accede Agree to a demand, request, or treaty.

accept Make use of or accept for some purpose.

**assent** Express approval or agreement.

A loud murmur of **assent**.

coincide Happen simultaneously.

Our views on this matter **coincide**d.

A commercial operation set up by agreement within the premises of a

**conform** Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions.

The kitchen does not **conform** to hygiene regulations.

**conformance** Correspondence in form or appearance.

Conformance testing.

**conforming** Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion.

Give permission for something to happen.

He indicated his **consent**.

Be equivalent or parallel, in mathematics.

**correspond** The rank of Feldwebel in the German forces nominally **correspond**ed to

the British rank of sergeant.

have Have ownership or possession of.

You don t **have** to accept this situation.

Grant use or occupation of under a term of contract.

**necessarily** In such a manner as could not be otherwise.

**permission** Approval to do something.

ratification Making something valid by formally ratifying or confirming it.

Sign or give formal consent to (a treaty, contract, or agreement), making it

receptiveness Willingness or readiness to receive (especially impressions or ideas.

A formally concluded and ratified agreement between states.

The two Presidents signed a ten year **treaty** of solidarity.
