## Synonyms of "Outcast" as a noun (7 Words)

<b>castaway</b>	A shipwrecked person. <i>A <b>castaway</b> on a desert island.</i>
<b>ishmael</b>	The son of Abraham who was cast out after the birth of Isaac; considered the forebear of 12 Arabian tribes.
<b>pariah</b>	An outcast. <i>They were treated as social <b>pariahs</b>.</i>
<b>persona non grata</b>	An actor's portrayal of someone in a play.
<b>reject</b>	The person or thing that is rejected or set aside as inferior in quality. <i>Some of the team's <b>rejects</b> have gone on to prove themselves in championships.</i>
<b><u>untouchable</u></b>	Belongs to lowest social and ritual class in India.



## Usage Examples of "Outcast" as a noun

- *She went from trusted pal to ostracized outcast overnight.*

### Definitions of "Outcast" as an adjective

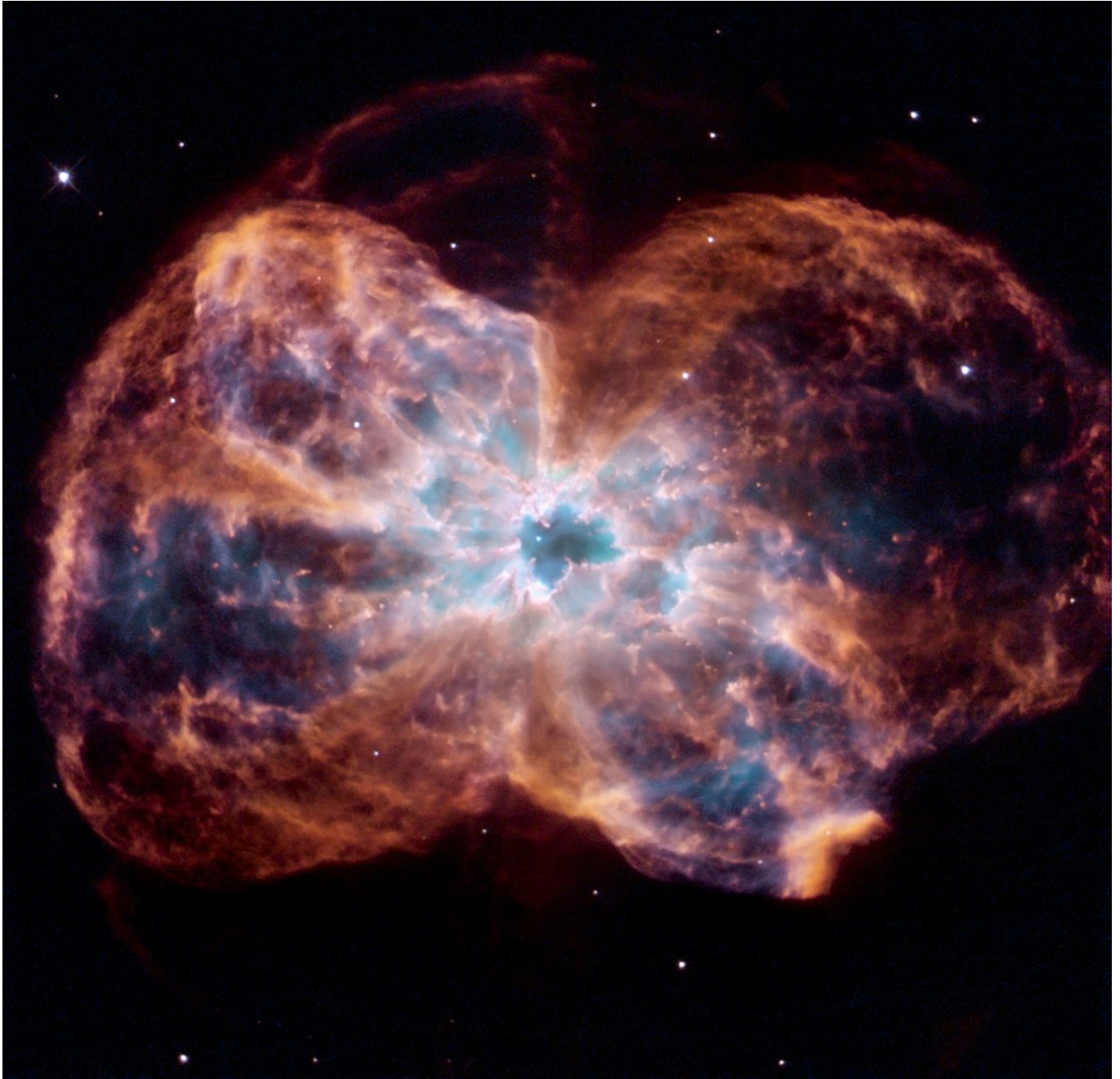
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "outcast" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a person) rejected or ostracized.*
- *Excluded from a society.*



## Synonyms of "Outcast" as an adjective (1 Word)

**friendless** Excluded from a society.  
*They have been left virtually **friendless**.*



## Usage Examples of "Outcast" as an adjective

- *They can be made to feel outcast and inadequate.*

- alien** A person who comes from a foreign country; someone who does not owe allegiance to your country.

- cloistered** Providing privacy or seclusion.

<b>deserted</b>	(of a place) empty of people. <i><b>Deserted</b> beaches of soft sand.</i>
<b>eccentric</b>	A person of a specified kind usually with many eccentricities. <i>Famed for his <b>eccentric</b> spelling.</i>
<b>expatriate</b>	Denoting or relating to a person living outside their native country. <i>American <b>expatriates</b>.</i>
<b>foreigner</b>	A person who comes from a foreign country; someone who does not owe allegiance to your country.
<b>geek</b>	A person with an unusual or odd personality. <i>I am totally <b>geeking</b> out over this upcoming film.</i>
<b>isle</b>	An island or peninsula, especially a small one. <i>Crusoe s fabled <b>isle</b>.</i>
<b>isolate</b>	A culture of microorganisms isolated for study. <i>The chemist managed to <b>isolate</b> the compound.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Marked by separation of or from usually contiguous elements. <i>Could not remain the <b>isolated</b> figure he had been.</i>
<b>isolation</b>	(psychiatry) a defense mechanism in which memory of an unacceptable act or impulse is separated from the emotion originally associated with it. <i><b>Isolation</b> from family and friends may also contribute to anxiety.</i>
<b>lonely</b>	Devoid of creatures. <i>A <b>lonely</b> fisherman stood on a tuft of gravel.</i>
<b>loser</b>	A person or thing that loses or has lost something, especially a game or contest. <i>They should concede that we won and be good <b>losers</b>.</i>
<b>misunderstood</b>	Incorrectly interpreted or understood. <i>A <b>misunderstood</b> question.</i>
<b>nerd</b>	A single-minded expert in a particular technical field. <i>A computer <b>nerd</b>.</i>
<b>outback</b>	Any remote or sparsely populated inland region. <i>A two week tour of the <b>outback</b>.</i>
<b>outpost</b>	A remote part of a country or empire. <i>Troops in some <b>outposts</b> have surrendered.</i>
<b>outsider</b>	A contestant (human or animal) not considered to have a good chance to win. <i>The winner was Beech Road a fifty to one <b>outsider</b>.</i>
<b>pariah</b>	An outcast. <i>The country is becoming an international <b>pariah</b> state.</i>



<b><u>remote</u></b>	A remote control device. <i>The <b>remote</b> past or future.</i>
<b><u>secluded</u></b>	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>The gardens are quiet and <b>secluded</b>.</i>
<b>seclusion</b>	The quality of being secluded from the presence or view of others. <i>They enjoyed ten days of peace and <b>seclusion</b>.</i>
<b><u>solitary</u></b>	Characterized by or preferring solitude. <i>A man of a <b>solitary</b> disposition.</i>
<b><u>solitude</u></b>	A state of social isolation. <i>She savoured her few hours of freedom and <b>solitude</b>.</i>
<b><u>stranger</u></b>	A person who does not know, or is not known in, a particular place or community. <i>He must have been a <b>stranger</b> to the village.</i>
<b><u>underdog</u></b>	A person who has little status in society. <i>What is it like to be an <b>underdog</b> in America.</i>
<b>yon</b>	At or in an indicated usually distant place yon is archaic and dialectal Calder Willingham. <i>What is <b>yon</b> place.</i>
