- *A person who owns something.*

Synonyms of "Owner" as a noun (11 Words)

freeholder	A person who owns the freehold to a piece of land or property. <i>Freeholders are usually responsible for the repair and maintenance of the exterior of the building.</i>
holder	A smallholder. <i>Holders of two American hostages.</i>
homeowner	Someone who owns a home.
keeper	A ring worn to keep a more valuable one on the finger. <i>This disc is a keeper and one that belongs on every serious DVD collector's shelf.</i>
landlady	A woman who rents out land, a building, or accommodation.
landlord	A landowner who leases to others.
master	Someone who holds a master's degree from academic institution. <i>Follow in the footsteps of the masters and paint in locations made famous by their work.</i>

- mistress** A woman schoolteacher (especially one regarded as strict).
*She is always **mistress** of the situation coolly self possessed.*
- possessor** A person who takes, occupies, or holds something without necessarily having ownership, or as distinguished from the owner.
*His father was the **possessor** of a considerable fortune.*
- proprietor** Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business.
*Chinese restaurant **proprietors**.*
- proprietress** A female proprietor.



Usage Examples of "Owner" as a noun

- *Who is the owner of that friendly smile?*
- *He is the owner of a chain of restaurants.*
- *They are searching for the owner of the car.*
- *The proud owner of a huge Dalmatian.*
- *Restaurant owners.*

holding	The tenure of land held by lease. <i>Commercial property holdings.</i>
host	Act as host at an event or for a television or radio programme. <i>Your host is Stuart Macmillan.</i>
hostess	A woman who receives or entertains guests. <i>The perfect dinner party hostess.</i>
landed	Owning or consisting of land or real estate. <i>The landed aristocracy.</i>
landholder	A person who owns land, especially one who either makes their living from it or rents it out to others.
landlady	A landlord who is a woman.
landlord	A landowner who leases to others.
leader	The person or team that is winning a sporting competition at a particular time. <i>The leader of a protest group.</i>
loan	The temporary provision of money (usually at interest). <i>Borrowers can take out a loan for 84 000.</i>
lord	Make a lord of someone. <i>When we were at school you used to lord it over us.</i>
master	Make a master copy of a film or recording. <i>The master of the Aylesbury Vale Hunt.</i>
overlord	A person of great power or authority. <i>Charles was overlord of vast territories in Europe.</i>
own	Have ownership or possession of. <i>He owns three houses in Florida.</i>
pawnbroker	A person who lends money at interest on the security of an article pawned.
person	A category used in the classification of pronouns possessive determiners and verb forms according to whether they indicate the speaker first person the addressee second person or a third party third person. <i>She s not a cat person.</i>
possessor	A person who owns something. <i>His father was the possessor of a considerable fortune.</i>

property	Shares or investments in property. <i>He s expanding now buying property.</i>
proprietor	The owner of a business, or a holder of property. <i>By 1640 he was himself the proprietor of a three hundred acre tract.</i>
proprietorship	An unincorporated business owned by a single person who is responsible for its liabilities and entitled to its profits. <i>The company was established in 1912 and is still under the proprietorship of the same family.</i>
rancher	A person who owns or operates a ranch.
rent	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>He purchased a large tract of land and rented it out to local farmers.</i>
tenant	Occupy as a tenant. <i>A frequent tenant of the gossip columns.</i>
wealthy	Having an abundant supply of money or possessions of value. <i>The wealthy nations of the world.</i>
