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Associations of "Overpowered" (30 Words)

beat	Indicate by beating as with the fingers or drumsticks. <i>Pure gold can be beaten out to form very thin sheets.</i>
captor	A person who captures and holds people or animals. <i>He managed to escape from his captors two nights later.</i>
chasten	Restrain. <i>The director was somewhat chastened by his recent flops.</i>
chastise	Censure severely. <i>The General cruelly chastised them with a whip.</i>
conquer	Take possession of by force, as after an invasion. <i>Conquer your fears.</i>
conquest	The invasion and assumption of control of England by William of Normandy in 1066. <i>She was someone he could display before his friends as his latest conquest.</i>
curb	Keep to the curb. <i>She promised she would curb her temper.</i>
defeat	An instance of defeating or being defeated. <i>A 1 0 defeat by Grimsby.</i>
disarm	(of a country or force) give up or reduce its armed forces or weapons. <i>A well executed disarm.</i>
enslave	Cause (someone) to lose their freedom of choice or action. <i>They were enslaved by their need to take drugs.</i>
inhibit	Control and refrain from showing; of emotions, desires, impulses, or behavior. <i>His father s cold and distant demeanor inhibited him emotionally.</i>

inhibition	An order or writ of prohibition, especially against dealing with a specified piece of land or property. <i>She showed an enthusiasm for sex and a lack of inhibition which was entirely alien to him.</i>
kingdom	A country, state, or territory ruled by a king or queen. <i>The untroubled kingdom of reason.</i>
limit	Place limits on extent or access. <i>The city limits.</i>
overawe	Impress (someone) so much that they are silent or inhibited. <i>The eleven year old was overawed by the atmosphere.</i>
overcome	Overcome as with emotions or perceptual stimuli. <i>You must overcome all difficulties.</i>
overthrow	A score made because the ball has been overthrown. <i>Their subversive activities are calculated to overthrow parliamentary democracy.</i>
overwhelm	Defeat completely. <i>The Irish side was overwhelmed 15 3 by Scotland.</i>
predominance	The state or condition of being greater in number or amount. <i>The predominance of women in such professions as social work and nursing.</i>
repress	Suppress in order to conceal or hide. <i>The uprisings were repressed.</i>
restrain	Control (a strong urge or emotion). <i>Amiss had to restrain his impatience.</i>
simplistic	Characterized by extreme and often misleading simplicity. <i>A simplistic theory of the universe.</i>
subdue	Bring under control by force or authority. <i>Subdue one's appetites.</i>
subjection	Forced submission to control by others. <i>The country's subjection to European colonialism.</i>
subjugate	Make someone or something subordinate to. <i>The rich landowners subjugated the peasants working the land.</i>
suppress	Prevent the development, action, or expression of (a feeling, impulse, idea, etc.); restrain. <i>The report had been suppressed.</i>
surmount	Overcome (a difficulty or obstacle). <i>The scarf surmounted the gown.</i>

transcend

Be greater in scope or size than some standard.

*He doubts that he will ever **transcend** Shakespeare.*

tyranny

(especially in ancient Greece) rule by one who has absolute power without legal right.

*The **tyranny** of the nine to five day.*

warring

(of two or more people or groups) in conflict with each other.

*Belligerent or **warring** nations.*
