acme	The point at which something is at its best or most highly developed. <i>His landscapes were deemed the acme of beauty.</i>
apex	The highest point (of something). <i>Melodic lines build up to the chorus and it apexes at the solo.</i>
apogee	The highest point in the development of something; a climax or culmination. <i>A film which was the apogee of German expressionist cinema.</i>
crest	The upper line of the neck of a horse or other mammal. <i>The river crested last night.</i>
elevated	Of high moral or intellectual value elevated in nature or style Oliver Franks. <i>The elevated section of the M4.</i>
elevation	Drawing of an exterior of a structure. <i>The area has a topography that ranges from 1 500 to 3 000 metres in elevation.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>He climbed the career ladder.</i>
lofty	Having or displaying great dignity or nobility. <i>Lofty mountains.</i>
maximum	A maximum permitted custodial sentence for an offence. <i>The school takes a maximum of 32 pupils.</i>
meridian	Relating to or situated at a meridian. <i>The slow movements and postures of t ai chi open up and align the meridians of the body.</i>
nadir	The point below the observer that is directly opposite the zenith on the imaginary sphere against which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>Asking that question was the nadir of my career.</i>

outdistance	Go far ahead of. <i>She could maintain a fast enough pace to outdistance any pursuers.</i>
outdo	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>She outdoes all other athletes.</i>
outstrip	Move faster than and overtake (someone else). <i>Supply far outstripped demand.</i>
overstep	Pass beyond (limits or boundaries). <i>You must not overstep your borrowing limit.</i>
peak	Characterized by maximum activity or demand. <i>He was at his peak as a cricketer.</i>
pinnacle	Surmount with a pinnacle. <i>Catapulted Einstein to the pinnacle of fame.</i>
raised	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. <i>Raised needlework.</i>
rung	A crosspiece between the legs of a chair. <i>We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom rung.</i>
summit	Reach the summit of a mountain or hill. <i>Many mountaineers go up Mt Everest but not all summit.</i>
superabundance	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
superior	A superior letter figure or symbol. <i>Trust magnates who felt themselves superior to law.</i>
superlative	A superlative adjective or adverb. <i>The critics ran out of superlatives to describe him.</i>
surpass	Be better than. <i>Pre war levels of production were surpassed in 1929.</i>
transcend	Be superior or better than some standard. <i>This was an issue transcending party politics.</i>
transgress	Spread over land, especially along a subsiding shoreline. <i>The sea transgresses along the West coast of the island.</i>
unsurpassed	Better or greater than any other. <i>The quality of workmanship is unsurpassed.</i>
upper	Denoting a younger (and hence usually shallower) part of a stratigraphic division or archaeological deposit or the period in which it was formed or deposited. <i>His upper arm.</i>

uppermost

In or into the most prominent position, as in the mind.
*Investors put environmental concerns **uppermost** on their list.*

zenith

The time at which something is most powerful or successful.
*The sun was well past the **zenith**.*
