### Definitions of "Overwhelmingly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “overwhelmingly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Incapable of being resisted.*
- *To a very great degree or with a great majority.*

### Synonyms of "Overwhelmingly" as an adverb (2 Words)

<b>irresistibly</b>	In a way that is too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>Men are <b>irresistibly</b> attracted to her.</i>
<b>overpoweringly</b>	Incapable of being resisted. <i>He found the weather <b>overpoweringly</b> hot.</i>

### Usage Examples of "Overwhelmingly" as an adverb

- *The country voted overwhelmingly for independence.*
- *The reaction has been overwhelmingly positive.*
- *The candy looked overwhelmingly desirable to the dieting man.*

## Associations of "Overwhelmingly" (30 Words)

<b>accepted</b>	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>Several <b>accepted</b> techniques for treating the condition.</i>
<b>always</b>	At all times; on all occasions. <i>I will <b>always</b> be there to help you.</i>
<b>basically</b>	In essence; at bottom or by one's (or its) very nature. <i>I <b>basically</b> played the same thing every night.</i>
<u><b>broadly</b></u>	In general and without considering minor details. <i><b>Broadly</b> speaking the risks are as follows.</i>
<u><b>chiefly</b></u>	For the most part; mostly. <i>An audience consisting <b>chiefly</b> of women between the ages of 18 and 54.</i>
<b>commonly</b>	Very often; frequently. <i>A <b>commonly</b> used industrial chemical.</i>
<u><b>consist</b></u>	Be consistent with. <i>Much propaganda simply <b>consists</b> in presenting the officially approved version of the truth as reality.</i>
<u><b>essentially</b></u>	In essence; at bottom or by one's (or its) very nature. <i>The argument was <b>essentially</b> a technical one.</i>
<b>exceptionally</b>	Only in unusual circumstances. <i>The court allows half an hour in most cases one hour <b>exceptionally</b> for a very important case.</i>
<u><b>generally</b></u>	In most cases; usually. <i>A decade when France was moving <b>generally</b> to the left.</i>
<b>habitually</b>	According to habit or custom. <i>He <b>habitually</b> carried a pocket knife.</i>
<b>irresistibly</b>	In a way that is too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>Men are <b>irresistibly</b> attracted to her.</i>
<u><b>largely</b></u>	On a large scale. <i>He was soon arrested <b>largely</b> through the efforts of Tom Poole.</i>
<u><b>mainly</b></u>	For the most part. <i>The west will be <b>mainly</b> dry.</i>
<u><b>mostly</b></u>	Usually; generally. <i>The culprits are <b>mostly</b> but not exclusively male.</i>
<u><b>normally</b></u>	In a normal manner. <i><b>Normally</b> it takes three or four years to complete the training.</i>

<b>ordinarily</b>	Under normal conditions. <i>An effort to behave <b>ordinarily</b>.</i>
<u><b>originally</b></u>	In a novel and inventive way. <i>Potatoes <b>originally</b> came from South America.</i>
<b>pantechnicon</b>	A large moving van (especially one used for moving furniture.
<b>predominantly</b>	Much greater in number or influence. <i>The patients are <b>predominantly</b> indigenous.</i>
<u><b>primarily</b></u>	For the most part. <i>This is <b>primarily</b> a question of economics.</i>
<b>principal</b>	An actor who plays a principal role. <i>I was appointed <b>principal</b> of the new school.</i>
<b>principally</b>	For the most part; chiefly. <i>He was <b>principally</b> a landscape painter.</i>
<u><b>public</b></u>	Affecting the people or community as a whole. <i>Performers and members of royal families are <b>public</b> figures.</i>
<u><b>routinely</b></u>	As part of a regular procedure rather than for a special reason. <i>Large scale producers <b>routinely</b> vaccinate their birds against the disease.</i>
<u><b>specially</b></u>	In a special manner. <i>A <b>specially</b> commissioned report.</i>
<u><b>typically</b></u>	In most cases; usually. <i><b>Typically</b> masculine social roles.</i>
<b>universally</b>	Everywhere. <i>Progress is not always <b>universally</b> welcomed.</i>
<b>usually</b>	Under normal conditions. <i>He <b>usually</b> arrives home about one o'clock.</i>
<u><b>wont</b></u>	An established custom. <i>He was <b>wont</b> to arise at 5 30 every morning.</i>
