Definitions of "Overwhelmingly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “overwhelmingly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Incapable of being resisted.*
- *To a very great degree or with a great majority.*

Synonyms of "Overwhelmingly" as an adverb (2 Words)

irresistibly In a way that is too attractive and tempting to be resisted.
*Men are **irresistibly** attracted to her.*

overpoweringly Incapable of being resisted.
*He found the weather **overpoweringly** hot.*

Usage Examples of "Overwhelmingly" as an adverb

- *The country voted overwhelmingly for independence.*
- *The reaction has been overwhelmingly positive.*
- *The candy looked overwhelmingly desirable to the dieting man.*

Associations of "Overwhelmingly" (30 Words)

accepted	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>Several accepted techniques for treating the condition.</i>
always	At all times; on all occasions. <i>I will always be there to help you.</i>
basically	In essence; at bottom or by one's (or its) very nature. <i>I basically played the same thing every night.</i>
<u>broadly</u>	In general and without considering minor details. <i>Broadly speaking the risks are as follows.</i>
<u>chiefly</u>	For the most part; mostly. <i>An audience consisting chiefly of women between the ages of 18 and 54.</i>
commonly	Very often; frequently. <i>A commonly used industrial chemical.</i>
<u>consist</u>	Be consistent with. <i>Much propaganda simply consists in presenting the officially approved version of the truth as reality.</i>
<u>essentially</u>	In essence; at bottom or by one's (or its) very nature. <i>The argument was essentially a technical one.</i>
exceptionally	Only in unusual circumstances. <i>The court allows half an hour in most cases one hour exceptionally for a very important case.</i>
<u>generally</u>	In most cases; usually. <i>A decade when France was moving generally to the left.</i>
habitually	According to habit or custom. <i>He habitually carried a pocket knife.</i>
irresistibly	In a way that is too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>Men are irresistibly attracted to her.</i>
<u>largely</u>	On a large scale. <i>He was soon arrested largely through the efforts of Tom Poole.</i>
<u>mainly</u>	For the most part. <i>The west will be mainly dry.</i>
<u>mostly</u>	Usually; generally. <i>The culprits are mostly but not exclusively male.</i>
<u>normally</u>	In a normal manner. <i>Normally it takes three or four years to complete the training.</i>

ordinarily	Under normal conditions. <i>An effort to behave ordinarily.</i>
originally	In a novel and inventive way. <i>Potatoes originally came from South America.</i>
pantehnicon	A large moving van (especially one used for moving furniture).
predominantly	Much greater in number or influence. <i>The patients are predominantly indigenous.</i>
primarily	For the most part. <i>This is primarily a question of economics.</i>
principal	An actor who plays a principal role. <i>I was appointed principal of the new school.</i>
principally	For the most part; chiefly. <i>He was principally a landscape painter.</i>
public	Affecting the people or community as a whole. <i>Performers and members of royal families are public figures.</i>
routinely	As part of a regular procedure rather than for a special reason. <i>Large scale producers routinely vaccinate their birds against the disease.</i>
specially	In a special manner. <i>A specially commissioned report.</i>
typically	In most cases; usually. <i>Typically masculine social roles.</i>
universally	Everywhere. <i>Progress is not always universally welcomed.</i>
usually	Under normal conditions. <i>He usually arrives home about one o'clock.</i>
wont	An established custom. <i>He was wont to arise at 5 30 every morning.</i>
