### Definitions of "Output" as a noun

- *A place where power or information leaves a system.*
- *The quantity of something (as a commodity) that is created (usually within a given period of time.*
- *What is produced in a given time period.*
- *Signal that comes out of an electronic system.*
- *The power, energy, or other results supplied by a device or system.*
- *The action or process of producing something.*
- *The amount of something produced by a person, machine, or industry.*
- *Final product; the things produced.*
- *Production of a certain amount.*

<b>achievement</b>	A thing done successfully with effort, skill, or courage. <i>Assessing ability in terms of academic <b>achievement</b>.</i>
<b>amount produced</b>	The relative magnitude of something with reference to a criterion.
<b>end product</b>	The surface at either extremity of a three-dimensional object.
<b>gross domestic product</b>	Twelve dozen.
<b>gross national product</b>	Twelve dozen.
<b>harvest</b>	A quantity of animals caught or killed for human use. <i>A <b>harvest</b> of love.</i>
<b>output signal</b>	The quantity of something (as a commodity) that is created (usually within a given period of time.
<b>outturn</b>	What is produced in a given time period.
<b>product</b>	An artifact that has been created by someone or some process. <i>The <b>product</b> of 2 and 3 is 6.</i>
<b>production</b>	An artifact that has been created by someone or some process. <i>The car is no longer in <b>production</b>.</i>
<b>quantity produced</b>	An adequate or large amount.
<b>return</b>	A key pressed on a computer keyboard to simulate a carriage return in a word processing program or to indicate the end of a command or data string. <i>Product areas are being developed to produce maximum <b>returns</b>.</i>
<b>solutions</b>	A method for solving a problem. <i>The easy solution is to look it up in the handbook.</i>
<b>turnout</b>	A road turning. <i>She has good natural <b>turnout</b>.</i>
<b><u>volume</u></b>	A book forming part of a work or series. <i>The sewer could not cope with the <b>volume</b> of rainwater.</i>
<b>yield</b>	An amount of a product. <i>The milk <b>yield</b> was poor.</i>

- *The output of certain hormones under stress.*
- *Efficiency can lead to higher outputs.*

<b>happening</b>	Fashionable; trendy. <i>A <b>happening</b> neighbourhood.</i>
<a href="#"><u>incidence</u></a>	The striking of a light beam on a surface. <i>An increased <b>incidence</b> of cancer.</i>
<a href="#"><u>incident</u></a>	A privilege, burden, or right attaching to an office, estate, or other holding. <i>Several amusing <b>incidents</b>.</i>
<b>lumen</b>	A cavity or passage in a tubular organ. <i>The <b>lumen</b> of the intestine.</i>

<b>occasion</b>	Give occasion to. <i>His death <b>occasioned</b> her much grief.</i>
<b>occur</b>	To be found to exist. <i>Radon <b>occurs</b> naturally in rocks such as granite.</i>
<u><b>occurrence</b></u>	An instance of something occurring. <i>Vandalism used to be a rare <b>occurrence</b>.</i>
<b>outcome</b>	The way a thing turns out; a consequence. <i>It is the <b>outcome</b> of the vote that counts.</i>
<u><b>payoff</b></u>	The income or profit arising from such transactions as the sale of land or other property.
<u><b>phenomenon</b></u>	A remarkable development. <i>The band was a pop <b>phenomenon</b> just for their sales figures alone.</i>
<b>produce</b>	Create or form (something) as part of a physical, biological, or chemical process. <i>We <b>produce</b> more cars than we can sell.</i>
<u><b>ramification</b></u>	The act of branching out or dividing into branches. <i>A coronary angiogram showed <b>ramification</b> of the right coronary artery close to the ostium.</i>
<u><b>recurrence</b></u>	Happening again (especially at regular intervals). <i>A drug used to prevent the <b>recurrence</b> of breast cancer.</i>
<u><b>recurrent</b></u>	(of a nerve or blood vessel) turning back so as to reverse direction. <i>The <b>recurrent</b> nerve leaves the hypocerebral ganglion.</i>
<u><b>recurring</b></u>	Coming back. <i>They are haunted by a <b>recurring</b> image of their daughter on the night she died.</i>
<b>reelect</b>	Elect again.
<b>refund</b>	The act of returning money received previously. <i>If you re not delighted with your purchase we guarantee to <b>refund</b> your money in full.</i>
<b>rejoin</b>	Join together again; reunite. <i>The stone had been cracked and crudely <b>rejoined</b>.</i>
<u><b>repay</b></u>	Make repayment for or return something. <i>Most of his fortune had been spent <b>repaying</b> creditors.</i>
<b>repeated</b>	Done or occurring again several times in the same way. <i>Despite <b>repeated</b> requests neither company gave a satisfactory answer.</i>

**requite**

Make appropriate return for (a favour, service, or wrongdoing).  
*They are quick to **requite** a kindness.*

**restitution**

The act of restoring something to its original state.  
*The ANC had demanded the **restitution** of land seized from black people.*

**return**

A returning officer's announcement of an election result.  
*Her old vigor **returned**.*

**reunite**

Unify again, as of a country.  
*The three friends **reunited** in 1959.*

**revert**

(of property) return to (the original owner) by reversion.  
*He ignored her words by **reverting** to the former subject.*

**sequent**

Occurring with or following as a consequence.  
*Some of the inferences are not **sequent** on the premises.*
