above board	Appearing earlier in the same text.
apparent	Clearly visible or understood; obvious. <i>For no apparent reason she laughed.</i>
clear	Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible. <i>The letter brought back a clear image of his grandfather.</i>
conspicuous	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. <i>Made herself conspicuous by her exhibitionistic preening.</i>
manifest	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>Her manifest charm and proven ability.</i>

<u>noticeable</u>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>The church is noticeable for the fresco above the door.</i>
observable	Capable of being seen or noticed. Observable differences.
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was an obvious remark to make.</i>
open	Full of small openings or gaps. Open to attack.
<u>patent</u>	Made and marketed under a patent proprietary. <i>She was smiling with patent insincerity.</i>
plain	Not using concealment or deception; frank. <i>There were indrawn breaths at such plain speaking.</i>
plain to see	Lacking in physical beauty or proportion.
plainly seen	Not elaborate or elaborated; simple.
<u>public</u>	Of or provided by the state rather than an independent, commercial company. Public libraries.
unconcealed	Not concealed or hidden. <i>Watched with unconcealed curiosity.</i>
undisguised	(of a feeling) not disguised or concealed; open. Undisguised curiosity.
<u>unmistakable</u>	Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive. <i>His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.</i>
<u>visible</u>	Able to be seen. <i>A visible change of expression.</i>

<u>apparent</u>	Clearly visible or understood; obvious. <i>For no apparent reason she laughed.</i>
barefaced	With no effort to conceal. <i>A barefaced hypocrite.</i>
<u>blatant</u>	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. <i>Despite their blatant attraction to each other they try to stay just friends.</i>
<u>brazen</u>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety. <i>Brazen it out.</i>
<u>certainly</u>	Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’). <i>The prestigious address certainly adds to the firm’s appeal.</i>
confirming	Serving to support or corroborate.
<u>conspicuous</u>	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. <i>A tower conspicuous at a great distance.</i>
<u>definite</u>	Clearly true or real; unambiguous. <i>Under the circumstances air conditioning is a definite asset.</i>
<u>evident</u>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>She ate the biscuits with evident enjoyment.</i>
<u>explicit</u>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>Explicit instructions.</i>
flagrant	(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously offensive. <i>Flagrant violation of human rights.</i>
<u>flaunt</u>	Display proudly; act ostentatiously or pretentiously. <i>Newly rich consumers eager to flaunt their prosperity.</i>
<u>glaring</u>	Giving out or reflecting a strong or dazzling light. <i>The glaring sun.</i>
<u>manifest</u>	Record in a ship’s manifest. <i>Bad industrial relations are often manifested in strikes.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>Obvious errors.</i>
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
pellucid	Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. <i>A pellucid brook.</i>
perspicuous	Able to give an account or express an idea clearly. <i>A perspicuous argument.</i>
plain	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>Plain food.</i>

<u>presumptuous</u>	(of a person or their behaviour) failing to observe the limits of what is permitted or appropriate. <i>The duchess would not put up with presumptuous servants.</i>
pronounced	Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. <i>A pronounced flavor of cinnamon.</i>
proudly	With pride; in a proud manner. <i>She proudly displayed her newest creations.</i>
shameless	(of a person or their conduct) characterized by or showing a lack of shame; barefaced or brazen. <i>His shameless hypocrisy.</i>
stated	Declared as fact explicitly stated. <i>Do not exceed the stated dose.</i>
<u>unambiguous</u>	Not open to more than one interpretation. <i>As a horror apartheid is absolutely unambiguous.</i>
<u>unashamed</u>	Expressed or acting openly and without guilt or embarrassment. <i>An unashamed emotionalism.</i>
undisguised	(of a feeling) not disguised or concealed; open. <i>She looked at him with undisguised contempt.</i>
<u>unequivocal</u>	Clearly defined or formulated. <i>Unequivocal evidence.</i>
<u>unmistakable</u>	Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive. <i>His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.</i>
