friendly	(of troops or equipment) of, belonging to, or allied with one's own forces. <i>The risk of blowing up friendly forces is minimized.</i>
genial	Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw. <i>Our genial host.</i>
gregarious	(of animals) tending to form a group with others of the same species. <i>He was a popular and gregarious man.</i>
hail-fellow-well-met	Heartily friendly and congenial.
lively	Intellectually stimulating or perceptive. <i>A lively tennis ball.</i>
retiring	Reluctant to draw attention to yourself. <i>A gentle retiring person who avoided conflict.</i>
sociable	Inclined to or conducive to companionship with others. <i>A sociable conversation.</i>
uninhibited	Expressing one's feelings or thoughts unselfconsciously and without restraint. <i>Fits of uninhibited laughter.</i>
unreserved	Frank and open. <i>A tall unreserved young man.</i>
warm	Inducing the impression of warmth used especially of reds and oranges and yellows. <i>They exchanged warm friendly smiles.</i>

extroverted	Outgoing and socially confident. <i>She is extroverted confident and gives rousing lectures.</i>
friendly	(of troops or equipment) of, belonging to, or allied with one's own forces. <i>An environment friendly agronomic practice.</i>

garrulous	Excessively talkative, especially on trivial matters. <i>A garrulous cab driver.</i>
gregarious	Tending to form a group with others of the same species. <i>In the wild trees are usually gregarious plants.</i>
lengthiness	The consequence of being lengthened in duration.
loquacious	Full of trivial conversation. <i>Never loquacious Sarah was now totally lost for words.</i>
loquacity	The quality of being wordy and talkative. <i>He was renowned for loquacity.</i>
outer	A shot that strikes the outer. <i>Outer reality.</i>
personality	Lively, engaging qualities. <i>An official opening by a famous personality.</i>
rhapsodize	Speak or write about someone or something with great enthusiasm and delight. <i>He began to rhapsodize about Gaby s beauty and charm.</i>
