audit	Conduct an official financial inspection of (a company or its accounts. <i>He made use of the knowledge gleaned from economics classes he audited.</i>
check	Hold back as of a danger or an enemy check the expansion or influence of. <i>The handwriting checks with the signature on the check.</i>
constable	English landscape painter (1776-1837).
controller	A person or thing that directs or regulates something. <i>The regional controller for the Department of Education.</i>
director	Member of a board of directors. <i>The sales director.</i>
examiner	A person who sets and marks exams to test people’s knowledge or proficiency. <i>Exams are marked by external examiners.</i>
foreman	A man who is foreperson of a jury. <i>If you want to leave early you have to ask the foreman.</i>
inspect	Look at (someone or something) closely, typically to assess their condition or to discover any shortcomings. <i>Customs officers came aboard to inspect our documents.</i>
inspector	A police officer ranking below a chief inspector. <i>A prison inspector.</i>
keypad	A miniature keyboard or set of buttons for operating a portable electronic device, telephone, or other equipment.
monitor	Display produced by a device that takes signals and displays them on a television screen or a computer monitor. <i>Equipment was installed to monitor air quality.</i>
overseer	A person who directs and manages an organization.

patrol	Maintain the security of by carrying out a patrol. <i>There were two schools but no crossing patrol.</i>
proctor	Invigilate (an examination). <i>18 of the faculty reported that graduate assistants frequently proctored exams.</i>
reconnaissance	Preliminary surveying or research. <i>Conducting client reconnaissance.</i>
screen	Separate something from something else with or as if with a screen. <i>Services offered by the centre include a health screen for people who have just joined the company.</i>
scrutinize	Examine or inspect closely and thoroughly. <i>He scrutinized his likeness in the mirror.</i>
sentinel	A person employed to keep watch for some anticipated event. <i>A sentinel surveillance programme for influenza.</i>
sentry	A person employed to keep watch for some anticipated event. <i>Two men stood sentry on the door every evening.</i>
sheriff	(in Scotland) a judge.
superintend	Watch and direct. <i>He superintended a land reclamation scheme.</i>
superintendence	The management or arrangement of an activity or organization; supervision. <i>Under his vigilant superintendence a building was erected.</i>
supervise	Observe and direct the execution of (a task or activity). <i>The sergeant left to supervise the loading of the lorries.</i>
supervision	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>He was placed under the supervision of a probation officer.</i>
supervisory	Having or relating to the role of observing and directing an activity or a person. <i>The women play a largely supervisory role in the process.</i>
surveillance	Close observation of a person or group (usually by the police). <i>He found himself put under surveillance by British military intelligence.</i>
vigilant	Carefully observant or attentive; on the lookout for possible danger. <i>The vigilant eye of the town watch.</i>
watch	See or watch. <i>He told me my telephones were tapped and that I was being watched.</i>

watchdog

A person or group that monitors the practices of companies providing a particular service or utility.

*How can we **watchdog** our investments.*

watchman

A guard who keeps watch.

*A night **watchman**.*
