i>
gray	Horse of a light gray or whitish color. <i><b>Gray</b> flannel suit.</i>
grey	Showing characteristics of age especially having grey or white hair. <i>Dirty intermediate tones of <b>grey</b>.</i>

<b>hue</b>	A colour or shade. <i>Men of all political <b>hues</b> submerged their feuds.</i>
<b>magenta</b>	A primary subtractive color for light a dark purple red color the dye for magenta was discovered in 1859 the year of the battle of Magenta. <i>A short <b>magenta</b> dress.</i>
<b>marbled</b>	Patterned with veins or streaks or color resembling marble. <i>Attractively <b>marbled</b> cloth or paper.</i>
<b>maroon</b>	Of a brownish-red colour. <i>The travellers were <b>marooned</b>.</i>
<b>orange</b>	A butterfly with mainly or partly orange wings. <i>The most shocking of pinks and <b>oranges</b>.</i>
<b>phosphorescence</b>	A fluorescence that persists after the bombarding radiation has ceased. <i>The stones overhead gleamed with <b>phosphorescence</b>.</i>
<b>pigmentation</b>	Coloration of living tissues by pigment.
<b>pink</b>	The pink ball in snooker. <i>The car <b>pinked</b> when the ignition was too far retarded.</i>
<b>polychrome</b>	Color with many colors make polychrome. <i>Painters gilded and <b>polychromed</b> the wooden carvings.</i>
<b>purple</b>	Make or become purple in colour. <i><b>Purple</b> tyrant.</i>
<b>red</b>	Denoting a red light or flag used as a signal to stop. <i>His hair was <b>red</b>.</i>
<b>sky</b>	Throw or toss with a light motion. <i>Hundreds of stars were shining in the <b>sky</b>.</i>
<b>somber</b>	Lacking brightness or color; dull. <i>A suit of <b>somber</b> black.</i>
<b>tint</b>	Dye someone s hair with a tint. <i>The sky was taking on an apricot <b>tint</b>.</i>
<b>welkin</b>	The sky or heaven.
<b>white</b>	Restricted to whites only. <i>A bottle of house <b>white</b>.</i>
<b>yellow</b>	Any of a number of plant diseases in which the leaves turn yellow typically caused by viruses and transmitted by insects. <i>He missed an easy <b>yellow</b> in frame four.</i>
