- *An opening that permits escape or release.*
- *A shop that sells goods made by a particular manufacturer at discounted prices.*
- *Activity that frees or expresses creative energy or emotion.*
- *The mouth of a river.*
- *A pipe or hole through which water or gas may escape.*
- *A point from which goods are sold or distributed.*

<b><u>avenue</u></b>	A way of approaching a problem or making progress towards something. <i>An <b>avenue</b> of limes.</i>
<b>cash and carry</b>	Money in the form of bills or coins.
<b><u>channel</u></b>	A service or station using a channel of frequencies. <i>Surfing through the <b>channels</b>.</i>
<b>egress</b>	The becoming visible. <i>Direct means of access and <b>egress</b> for passengers.</i>
<b>electric outlet</b>	A car that is powered by electricity.
<b>electric receptacle</b>	A car that is powered by electricity.
<b><u>exit</u></b>	A departure from a particular situation. <i>He made a hasty <b>exit</b> from the room.</i>

<b>issue</b>	Supplies as food or clothing or ammunition issued by the government. <i>Politicians never discuss the real <b>issues</b>.</i>
<b>market</b>	A stock market. <i>The UK <b>market</b> remained in recession.</i>
<b>marketplace</b>	The arena of commercial dealings. <i>The changing demands of the global <b>marketplace</b>.</i>
<b>means of expression</b>	Considerable capital (wealth or income).
<b>means of release</b>	Considerable capital (wealth or income).
<b>release</b>	A device that when pressed will release part of a mechanism. <i>The <b>release</b> of iodine from the thyroid gland.</i>
<b>release mechanism</b>	A process that liberates or discharges something.
<b>reseller</b>	A person or company that sells something they have bought to someone else. <i>Products are sold both directly and through <b>resellers</b>.</i>
<b>retail outlet</b>	The selling of goods to consumers; usually in small quantities and not for resale.
<b>retail store</b>	The selling of goods to consumers; usually in small quantities and not for resale.
<b>safety valve</b>	The successful act of striking a baseball in such a way that the batter reaches base safely.
<b>sales outlet</b>	Income (at invoice values) received for goods and services over some given period of time.
<b>selling place</b>	The exchange of goods for an agreed sum of money.
<b>shop</b>	A place where things are manufactured or repaired a workshop. <i>She pointed to the classroom ceiling I live here over the <b>shop</b>.</i>
<b>store</b>	An electronic memory device. <i>Crates started arriving at the quartermaster s <b>stores</b>.</i>
<b>vent</b>	A hole for the escape of gas or air. <i>Pumice fragments pile up to form a conical heap round the <b>vent</b>.</i>
<b>vent hole</b>	A hole for the escape of gas or air.
<b>wall plug</b>	A difficult or awkward situation.
<b>wall socket</b>	A masonry fence (as around an estate or garden).
<b>way of harnessing</b>	A general category of things; used in the expression `in the way of.
<b>way out</b>	A general category of things; used in the expression `in the way of.

<b><u>doorway</u></b>	The entrance (the space in a wall) through which you enter or leave a room or building; the space that a door can close. <i>He stuck his head in the <b>doorway</b>.</i>
<b><u>dribble</u></b>	Propel. <i>Reports began to <b>dribble</b> in.</i>
<b>egress</b>	The reappearance of a celestial body after an eclipse. <i>A narrow <b>egress</b>.</i>
<b>emancipate</b>	Give equal rights to; of women and minorities. <i>An <b>emancipated</b> minor.</i>
<b><u>emit</u></b>	Give off, send forth, or discharge; as of light, heat, or radiation, vapor, etc. <i>The ozone layer blocks some harmful rays which the sun <b>emits</b>.</i>
<b>entrust</b>	Assign the responsibility for doing something to (someone). <i>The messenger was <b>entrusted</b> with the general's secret.</i>
<b><u>exhale</u></b>	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>The chimney <b>exhales</b> a thick smoke.</i>
<b><u>exit</u></b>	Go out of or leave a place. <i>He made a hasty <b>exit</b> from the room.</i>
<b>exude</b>	Make apparent by one's mood or behavior. <i>Slime <b>exudes</b> from the fungus.</i>
<b>furlough</b>	Grant a leave to. <i>Half of employers say they will put the majority of their staff on <b>furlough</b>.</i>
<b><u>going</u></b>	Euphemistic expressions for death. <i>The <b>going</b> was ideal here with short turf and a level surface.</i>
<b>leave</b>	Leave or give by will after one's death. <i>He <b>leaves</b> a wife and three children.</i>
<b><u>liberate</u></b>	Steal (something). <i>Twelve months earlier Paris had been <b>liberated</b>.</i>
<b><u>liberation</u></b>	The termination of someone's employment (leaving them free to depart). <i>The struggle for women's <b>liberation</b>.</i>
<b><u>ooze</u></b>	Release (a liquid) in drops or small quantities. <i>Honey <b>oozed</b> out of the comb.</i>
<b>passageway</b>	A long, narrow way, typically having walls either side, that allows access between buildings or to different rooms within a building. <i>Her hotel was at the end of a narrow <b>passageway</b> off the main street.</i>
<b>passing</b>	In sport the action of passing a ball to another team member. <i>She detested him more with every <b>passing</b> second.</i>

<b>release</b>	A device that when pressed will release part of a mechanism. <i>Press the cap down and <b>release</b>.</i>
<b>secrete</b>	Place out of sight; keep secret. <b>Secrete</b> digestive juices.
<b>spill</b>	An instance of a liquid spilling or being spilt. <i>The wine <b>spilled</b> onto the table.</i>
<b>unattended</b>	Not noticed or dealt with. <i>A fire left <b>unattended</b>.</i>
<b>urinate</b>	Pass after the manner of urine. <i>The sick men <b>urinated</b> blood.</i>
<b>vent</b>	Provide with an outlet for air, gas, or liquid. <i>Pumice fragments pile up to form a conical heap round the <b>vent</b>.</i>
<b>waiver</b>	An act or instance of waiving a right or claim. <i>Their acquiescence could amount to a <b>waiver</b>.</i>
