Definitions of "Paint" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “paint” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A substance used as a coating to protect or decorate a surface (especially a mixture of pigment suspended in a liquid); dries to form a hard coating.*
- *An act of painting something.*
- *(basketball) a space (including the foul line) in front of the basket at each end of a basketball court; usually painted a different color from the rest of the court.*
- *The rectangular area marked near the basket at each end of the court.*
- *Cosmetic make-up.*
- *A piebald horse.*

- A space (including the foul line) in front of the basket at each end of a basketball court; usually painted a different color from the rest of the court.
- The function or capability of producing graphics, especially those that mimic the effect of real paint.
- Makeup consisting of a pink or red powder applied to the cheeks.
- A coloured substance which is spread over a surface and dries to leave a thin decorative or protective coating.

*The loss of **pigment** in the skin.*
- rouge** A red powder or cream used as a cosmetic for colouring the cheeks or lips.
*She wore patches of **rouge** on her cheeks.*
- stain** A coloured patch or dirty mark that is difficult to remove.
*The wine left a dark **stain**.*
- tint** A set of parallel engraved lines to give uniform shading.
*The sky was taking on an apricot **tint**.*
- wash** An act of washing something or an instance of being washed.
*The plan's impact on jobs would be a **wash** creating as many as it costs.*

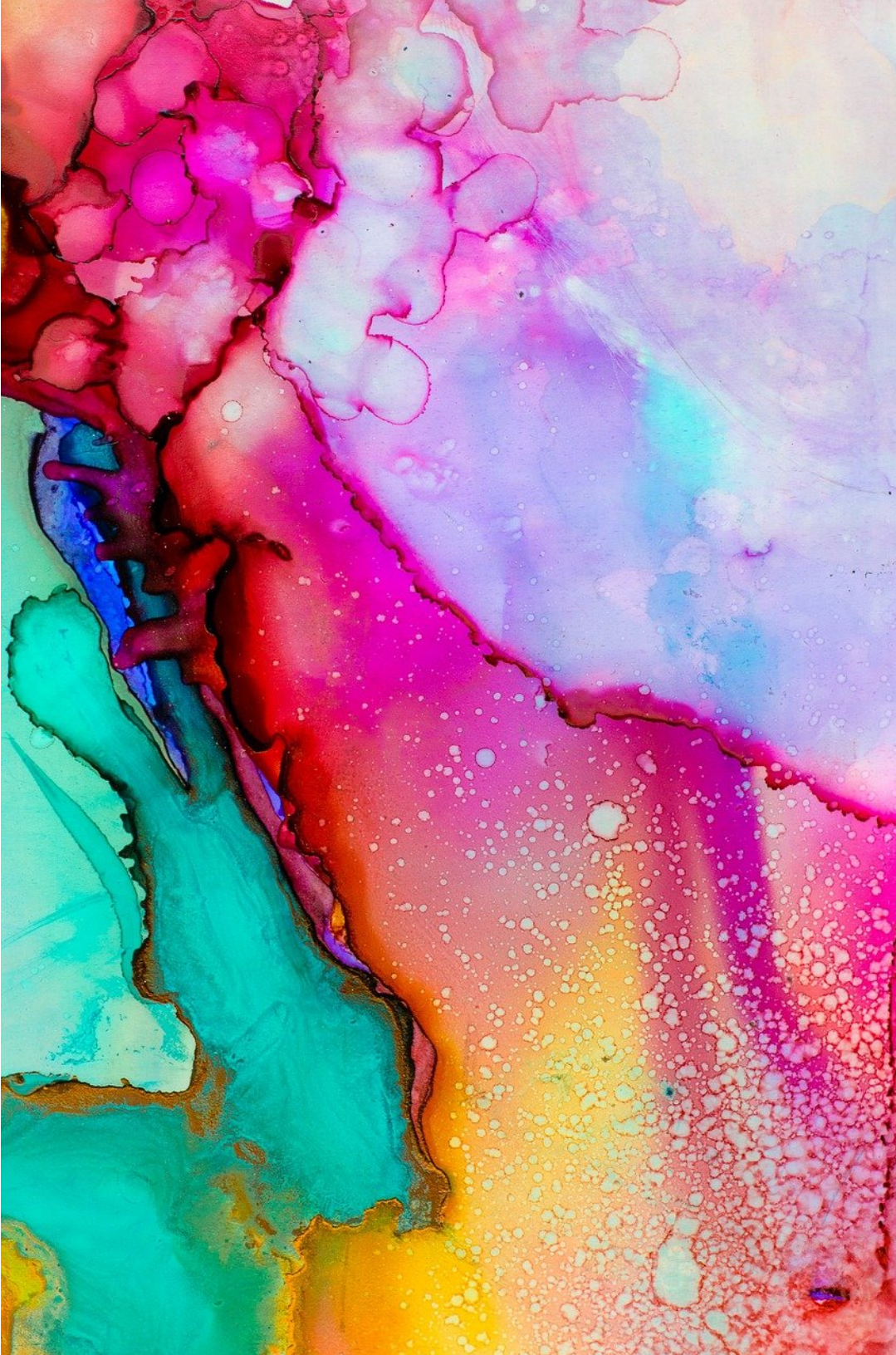
Paint as a Verb

- *Apply a liquid to; e.g., paint the gutters with linseed oil.*
- *Create (a graphic or screen display) using a paint program.*
- *Display a mark representing (an aircraft or vehicle) on a radar screen.*
- *Apply paint to; coat with paint.*
- *Apply cosmetics to (the skin).*

- *Depict (someone or something) or produce (a picture) with paint.*
- *Make a painting of.*
- *Make a painting.*
- *Cover the surface of (something) with paint.*

detail	Provide details for. <i>The report details proposals to improve public transport.</i>
distemper	Paint with distemper.
draw	Represent by making a drawing of as with a pencil chalk etc on a surface. <i>A cart drawn by two horses.</i>

dye	Take colour well or badly during the dyeing process. <i>It s good material it should dye well.</i>
emulsion	Paint with emulsion. <i>If the lining paper is not opaque the wall should also be emulsioned.</i>
<u>evoke</u>	Evoke or provoke to appear or occur. <i>The sight evoked pleasant memories of his childhood.</i>
gloss	Apply a glossy substance to. <i>The pebble dash of the walls was glossed white.</i>
<u>narrate</u>	Narrate or give a detailed account of. <i>The series is narrated by Richard Baker.</i>
outline	Draw up an outline or sketch for something. <i>Outline his ideas.</i>
paint a picture of	Make a painting.
picture	Represent in a photograph or picture. <i>She pictured Benjamin waiting.</i>
plaster	Coat with plaster. <i>His hair was plastered down with water.</i>
portray	Portray in words. <i>The ineffectual Oxbridge dons portrayed by Evelyn Waugh.</i>
<u>recount</u>	Tell someone about something; give an account of an event or experience. <i>We had to recount all the votes after an accusation of fraud was made.</i>
represent	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody s interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>She became the first woman to represent a South Wales mining valley.</i>
set forth	Put into a certain place or abstract location.
set out	Get ready for a particular purpose or event.
<u>sketch</u>	Make a sketch of. <i>They sketched out the prosecution case.</i>
smear	Stain by smearing or daubing with a dirty substance. <i>Smear the wall with paint.</i>
<u>spray</u>	Be discharged in sprays of liquid. <i>Water sprayed all over the floor.</i>

stain	Produce or leave stains. <i>Wood can always be stained to a darker shade.</i>
tell	Reveal (information) to someone in a non-verbal way. <i>Promise you won t tell.</i>

daub	Material used to daub walls. <i>The walls were daubed with splashes of paint.</i>
deodorant	A substance which removes or conceals unpleasant smells, especially bodily odours.
dispersal	The splitting up and selling off of a collection of artefacts or books. <i>Dispersals of archaic populations.</i>
dispersion	The extent to which values of a variable differ from a fixed value such as the mean. <i>The dispersion of the troops.</i>
dye	Color with dye. <i>A black dye.</i>
epoxy	Glue something using epoxy resin. <i>Epoxy the shards.</i>
fresco	Paint in fresco. <i>Four scenes had been frescoed on the wall.</i>
gouache	Opaque watercolour of the type used in gouache painting.
inject	Give an injection to. <i>People who want to stop injecting.</i>
monochromatic	Of or relating to monochromatism. <i>Monochromatic light.</i>
opacity	Incomprehensibility resulting from obscurity of meaning. <i>The difficulty and opacity in Barthes texts.</i>
painfully	Unpleasantly. <i>Progress was painfully slow.</i>
painting	The act of applying paint to a surface. <i>Pastels require a different approach to painting.</i>
palette	A small flat case containing several separate shades of eyeshadow or other make-up product. <i>Our Essential Eyes palette has eight mix and match shades.</i>
pigment	Color or dye with a pigment. <i>All the frescoes are painted with earth pigments.</i>

plywood	A type of strong thin wooden board consisting of two or more layers glued and pressed together with the direction of the grain alternating. <i>Plywood benches.</i>
primer	A small pump for pumping fuel to prime an internal combustion engine, especially in an aircraft. <i>No more than four pumps of the primer usually suffice.</i>
<u>scatter</u>	The scattering of light other electromagnetic radiation or particles. <i>Fernandez struck out 14 while scattering three hits over eight scoreless innings.</i>
smear	Stain by smearing or daubing with a dirty substance. <i>Soon you re eyeballing the top just one smear away.</i>
smudge	Make a smudge on soil by smudging. <i>Mascaras that smudge or flake around the eyes.</i>
<u>spray</u>	A can or container holding a spray. <i>Refresh your flowers with a quick spray.</i>
sprayer	A dispenser that turns a liquid (such as perfume) into a fine mist. <i>Apply two light coats with a sprayer.</i>
triptych	A set of three associated artistic, literary, or musical works intended to be appreciated together. <i>A triptych on the theme of the holocaust.</i>
<u>veneer</u>	Cover with veneer. <i>A veneered cabinet.</i>
