**from all appearances**

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent ('whole' is often used informally for 'wholly).

**on the outside**

On the outside.

**ostensibly**

From appearances alone.

The party secretary resigned **ostensibly** from ill health.

**seemingly**

So as to give the impression of having a certain quality; apparently.

It s touch and go **seemingly** and she s asking for you.

**superficially**

Not thoroughly or deeply.

The theory is **superficially** attractive.

**to all appearances**

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent ('whole' is often used informally for 'wholly).

**to all intents and purposes**

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent ('whole' is often used informally for 'wholly).

<u><b>facing</b></u>	The cuffs, collar, and lapels of a military jacket, contrasting in colour with the rest of the garment. <i>Two large front <b>facing</b> windows.</i>
<b>integument</b>	A tough outer protective layer, especially that of an animal or plant. <i>This chemical compound is found in the <b>integument</b> of the seed.</i>
<u><b>layer</b></u>	Arrange in a layer or layers. <i>A managerial <b>layer</b>.</i>
<b>margin</b>	A line ruled on paper to mark off a margin. <i>The notations in the <b>margin</b>.</i>
<u><b>marginal</b></u>	Of questionable or minimal quality. <i>The cost is negligible less than <b>marginal</b>.</i>
<b>marginally</b>	To only a limited extent; slightly. <i>He s <b>marginally</b> worse than he was.</i>
<u><b>ostensible</b></u>	Represented or appearing as such; pretended. <i>The real dispute which lay behind the <b>ostensible</b> complaint.</i>
<b>outer</b>	A shot that strikes the outer. <i>Boots with stiff leather <b>outers</b>.</i>
<b>outermost</b>	Situated at the farthest possible point from a center. <i>The <b>outermost</b> layer of the earth.</i>
<u><b>outside</b></u>	Functioning outside the boundaries or precincts of an organized unit. <i>Anne put the <b>outside</b> lights on.</i>
<b>outward</b>	Outwards. <i><b>Outward</b> pressure.</i>

<b>peripheral</b>	A peripheral device. <i>She will see their problems as <b>peripheral</b> to her own.</i>
<b>rim</b>	Roll around the rim of. <i>The outer <b>rim</b> of the solar system.</i>
<b>rind</b>	The tough outer skin of certain fruit, especially citrus fruit. <i>Curls of bacon <b>rind</b> were left on his plate.</i>
<u><b>seeming</b></u>	Appearing as such but not necessarily so. <i>An angry <b>seeming</b> man.</i>
<u><b>shell</b></u>	Remove the shell or pod from a nut or seed. <i>Peanuts roasted in their <b>shells</b>.</i>
<u><b>surface</b></u>	Rise or come up to the surface of the water or the ground. <i>The row first <b>surfaced</b> two years ago.</i>
<b>thereabout</b>	Near that place. <i>He stayed in London or <b>thereabouts</b> for several weeks.</i>
<u><b>upper</b></u>	Situated above another part. <i>The <b>upper</b> stories.</i>
