Synonyms of "Overseer" as a noun (10 Words)

chargehand	A worker, ranking below a foreman, in charge of others on a particular job.
controller	A mechanism that controls the operation of a machine. <i>A temperature controller</i> .
foreman	(in a law court) a person who presides over a jury and speaks on its behalf. If you want to leave early you have to ask the foreman .
forewoman	(in a law court) a woman who presides over a jury and speaks on its behalf.
line manager	A fortified position (especially one marking the most forward position of troops.
manager	A person responsible for controlling or administering an organization or group of staff. She was a good manager and could make a meal out of nothing.
manageress	A female manager of a shop, restaurant, etc.



(in the US) a high-ranking official, especially the chief of a police **superintendent** department.

The **superintendent** registrar.

supervisor A person who directs and oversees the work of a postgraduate research student.

team leader Two or more draft animals that work together to pull something.



Associations of "Overseer" (30 Words)

accountant	A person whose job is to keep, inspect, and analyse financial accounts.
administrator	A person who dispenses or administers something. <i>Hospital administrators.</i>
assistant	A person who ranks below a senior person. My invaluable assistant .
<u>banker</u>	A financier who owns or is an executive in a bank. The horse should be a banker for him in the Members race.



bookkeeper	Someone who records the transactions of a business. The business had grown enough to justify hiring a bookkeeper .
boss	Excellent; outstanding. That was a real boss move on his part.
<u>captain</u>	Be the captain of a ship aircraft or sports team. All the boats are captain ed by professional sailors.
chief	An ordinary consisting of a broad horizontal band across the top of the shield. <i>Chief</i> among her concerns is working alone at night.
controller	A person who directs and restrains. The speed controller on his turntable was not working properly.
director	Member of a board of directors. <i>The sales director.</i>
<u>employer</u>	A person or firm that employs workers. The National Health Service was the largest employer in Europe.
examiner	Someone who administers a test to determine your qualifications. <i>Exams are marked by external examiners.</i>
foreman	A man who is foreperson of a jury. If you want to leave early you have to ask the foreman .
inspector	A police officer ranking below a chief inspector. A prison inspector .
leading	Having the leading position or higher score in a contest. <i>The country s leading poet.</i>
manager	(in the Houses of Parliament and the US Senate) a member of a committee appointed by one house to confer with a similar committee of the other house. She was a good manager and could make a meal out of nothing.
organizer	A person who arranges an event or activity. She was the organizer of the meeting.
<u>paramount</u>	More important than anything else; supreme. A paramount chief.
potentate	A monarch or ruler, especially an autocratic one.
producer	Something that produces. This microorganism is a producer of disease.
rudderless	Lacking a clear sense of one's aims or principles. <i>Today s leadership is rudderless.</i>



<u>scribe</u>	A sharp-pointed awl for marking wood or metal to be cut. <i>He</i> scribe d a note that he passed to Dan.
<u>secretary</u>	The principal assistant of a UK government minister or ambassador. She was secretary to David Wilby MP.
storekeeper	A shopkeeper.
superintend	Watch and direct. He superintend ed a land reclamation scheme.
superintendence	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. The school was under the superintendence of the nuns of the convent.
superintendent	A person who directs and manages an organization. <i>The superintendent registrar.</i>
<u>supervise</u>	Keep watch over (someone) in the interest of their or others' security. The sergeant left to supervise the loading of the lorries.
supervision	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. He was placed under the supervision of a probation officer.
supervisor	A person who supervises a person or an activity.
