- A *collection of things wrapped or boxed together*.

software program	Written programs or procedures or rules and associated documentation pertaining to the operation of a computer system and that are stored in read/write memory.
software system	Written programs or procedures or rules and associated documentation pertaining to the operation of a computer system and that are stored in read/write memory.

- *Present (someone or something) in an attractive or advantageous way.*
- *Put into a box.*
- *Combine (various products) for sale as one unit.*
- *Put into a box or wrapping for sale or transport.*
- *Commission and produce (a book, typically a highly illustrated one) to sell as a complete product to publishers.*



Synonyms of "Package" as a verb (4 Words)

- box** Put in or provide with a box.
*Each piece is **boxed** with a certificate of authenticity.*
- gift-wrap** Wrap (a gift) attractively.
- [wrap](#) Clasp or embrace (someone).
*She **wrapped** him in her arms.*
- wrap up** Crash into so as to coil around.

- *The singer is being packaged to appeal to teenagers.*
- *It's a question of trying to package the book properly.*
- *Choose products which are packaged in recyclable materials.*
- *Films would be packaged with the pictures of a production company.*

<u>crate</u>	Pack something in a crate for transportation. <i>A crate of bananas.</i>
disposal	The action of overcoming a rival or threat. <i>England s 4 0 disposal of Turkey.</i>
junk	Junk bonds. <i>I can t write this kind of junk.</i>
lade	Ship (goods) as cargo. <i>The surplus products must be laden on board the vessels.</i>
landfill	Bury in a landfill. <i>Landfilled waste.</i>
load	Fill or place a load on. <i>Load your camera before you start.</i>
luggage	Past experiences or long-held ideas and opinions perceived as burdensome encumbrances. <i>Carrying emotional luggage from the past.</i>
mailman	A man who delivers the mail.
nickel	Plate with nickel. <i>A nickel bag of drugs.</i>
<u>pack</u>	Have the property of being packable or of compacting easily. <i>The organs were packed in ice.</i>
packet	The contents of a packet. <i>I can eat a whole packet of biscuits in one go.</i>
<u>parcel</u>	Make something into a parcel by wrapping it. <i>A brown paper parcel.</i>
pile	Place or lay as if in a pile. <i>Ten of us piled into the minibus.</i>

- recycling** Waste material set aside to be recycled.
*A call for the **recycling** of all paper.*
- reuse** The action of using something again.
*The ballast was cleaned ready for **reuse**.*
- sheaf** Bundle into sheaves.
*He waved a **sheaf** of papers in the air.*
- shipping** The commercial enterprise of moving goods and materials.
*The volume of **shipping** using these ports.*
- tin** Preserve in a can or tin.
***Tinned** foods are not very tasty.*
- tinplate** Sheet steel or iron coated with tin.
