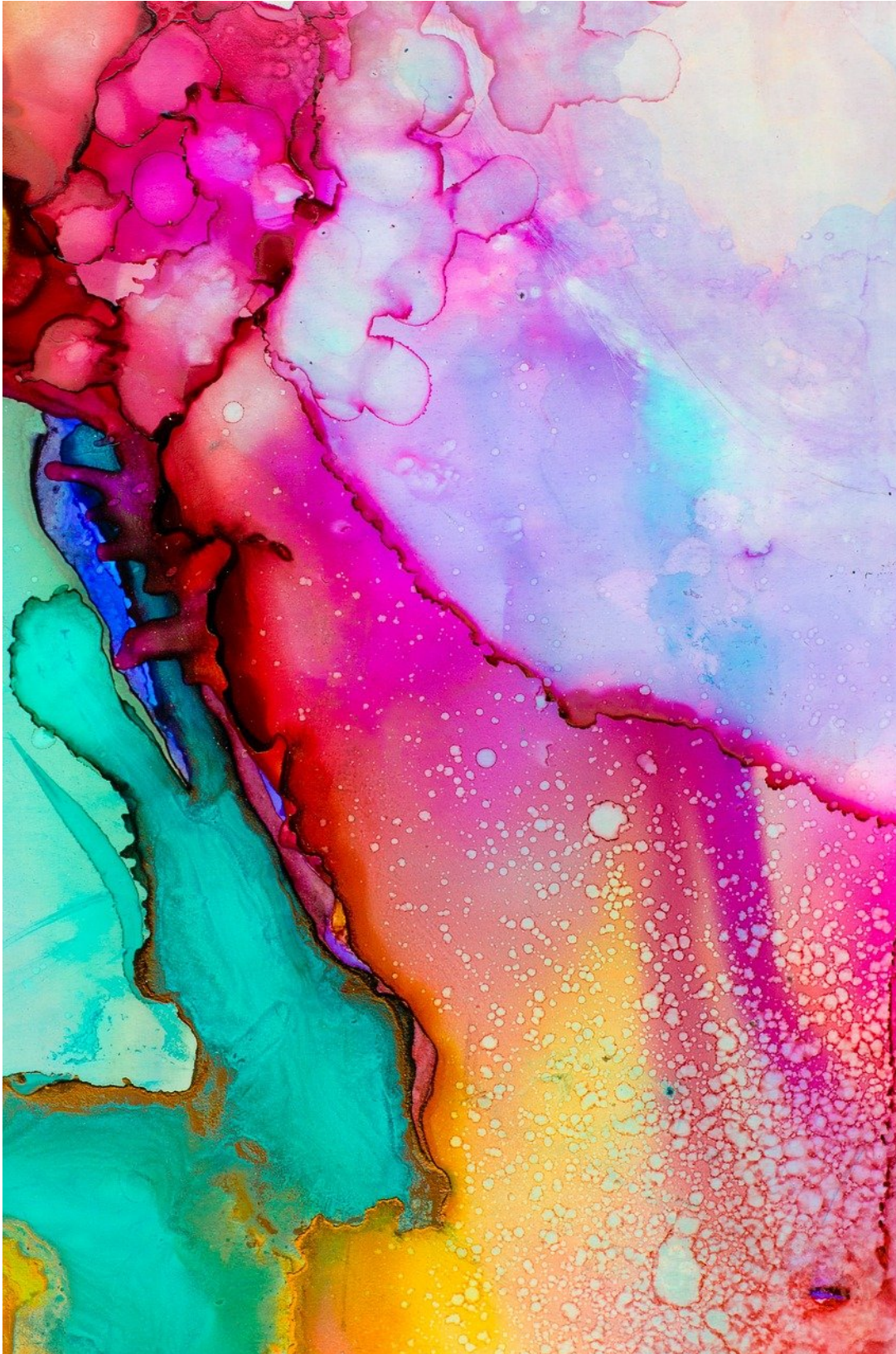

Definitions of "Painted" as an adjective

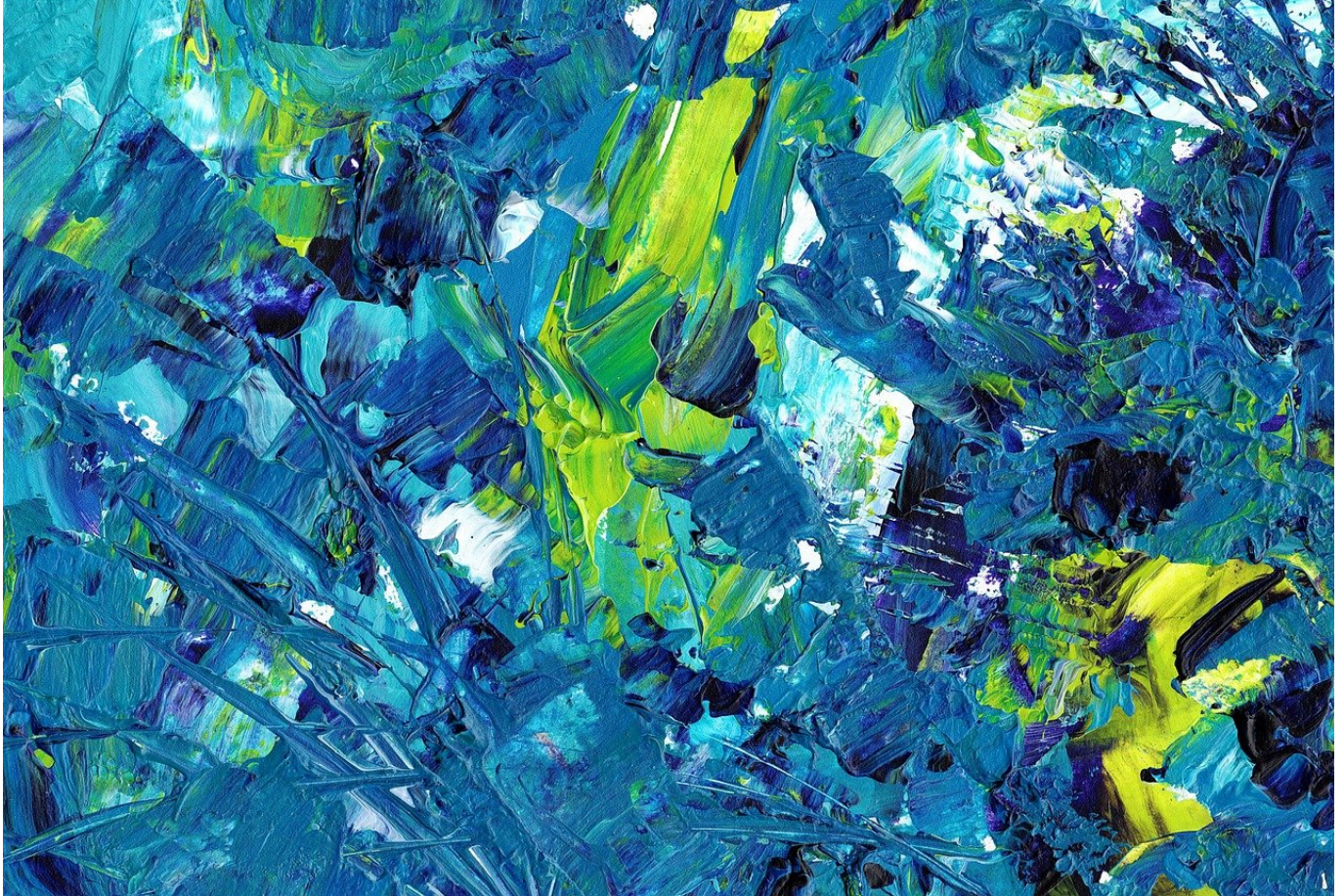
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “painted” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Coated with paint.*
- *Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.*
- *Having makeup applied.*
- *Lacking substance or vitality as if produced by painting.*

calico	Made of calico or resembling calico in being patterned.
motley	Incongruously varied in appearance or character; disparate. <i>A motley crew of discontents and zealots.</i>
multi-color	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.
multi-colored	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.
multi-colour	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.
multi-coloured	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.
multicolor	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.
multicolored	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.
multicolour	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.
multicoloured	Having many colours.
particolored	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly. <i>A particolored dress.</i>
particoloured	Having or consisting of two or more different colours. <i>Particoloured Devon cattle.</i>
piebald	(of a horse) having irregular patches of two colours, typically black and white. <i>A piebald horse.</i>
pied	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly. <i>Pied daisies.</i>
varicolored	Having a variety of colors.
varicoloured	Consisting of several different colours. <i>The varicoloured light from the lanterns.</i>

blob	Put small drops of thick liquid or spots of colour on. <i>A big pink blob of a face was at the window.</i>
blue	Blue clothing. <i>Ashley went blue and I panicked.</i>
brownish	Of a color similar to that of wood or earth. <i>Where I live the soil is brownish red.</i>
color	Add color to. <i>Fall colored the trees.</i>
colored	Artificially produced; not natural. <i>Amber colored heads of grain.</i>
colorful	Having much or varied color. <i>A colorful character.</i>

dye	Take colour well or badly during the dyeing process. <i>A black dye.</i>
hue	A colour or shade. <i>In highlights it hued to a dull silver grey.</i>
iridescent	Showing luminous colours that seem to change when seen from different angles. <i>A dragonfly hovered vibrating and iridescent.</i>
magenta	A primary subtractive color for light a dark purple red color the dye for magenta was discovered in 1859 the year of the battle of Magenta. <i>A short magenta dress.</i>
monochromatic	Containing or using only one colour. <i>Monochromatic light.</i>
monochrome	Having or appearing to have only one color.
motley	Make motley color with different colors. <i>A motley crew of discontents and zealots.</i>
mottled	Having spots or patches of color. <i>A bird with mottled brown plumage.</i>
piebald	A piebald horse. <i>A piebald horse.</i>
pie	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly. <i>Pied daisies.</i>
pigmentation	Abnormal colouring of a person's skin, typically resulting from disease.
polychrome	Color with many colors make polychrome. <i>A precious polychrome ikon.</i>
purple	In ancient Rome or Byzantium clothing made from fabric dyed with Tyrian purple. <i>A faded purple T shirt.</i>
red	Of a person s eyes bloodshot or having pink rims especially with tiredness or crying. <i>A red Xhosa wife spends several years in her mother in law s homestead.</i>
roan	A roan animal. <i>A roan horse.</i>
spot	Mark or become marked with spots. <i>A spot of bother flared up.</i>
spotted	Marked or decorated with spots. <i>A red spotted handkerchief.</i>

- stain** Produce or leave stains.
*Wood can always be **stained** to a darker shade.*
- stained** (of a material or object) coloured by application of a penetrative dye or chemical.
*A dark brown **stained** wood.*
- tint** Dye someone's hair with a tint.
*The sky was taking on an apricot **tint**.*
- variegate** Change the appearance of, especially by marking with different colors.
*The designer can **variegate** the object's colour and physical character as needed.*
- variegated** Exhibiting different colours, especially as irregular patches or streaks.
*The **variegated** form of philadelphus.*
- variegation** Variability in coloration.
- weal** Mark with a weal.
*His neck was **wealed** and raw.*
