evidently	Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’). Evidently Mrs Smith thought differently.
externally	(used in reference to a medicine or similar substance) on the outside of the body. <i>The antenna should be mounted externally perhaps on the roof.</i>
from all appearances	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’).
on the outside	On the outside.
ostensibly	From appearances alone. <i>The party secretary resigned ostensibly from ill health.</i>
seemingly	So as to give the impression of having a certain quality; apparently. <i>It s touch and go seemingly and she s asking for you.</i>
superficially	Not thoroughly or deeply. <i>The theory is superficially attractive.</i>
to all appearances	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’).
to all intents and purposes	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’).

aboveground	On or above the surface of the ground. Aboveground nuclear testing.
away	An away match or win. <i>Wanted to get away from there.</i>
boundary	The line or plane indicating the limit or extent of something. <i>A boundary wall.</i>

casing	The outermost covering of a pneumatic tire. <i>The casings had rotted away and had to be replaced.</i>
cuticle	Hard outer covering or case of certain organisms such as arthropods and turtles. <i>You've been gnawing at your cuticles.</i>
edge	Side with one's weight on the edges of one's skis. <i>His voice had an edge to it.</i>
epidermis	The surface epithelium of the skin, overlying the dermis.

integument	A tough outer protective layer, especially that of an animal or plant. <i>This chemical compound is found in the integument of the seed.</i>
<u>layer</u>	Arrange in a layer or layers. <i>A managerial layer.</i>
margin	A line ruled on paper to mark off a margin. <i>The notations in the margin.</i>
<u>marginal</u>	Of questionable or minimal quality. <i>The cost is negligible less than marginal.</i>
marginally	To only a limited extent; slightly. <i>He's marginally worse than he was.</i>
<u>ostensible</u>	Represented or appearing as such; pretended. <i>The real dispute which lay behind the ostensible complaint.</i>
outer	A shot that strikes the outer. <i>Boots with stiff leather outers.</i>
outermost	Situated at the farthest possible point from a center. <i>The outermost layer of the earth.</i>
<u>outside</u>	Functioning outside the boundaries or precincts of an organized unit. <i>Anne put the outside lights on.</i>
outward	Outwards. <i>Outward pressure.</i>

peripheral	A peripheral device. <i>She will see their problems as peripheral to her own.</i>
rim	Roll around the rim of. <i>The outer rim of the solar system.</i>
rind	The tough outer skin of certain fruit, especially citrus fruit. <i>Curls of bacon rind were left on his plate.</i>
<u>seeming</u>	Appearing as such but not necessarily so. <i>An angry seeming man.</i>
<u>shell</u>	Remove the shell or pod from a nut or seed. <i>Peanuts roasted in their shells.</i>
<u>surface</u>	Rise or come up to the surface of the water or the ground. <i>The row first surfaced two years ago.</i>
thereabout	Near that place. <i>He stayed in London or thereabouts for several weeks.</i>
<u>upper</u>	Situated above another part. <i>The upper stories.</i>
