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## Associations of "Own accord" (30 Words)

<a href="#">accede</a>	Agree to a demand, request, or treaty. <i>By now John had died and Henry III had <b>acceded</b>.</i>
<b>accept</b>	Make use of or accept for some purpose. <i>The Irish never <b>accepted</b> him as one of them.</i>
<b>acceptance</b>	A draft or bill of exchange that is accepted by being signed. <i>Her <b>acceptance</b> of the gift encouraged him.</i>
<a href="#">admissible</a>	Having the right to be admitted to a place. <i>Foreigners were <b>admissible</b> only as temporary workers.</i>
<b>admittedly</b>	Used to express a concession or recognition that something is the case. <i><b>Admittedly</b> the salary was not wonderful.</i>
<a href="#">agree</a>	Show grammatical agreement. <i>I don t <b>agree</b> with random drugs testing in schools.</i>
<a href="#">approbation</a>	Approval or praise. <i>A term of <b>approbation</b>.</i>
<b>approval</b>	A message expressing a favorable opinion. <i>The road schemes have been given <b>approval</b>.</i>
<b>approve</b>	Officially agree to or accept as satisfactory. <i>I don t <b>approve</b> of romance.</i>
<b>assent</b>	Express approval or agreement. <i>A loud murmur of <b>assent</b>.</i>
<a href="#">coincide</a>	Happen simultaneously. <i>Our views on this matter <b>coincided</b>.</i>
<b>concession</b>	A commercial operation set up by agreement within the premises of a larger concern. <i>He got the beer <b>concession</b> at the ball park.</i>
<b>concur</b>	Be of the same opinion; agree. <i>We strongly <b>concur</b> with this recommendation.</i>

<b><u>conform</u></b>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The kitchen does not <b>conform</b> to hygiene regulations.</i>
<b>conformance</b>	Correspondence in form or appearance. <i><b>Conformance</b> testing.</i>
<b>conforming</b>	Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion).
<b><u>consent</u></b>	Give permission for something to happen. <i>He indicated his <b>consent</b>.</i>
<b><u>correspond</u></b>	Be equivalent or parallel, in mathematics. <i>The rank of Feldwebel in the German forces nominally <b>corresponded</b> to the British rank of sergeant.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>You don't <b>have</b> to accept this situation.</i>
<b><u>let</u></b>	Grant use or occupation of under a term of contract. <i><b>Let</b> A and B stand for X and Y respectively.</i>
<b><u>necessarily</u></b>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>It is <b>necessarily</b> so.</i>
<b>permission</b>	Approval to do something. <i>He received <b>permission</b> to go to Brussels.</i>
<b>ratification</b>	Making something valid by formally ratifying or confirming it. <i><b>Ratification</b> of the treaty raised problems in several member states.</i>
<b>ratify</b>	Sign or give formal consent to (a treaty, contract, or agreement), making it officially valid. <i>Both countries were due to <b>ratify</b> the treaty by the end of the year.</i>
<b>receive</b>	Receive a specified treatment abstract. <i>Her new collection of poems was not well <b>received</b>.</i>
<b>receptiveness</b>	Willingness or readiness to receive (especially impressions or ideas). <i>He was testing the government's <b>receptiveness</b> to reform.</i>
<b>resignedly</b>	In a hopeless resigned manner.
<b>sanction</b>	Give sanction to. <i>A range of <b>sanctions</b> aimed at deterring insider abuse.</i>
<b>take</b>	Occupy or take on. <i>The nurse <b>takes</b> my blood pressure.</i>
<b><u>treaty</u></b>	A formally concluded and ratified agreement between states. <i>The two Presidents signed a ten year <b>treaty</b> of solidarity.</i>
