### Definitions of "Owner" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “owner” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *(law) someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business.*
- *A person who owns something.*
- *Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business.*



## Synonyms of "Owner" as a noun (11 Words)

- freeholder** A person who owns the freehold to a piece of land or property. ***Freeholders** are usually responsible for the repair and maintenance of the exterior of the building.*
- holder** A smallholder. ***Holders** of two American hostages.*
- homeowner** Someone who owns a home.
- keeper** A ring worn to keep a more valuable one on the finger. *This disc is a **keeper** and one that belongs on every serious DVD collector's shelf.*
- landlady** A woman who rents out land, a building, or accommodation.
- landlord** A landowner who leases to others.
- master** Someone who holds a master's degree from an academic institution. *Follow in the footsteps of the **masters** and paint in locations made famous by their work.*

- mistress** A woman schoolteacher (especially one regarded as strict).  
*She is always **mistress** of the situation coolly self possessed.*
- possessor** A person who takes, occupies, or holds something without necessarily having ownership, or as distinguished from the owner.  
*His father was the **possessor** of a considerable fortune.*
- proprietor** Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business.  
*Chinese restaurant **proprietors**.*
- proprietress** A female proprietor.



### Usage Examples of "Owner" as a noun

- *Who is the owner of that friendly smile?*
- *He is the owner of a chain of restaurants.*
- *They are searching for the owner of the car.*
- *The proud owner of a huge Dalmatian.*
- *Restaurant owners.*





## Associations of "Owner" (30 Words)

- chattel** An item of property other than freehold land including tangible goods chattels personal and leasehold interests chattels real.
- checkbook** A book issued to holders of checking accounts.
- debenture** The ability of a customer to obtain goods or services before payment, based on the trust that payment will be made in the future.
- estate** A class or order regarded as forming part of the body politic in particular in Britain one of the three groups constituting Parliament now the Lords spiritual the heads of the Church the Lords temporal the peerage and the Commons They are also known as the three estates.  
*An industrial **estate**.*
- founder** Inflammation of the laminated tissue that attaches the hoof to the foot of a horse.  
*The horses **foundered**.*

<b>holding</b>	The tenure of land held by lease. <i>Commercial property <b>holdings</b>.</i>
<b>host</b>	Act as host at an event or for a television or radio programme. <i>Your <b>host</b> is Stuart Macmillan.</i>
<b>hostess</b>	A woman who receives or entertains guests. <i>The perfect dinner party <b>hostess</b>.</i>
<b>landed</b>	Owning or consisting of land or real estate. <i>The <b>landed</b> aristocracy.</i>
<b>landholder</b>	A person who owns land, especially one who either makes their living from it or rents it out to others.
<b>landlady</b>	A landlord who is a woman.
<b>landlord</b>	A landowner who leases to others.
<b>leader</b>	The person or team that is winning a sporting competition at a particular time. <i>The <b>leader</b> of a protest group.</i>
<b>loan</b>	The temporary provision of money (usually at interest). <i>Borrowers can take out a <b>loan</b> for 84 000.</i>
<b>lord</b>	Make a lord of someone. <i>When we were at school you used to <b>lord</b> it over us.</i>
<b>master</b>	Make a master copy of a film or recording. <i>The <b>master</b> of the Aylesbury Vale Hunt.</i>
<b>overlord</b>	A person of great power or authority. <i>Charles was <b>overlord</b> of vast territories in Europe.</i>
<b>own</b>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>He <b>owns</b> three houses in Florida.</i>
<b>pawnbroker</b>	A person who lends money at interest on the security of an article pawned.
<b>person</b>	A category used in the classification of pronouns possessive determiners and verb forms according to whether they indicate the speaker first person the addressee second person or a third party third person. <i>She s not a cat <b>person</b>.</i>
<b>possessor</b>	A person who owns something. <i>His father was the <b>possessor</b> of a considerable fortune.</i>



<b>property</b>	Shares or investments in property. <i>He s expanding now buying <b>property</b>.</i>
<b>proprietor</b>	The owner of a business, or a holder of property. <i>By 1640 he was himself the <b>proprietor</b> of a three hundred acre tract.</i>
<b>proprietorship</b>	An unincorporated business owned by a single person who is responsible for its liabilities and entitled to its profits. <i>The company was established in 1912 and is still under the <b>proprietorship</b> of the same family.</i>
<b>rancher</b>	A person who owns or operates a ranch.
<b>rent</b>	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>He purchased a large tract of land and <b>rented</b> it out to local farmers.</i>
<b>tenant</b>	Occupy as a tenant. <i>A frequent <b>tenant</b> of the gossip columns.</i>
<b>wealthy</b>	Having an abundant supply of money or possessions of value. <i>The <b>wealthy</b> nations of the world.</i>
