<a href="#">acme</a>	The point at which something is at its best or most highly developed. <i>His landscapes were deemed the <b>acme</b> of beauty.</i>
<a href="#">apex</a>	The highest point (of something). <i>Melodic lines build up to the chorus and it <b>apexes</b> at the solo.</i>
<b>apogee</b>	The highest point in the development of something; a climax or culmination. <i>A film which was the <b>apogee</b> of German expressionist cinema.</i>
<b>crest</b>	The upper line of the neck of a horse or other mammal. <i>The river <b>crested</b> last night.</i>
<b>elevated</b>	Of high moral or intellectual value elevated in nature or style Oliver Franks. <i>The <b>elevated</b> section of the M4.</i>
<a href="#">elevation</a>	Drawing of an exterior of a structure. <i>The area has a topography that ranges from 1 500 to 3 000 metres in <b>elevation</b>.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>He climbed the career <b>ladder</b>.</i>
<a href="#">lofty</a>	Having or displaying great dignity or nobility. <i><b>Lofty</b> mountains.</i>
<a href="#">maximum</a>	A maximum permitted custodial sentence for an offence. <i>The school takes a <b>maximum</b> of 32 pupils.</i>
<b>meridian</b>	Relating to or situated at a meridian. <i>The slow movements and postures of t ai chi open up and align the <b>meridians</b> of the body.</i>
<b>nadir</b>	The point below the observer that is directly opposite the zenith on the imaginary sphere against which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>Asking that question was the <b>nadir</b> of my career.</i>

<b>outdistance</b>	Go far ahead of. <i>She could maintain a fast enough pace to <b>outdistance</b> any pursuers.</i>
<b>outdo</b>	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>She <b>outdoes</b> all other athletes.</i>
<b>outstrip</b>	Move faster than and overtake (someone else). <i>Supply far <b>outstripped</b> demand.</i>
<b>overstep</b>	Pass beyond (limits or boundaries). <i>You must not <b>overstep</b> your borrowing limit.</i>
<b>peak</b>	Characterized by maximum activity or demand. <i>He was at his <b>peak</b> as a cricketer.</i>
<b>pinnacle</b>	Surmount with a pinnacle. <i>Catapulted Einstein to the <b>pinnacle</b> of fame.</i>
<b>raised</b>	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. <i><b>Raised</b> needlework.</i>
<b>rung</b>	A crosspiece between the legs of a chair. <i>We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom <b>rung</b>.</i>
<b>summit</b>	Reach the summit of a mountain or hill. <i>Many mountaineers go up Mt Everest but not all <b>summit</b>.</i>
<b>superabundance</b>	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
<b>superior</b>	A superior letter figure or symbol. <i>Trust magnates who felt themselves <b>superior</b> to law.</i>
<b>superlative</b>	A superlative adjective or adverb. <i>The critics ran out of <b>superlatives</b> to describe him.</i>
<b>surpass</b>	Be better than. <i>Pre war levels of production were <b>surpassed</b> in 1929.</i>
<b>transcend</b>	Be superior or better than some standard. <i>This was an issue <b>transcending</b> party politics.</i>
<b>transgress</b>	Spread over land, especially along a subsiding shoreline. <i>The sea <b>transgresses</b> along the West coast of the island.</i>
<b>unsurpassed</b>	Better or greater than any other. <i>The quality of workmanship is <b>unsurpassed</b>.</i>
<b>upper</b>	Denoting a younger (and hence usually shallower) part of a stratigraphic division or archaeological deposit or the period in which it was formed or deposited. <i>His <b>upper</b> arm.</i>

**uppermost**

In or into the most prominent position, as in the mind.  
*Investors put environmental concerns **uppermost** on their list.*

**zenith**

The time at which something is most powerful or successful.  
*The sun was well past the **zenith**.*
