Associations of "Out of whack" (30 Words)

aboveground	On or above the surface of the ground. <i>Aboveground nuclear testing.</i>
absentee	A person who is expected or required to be present at a place or event but is not. <i>Absentee pupils.</i>
away	Out of the way especially away from one's thoughts. <i>The boat was 5 miles off or away.</i>
barring	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
besides	Making an additional point; anyway. <i>I'm capable of doing the work and a lot more besides.</i>
by	So as to go past. <i>A car flashed by on the other side of the road.</i>
decriminalize	Make legal. <i>A battle to decriminalize cannabis.</i>
depart	Deviate from (an accepted, prescribed, or usual course of action). <i>He departed from the precedent set by many.</i>
dispel	Force to go away; used both with concrete and metaphoric meanings. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to dispel Elaine's dejection.</i>
dwelling	Housing that someone is living in. <i>The proposed dwelling is out of keeping with those nearby.</i>
elimination	The expulsion of waste matter from the body. <i>The elimination of extreme poverty is a key objective.</i>
except	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are excepted from control.</i>
exclude	Put out or expel from a place. <i>Apply flux to exclude oxygen.</i>

exemption	A deduction allowed to a taxpayer because of his status (having certain dependents or being blind or being over 65 etc. <i>Additional exemptions are allowed for each dependent.</i>
exhale	Give off (vapour or fumes). <i>The chimney exhales a thick smoke.</i>
habitable	Fit for habitation. <i>The habitable world.</i>
habitation	The act of dwelling in or living permanently in a place (said of both animals and men). <i>He studied the creation and inhabitation and demise of the colony.</i>
hall	United States astronomer who discovered Phobos and Deimos (the two satellites of Mars) (1829-1907). <i>For a brief time they had shared a room in hall.</i>
home	Return home accurately from a long distance. <i>A home win.</i>
leave	Leave behind unintentionally. <i>Leave your child in the nurse's care.</i>
obviate	Avoid or prevent (something undesirable). <i>A parachute can be used to obviate disaster.</i>
offstage	(in a theatre) away from the stage and so not visible to the audience. <i>Offstage political meetings.</i>
omit	Prevent from being included or considered or accepted. <i>He was omitted from the second Test.</i>
outdoors	Outside a building. <i>A lover of the great outdoors.</i>
outside	Coming from the outside. <i>Was he as straight as he appeared on the outside.</i>
porch	A structure attached to the exterior of a building often forming a covered entrance. <i>The north porch of Hereford Cathedral.</i>
redefine	Define again or differently. <i>The role of the Emperor was redefined.</i>
respire	Undergo the biomedical and metabolic processes of respiration by taking up oxygen and producing carbon monoxide. <i>Lichens respire at lower levels of temperature and moisture.</i>
tent	Cover with or as if with a tent. <i>The circus tented near the town.</i>
