outstrip	Move faster than and overtake (someone else. Supply far <b>outstrip</b> ped demand.
overstep	Pass beyond (limits or boundaries. You must not <b>overstep</b> your borrowing limit.
<u>peak</u>	Characterized by maximum activity or demand. <i>He was at his <b>peak</b> as a cricketer.</i>
<u>pinnacle</u>	Surmount with a pinnacle. Catapulted Einstein to the <b>pinnacle</b> of fame.
raised	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. <i>Raised</i> needlework.
rung	A crosspiece between the legs of a chair. We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom <b>rung</b> .
<u>summit</u>	Reach the summit of a mountain or hill. Many mountaineers go up Mt Everest but not all <b>summit</b> .
superabundance	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
superior	A superior letter figure or symbol. Trust magnates who felt themselves <b>superior</b> to law.
superlative	A superlative adjective or adverb. <i>The critics ran out of <b>superlative</b>s to describe him.</i>
<u>surpass</u>	Be better than. Pre war levels of production were <b>surpass</b> ed in 1929.
transcend	Be superior or better than some standard. This was an issue <b>transcend</b> ing party politics.
<u>transgress</u>	Spread over land, especially along a subsiding shoreline. The sea <b>transgress</b> es along the West coast of the island.
<u>unsurpassed</u>	Better or greater than any other. The quality of workmanship is <b>unsurpassed</b> .
<u>upper</u>	Denoting a younger (and hence usually shallower) part of a stratigraphic division or archaeological deposit or the period in which it was formed or deposited. <i>His upper arm.</i>
