### **Definitions of "Pained" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “pained” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Emotionally hurt or upset or annoyed.*
- *Affected with pain, especially mental pain; hurt or troubled.*



### Synonyms of "Pained" as an adjective (3 Words)

- injured** Harmed, damaged, or impaired.  
*A road accident left him severely **injured**.*
- offended** Emotionally hurt or upset or annoyed.  
*She looked **offended**.*
- smart** (of clothes) attractively neat and stylish.  
*Hi tech **smart** weapons.*



## Usage Examples of "Pained" as an adjective

- *Susan looked pained.*
- *A pained expression came over his face.*
- *Face had a pained and puzzled expression.*



## Associations of "Pained" (30 Words)

### abrasion

The wearing down of rock particles by friction due to water or wind or ice.  
*The metal is resistant to **abrasion**.*

### ache

An emotion experienced with painful or bittersweet intensity.  
*She looked so tired that my heart **ached** for her.*

### agony

Extreme physical or mental suffering.  
*An **agony** of doubt.*

### ailment

An illness, typically a minor one.  
*The doctor diagnosed a common stomach **ailment**.*

### **arthritis**

A disease causing painful inflammation and stiffness of the joints.

### **bleed**

An instance of bleeding.  
*I worked loosely with the oils allowing colours to **bleed** into one another.*

### **bleeding**

Used for emphasis, or to express annoyance.  
*The watch was a **bleeding** copy.*

<b>bruise</b>	Cause a bruise or bruises to appear on a fruit vegetable or plant. <i>This remark really <b>bruised</b> my ego.</i>
<b>concussion</b>	A violent shock as from a heavy blow. <i>He was carried off the pitch with <b>concussion</b>.</i>
<b>contusion</b>	An injury that doesn't break the skin but results in some discoloration. <i>Vigorously shaking the head back and forth can produce <b>contusions</b> to the soft structure of the brain.</i>
<u><b>discomfort</b></u>	The state of being tense and feeling pain. <i>The patient complained of <b>discomfort</b> in the left calf.</i>
<b>dolor</b>	Painful grief.
<b>earache</b>	An ache localized in the middle or inner ear. <i>A child complaining of an <b>earache</b>.</i>
<b>headache</b>	Something or someone that causes anxiety; a source of unhappiness. <i>I ve got a splitting <b>headache</b>.</i>
<u><b>heal</b></u>	Become sound or healthy again. <i>The quack pretended to <b>heal</b> patients but never managed to.</i>
<b>hemophilia</b>	Congenital tendency to uncontrolled bleeding; usually affects males and is transmitted from mother to son.
<b>hurt</b>	Hurt the feelings of. <i>Does acupuncture <b>hurt</b>.</i>
<b>hypochondria</b>	Abnormal chronic anxiety about one's health.
<b>injure</b>	Cause damage or affect negatively. <i>The explosion <b>injured</b> several people.</i>
<b>lacerate</b>	Cut or tear irregularly. <i><b>Lacerate</b> leaves.</i>
<u><b>misery</b></u>	A person who is constantly miserable or discontented. <i>She was exhausted by her <b>misery</b> and grief.</i>
<b>moan</b>	Make a sound resembling a human moan. <i>The <b>moan</b> of the wind in the chimneys.</i>
<u><b>nausea</b></u>	A feeling of sickness with an inclination to vomit. <i>The stories will launch a wave of public <b>nausea</b> and outrage.</i>
<b>rheumatism</b>	A chronic autoimmune disease with inflammation of the joints and marked deformities; something (possibly a virus) triggers an attack on the synovium by the immune system, which releases cytokines that stimulate an inflammatory reaction.
<u><b>scar</b></u>	Form or be marked with a scar. <i>His arm will not <b>scar</b>.</i>

<b>sickness</b>	The state of being ill. <i>A great <b>sickness</b> of his judgment.</i>
<b>splitting</b>	Resembling a sound of violent tearing as of something ripped apart or lightning splitting a tree. <i>The <b>splitting</b> of water into its components of hydrogen and oxygen is critical.</i>
<b>suffer</b>	Undergo or suffer. <i>My conscience would not <b>suffer</b> me to accept any more.</i>
<b>suffering</b>	Psychological suffering. <i>Weapons that cause unnecessary <b>suffering</b>.</i>
<b>toothache</b>	An ache localized in or around a tooth. <i>He has a <b>toothache</b>.</i>
