smart Hi tech **smart** weapons.






Usage Examples of "Pained" as an adjective

- Susan looked pained.
- A pained expression came over his face.
- Face had a pained and puzzled expression.





Associations of "Pained" (30 Words)

The wearing down of rock particles by friction due to water or wind or ice. abrasion

The metal is resistant to **abrasion**.

An emotion experienced with painful or bittersweet intensity. ache

She looked so tired that my heart **ache**d for her.

Extreme physical or mental suffering. **agony**

An **agony** of doubt.

An illness, typically a minor one. ailment

The doctor diagnosed a common stomach ailment.

arthritis A disease causing painful inflammation and stiffness of the joints.

An instance of bleeding. bleed

I worked loosely with the oils allowing colours to **bleed** into one another.

Used for emphasis, or to express annoyance. bleeding

The watch was a **bleeding** copy.



Cause a bruise or bruises to appear on a fruit vegetable or plant. bruise

This remark really **bruise**d my ego.

A violent shock as from a heavy blow. concussion

He was carried off the pitch with **concussion**.

An injury that doesn't break the skin but results in some discoloration.

Vigorously shaking the head back and forth can produce **contusion**s to the contusion

soft structure of the brain.

The state of being tense and feeling pain. discomfort

The patient complained of **discomfort** in the left calf.

dolor Painful grief.

An ache localized in the middle or inner ear. earache

A child complaining of an **earache**.

Something or someone that causes anxiety; a source of unhappiness. headache

I ve got a splitting **headache**.

Become sound or healthy again. **heal**

The quack pretended to **heal** patients but never managed to.

Congenital tendency to uncontrolled bleeding; usually affects males and is hemophilia

transmitted from mother to son.

Hurt the feelings of. hurt Does acupuncture **hurt**.

hypochondria Abnormal chronic anxiety about one's health.

Cause damage or affect negatively. injure

The explosion **injure**d several people.

Cut or tear irregularly. lacerate

Lacerate leaves.

A person who is constantly miserable or discontented. **misery**

She was exhausted by her **misery** and grief.

Make a sound resembling a human moan. moan

The **moan** of the wind in the chimneys.

A feeling of sickness with an inclination to vomit. nausea

The stories will launch a wave of public **nausea** and outrage.

A chronic autoimmune disease with inflammation of the joints and marked

deformities; something (possibly a virus) triggers an attack on the

Form or be marked with a scar.

sickness The state of being ill.

A great **sickness** of his judgment.
