Definitions of "Pained" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “pained” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Emotionally hurt or upset or annoyed.*
- *Affected with pain, especially mental pain; hurt or troubled.*



Synonyms of "Pained" as an adjective (3 Words)

- injured** Harmed, damaged, or impaired.
*A road accident left him severely **injured**.*
- offended** Emotionally hurt or upset or annoyed.
*She looked **offended**.*
- smart** (of clothes) attractively neat and stylish.
*Hi tech **smart** weapons.*



Usage Examples of "Pained" as an adjective

- *Susan looked pained.*
- *A pained expression came over his face.*
- *Face had a pained and puzzled expression.*



Associations of "Pained" (30 Words)

- abrasion** The wearing down of rock particles by friction due to water or wind or ice.
*The metal is resistant to **abrasion**.*
- ache** An emotion experienced with painful or bittersweet intensity.
*She looked so tired that my heart **ached** for her.*
- agony** Extreme physical or mental suffering.
*An **agony** of doubt.*
- ailment** An illness, typically a minor one.
*The doctor diagnosed a common stomach **ailment**.*
- arthritis** A disease causing painful inflammation and stiffness of the joints.
- bleed** An instance of bleeding.
*I worked loosely with the oils allowing colours to **bleed** into one another.*
- bleeding** Used for emphasis, or to express annoyance.
*The watch was a **bleeding** copy.*

bruise	Cause a bruise or bruises to appear on a fruit vegetable or plant. <i>This remark really bruised my ego.</i>
concussion	A violent shock as from a heavy blow. <i>He was carried off the pitch with concussion.</i>
contusion	An injury that doesn't break the skin but results in some discoloration. <i>Vigorously shaking the head back and forth can produce contusions to the soft structure of the brain.</i>
<u>discomfort</u>	The state of being tense and feeling pain. <i>The patient complained of discomfort in the left calf.</i>
dolor	Painful grief.
earache	An ache localized in the middle or inner ear. <i>A child complaining of an earache.</i>
headache	Something or someone that causes anxiety; a source of unhappiness. <i>I ve got a splitting headache.</i>
<u>heal</u>	Become sound or healthy again. <i>The quack pretended to heal patients but never managed to.</i>
hemophilia	Congenital tendency to uncontrolled bleeding; usually affects males and is transmitted from mother to son.
hurt	Hurt the feelings of. <i>Does acupuncture hurt.</i>
hypochondria	Abnormal chronic anxiety about one's health.
injure	Cause damage or affect negatively. <i>The explosion injured several people.</i>
lacerate	Cut or tear irregularly. <i>Lacerate leaves.</i>
<u>misery</u>	A person who is constantly miserable or discontented. <i>She was exhausted by her misery and grief.</i>
moan	Make a sound resembling a human moan. <i>The moan of the wind in the chimneys.</i>
<u>nausea</u>	A feeling of sickness with an inclination to vomit. <i>The stories will launch a wave of public nausea and outrage.</i>
rheumatism	A chronic autoimmune disease with inflammation of the joints and marked deformities; something (possibly a virus) triggers an attack on the synovium by the immune system, which releases cytokines that stimulate an inflammatory reaction.
<u>scar</u>	Form or be marked with a scar. <i>His arm will not scar.</i>

sickness	The state of being ill. <i>A great sickness of his judgment.</i>
splitting	Resembling a sound of violent tearing as of something ripped apart or lightning splitting a tree. <i>The splitting of water into its components of hydrogen and oxygen is critical.</i>
suffer	Undergo or suffer. <i>My conscience would not suffer me to accept any more.</i>
suffering	Psychological suffering. <i>Weapons that cause unnecessary suffering.</i>
toothache	An ache localized in or around a tooth. <i>He has a toothache.</i>
