## Associations of "Overpowered" (30 Words)

<b>beat</b>	Indicate by beating as with the fingers or drumsticks. <i>Pure gold can be <b>beaten</b> out to form very thin sheets.</i>
<b>captor</b>	A person who captures and holds people or animals. <i>He managed to escape from his <b>captors</b> two nights later.</i>
<b>chasten</b>	Restrain. <i>The director was somewhat <b>chastened</b> by his recent flops.</i>
<a href="#">chastise</a>	Censure severely. <i>The General cruelly <b>chastised</b> them with a whip.</i>
<b>conquer</b>	Take possession of by force, as after an invasion. <i><b>Conquer</b> your fears.</i>
<b>conquest</b>	The invasion and assumption of control of England by William of Normandy in 1066. <i>She was someone he could display before his friends as his latest <b>conquest</b>.</i>
<b>curb</b>	Keep to the curb. <i>She promised she would <b>curb</b> her temper.</i>
<b>defeat</b>	An instance of defeating or being defeated. <i>A 1 0 <b>defeat</b> by Grimsby.</i>
<a href="#">disarm</a>	(of a country or force) give up or reduce its armed forces or weapons. <i>A well executed <b>disarm</b>.</i>
<b>enslave</b>	Cause (someone) to lose their freedom of choice or action. <i>They were <b>enslaved</b> by their need to take drugs.</i>
<b>inhibit</b>	Control and refrain from showing; of emotions, desires, impulses, or behavior. <i>His father s cold and distant demeanor <b>inhibited</b> him emotionally.</i>

<b>inhibition</b>	An order or writ of prohibition, especially against dealing with a specified piece of land or property. <i>She showed an enthusiasm for sex and a lack of <b>inhibition</b> which was entirely alien to him.</i>
<b>kingdom</b>	A country, state, or territory ruled by a king or queen. <i>The untroubled <b>kingdom</b> of reason.</i>
<b>limit</b>	Place limits on extent or access. <i>The city <b>limits</b>.</i>
<b>overawe</b>	Impress (someone) so much that they are silent or inhibited. <i>The eleven year old was <b>overawed</b> by the atmosphere.</i>
<b>overcome</b>	Overcome as with emotions or perceptual stimuli. <i>You must <b>overcome</b> all difficulties.</i>
<b>overthrow</b>	A score made because the ball has been overthrown. <i>Their subversive activities are calculated to <b>overthrow</b> parliamentary democracy.</i>
<b>overwhelm</b>	Defeat completely. <i>The Irish side was <b>overwhelmed</b> 15 3 by Scotland.</i>
<b>predominance</b>	The state or condition of being greater in number or amount. <i>The <b>predominance</b> of women in such professions as social work and nursing.</i>
<b>repress</b>	Suppress in order to conceal or hide. <i>The uprisings were <b>repressed</b>.</i>
<b>restrain</b>	Control (a strong urge or emotion). <i>Amiss had to <b>restrain</b> his impatience.</i>
<b>simplistic</b>	Characterized by extreme and often misleading simplicity. <i>A <b>simplistic</b> theory of the universe.</i>
<b>subdue</b>	Bring under control by force or authority. <i><b>Subdue</b> one's appetites.</i>
<b>subjection</b>	Forced submission to control by others. <i>The country's <b>subjection</b> to European colonialism.</i>
<b>subjugate</b>	Make someone or something subordinate to. <i>The rich landowners <b>subjugated</b> the peasants working the land.</i>
<b>suppress</b>	Prevent the development, action, or expression of (a feeling, impulse, idea, etc.); restrain. <i>The report had been <b>suppressed</b>.</i>
<b>surmount</b>	Overcome (a difficulty or obstacle). <i>The scarf <b>surmounted</b> the gown.</i>

**transcend**

Be greater in scope or size than some standard.

*He doubts that he will ever **transcend** Shakespeare.*

**tyranny**

(especially in ancient Greece) rule by one who has absolute power without legal right.

*The **tyranny** of the nine to five day.*

**warring**

(of two or more people or groups) in conflict with each other.

*Belligerent or **warring** nations.*
