- *(usually plural) work clothing consisting of denim trousers (usually with a bib and shoulder straps).*
- *Dungarees.*
- *Work clothing consisting of denim trousers (usually with a bib and shoulder straps).*

- *A loose protective coverall or smock worn over ordinary clothing for dirty work.*
- *A loose-fitting coat or one-piece garment worn over ordinary clothes for protection against dirt or heavy wear.*

## Synonyms of "Overall" as an adverb (12 Words)

<b>all in all</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’).
<b><u>altogether</u></b>	With everything included or counted. <i>An <b>altogether</b> new approach.</i>
<b>by and large</b>	So as to pass a given point.
<b>for the most part</b>	Slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but.
<b><u>generally</u></b>	Usually; as a rule. <i><b>Generally</b> speaking things have been getting better.</i>
<b>generally speaking</b>	Without regard to specific details or exceptions.
<b>in general</b>	To or toward the inside of.

<b>extensive</b>	Broad in scope or content- T.G.Winner. <i>An <b>extensive</b> Roman settlement in northwest England.</i>
<b>filled</b>	Of purchase orders that have been filled. <i>Theirs was a house <b>filled</b> with laughter.</i>
<b>gamut</b>	The lowest note in the gamut scale. <i>The whole <b>gamut</b> of human emotion.</i>
<a href="#"><u>general</u></a>	A high rank of officer in the army and in the US air force above lieutenant general and below field marshal general of the army or general of the air force. <i>A <b>general</b> description of the merchandise.</i>
<b>generic</b>	(of drugs) not protected by trademark. <i>The plot of the film isn t just <b>generic</b> it s insultingly stupid.</i>
<b>inclusion</b>	The practice or policy of providing equal access to opportunities and resources for people who might otherwise be excluded or marginalized, such as those who have physical or mental disabilities and members of other minority groups. <i>An <b>inclusion</b> in the cytoplasm of the cell.</i>
<b>inclusive</b>	Containing (a specified element) as part of a whole. <i>This is a testament to the <b>inclusive</b> environment fostered at our school.</i>
<b>internationally</b>	In, between, or among many different nations. <i>Companies looking to trade <b>internationally</b>.</i>
<b>nationally</b>	With regard to a nation taken as a whole. <i>His watercolours have been exhibited <b>nationally</b>.</i>
<b>nationwide</b>	Extending throughout an entire nation. <i>The company employs 6 000 people <b>nationwide</b>.</i>
<b>oneness</b>	The quality of being united into one. <i>Holding to the <b>oneness</b> of God the Father as the only God.</i>
<b>overview</b>	A general summary of a subject. <i>The report <b>overviews</b> the needs of the community.</i>
<b>plenary</b>	Unqualified; absolute. <i>The following speakers will present <b>plenary</b> addresses at the conference.</i>
<b>spatiotemporal</b>	Of or relating to space and time together (having both spatial extension and temporal duration).



<b>statewide</b>	Extending throughout a particular state in the US. <i>A <b>statewide</b> health system.</i>
