ensemble	The coordination between performers executing an ensemble passage. <i>A high level of tuning and ensemble is guaranteed.</i>
enterprise	An organization created for business ventures. <i>Local enterprise agencies.</i>
equipment	The process of supplying someone or something with necessary equipment. <i>Suppliers of office equipment.</i>
firm	The members of a business organization that owns or operates one or more establishments.
garb	Clothing, especially of a distinctive or special kind. <i>Kids in combat garb.</i>
getup	A set of clothing (with accessories). <i>His getup was exceedingly elegant.</i>
group	A number of musicians who play popular music together. <i>A methyl group.</i>
habit	Clothes. <i>Nuns in long brown habits black veils and sandals.</i>
house	The people living in a house a household. <i>A hundred musicians performed in front of a full house.</i>
implements	Instrumentation (a piece of equipment or tool) used to effect an end.
kit	A large basket, box, or other container, especially for fish. <i>A first aid kit.</i>

organization	The act of organizing a business or an activity related to a business. <i>He still remembers the organization of the club.</i>
<u>paraphernalia</u>	Trappings associated with a particular institution or activity that are regarded as superfluous. <i>Drills saws and other paraphernalia necessary for home improvements.</i>
partnership	The number of runs added by a pair of batsmen before one of them is dismissed or the innings ends. <i>Their 176 run third wicket partnership.</i>
rig	The particular way in which a sailing boat's masts, sails, and rigging are arranged. <i>The stronger the wind the later you release the rig.</i>
stuff	Matter, material, articles, or activities of a specified or indeterminate kind that are being referred to, indicated, or implied. <i>He took his stuff and went.</i>
suit	A businessman dressed in a business suit. <i>They buried him in his best suit.</i>
tackle	Grasping an opposing player with the intention of stopping by throwing to the ground. <i>Fishing tackle.</i>
team	Two or more people working together. <i>His team played well.</i>
things	A statement regarded as an object. <i>She packed her things and left.</i>
tools	The means whereby some act is accomplished. <i>Science has given us new tools to fight disease.</i>
turnout	The group that gathers together for a particular occasion. <i>She has good natural turnout.</i>
<u>uniform</u>	A police officer wearing a uniform. <i>An officer in uniform.</i>
utensils	An implement for practical use (especially in a household).

provision	Supply with provisions. <i>Financial institutions have to provision against loan losses.</i>
rig out	Connect or secure to.
stock	Fit a rifle or other firearm with a stock. <i>Most supermarkets now stock a range of organic produce.</i>
supply	Take over (a vacant place or role). <i>Supply blankets for the beds.</i>

garment	An article of clothing. <i>Fashion garments.</i>
hem	Utter hem or ahem. <i>Hem my skirt.</i>
hosiery	Socks and stockings and tights collectively (the British include underwear).
negligee	A woman's light dressing gown, typically made of a filmy, soft fabric. <i>A black silk negligee.</i>
nightgown	A nightdress.
raiment	Provide with clothes or put clothes on. <i>Ladies clothed in raiment bedecked with jewels.</i>

<u>robe</u>	Clothe in a robe or long loose outer garment. <i>A young man in a fez and ragged robe.</i>
sandal	A light shoe with either an openwork upper or straps attaching the sole to the foot. <i>They were dressed in open toed sandals.</i>
sartorial	Relating to tailoring, clothes, or style of dress. <i>Sartorial elegance.</i>
<u>shoes</u>	A particular situation.
skimpy	Providing or consisting of less than is needed; meagre. <i>A skimpy dress.</i>
suit	A businessman dressed in a business suit. <i>Maybe now the suits in Washington will listen.</i>
toga	A loose flowing outer garment worn by the citizens of ancient Rome, made of a single piece of cloth and covering the whole body apart from the right arm.
undergarment	An article of underclothing.
underwear	Clothing worn under other clothes, typically next to the skin.
uniformed	Wearing a uniform. <i>Uniformed policemen lined the President s route.</i>
vestment	A garment, especially a ceremonial or official robe. <i>A priest in green vestments came and preached a long sermon.</i>
wear	The wearing of something or the state of being worn as clothing. <i>She was wearing yellow that day.</i>
