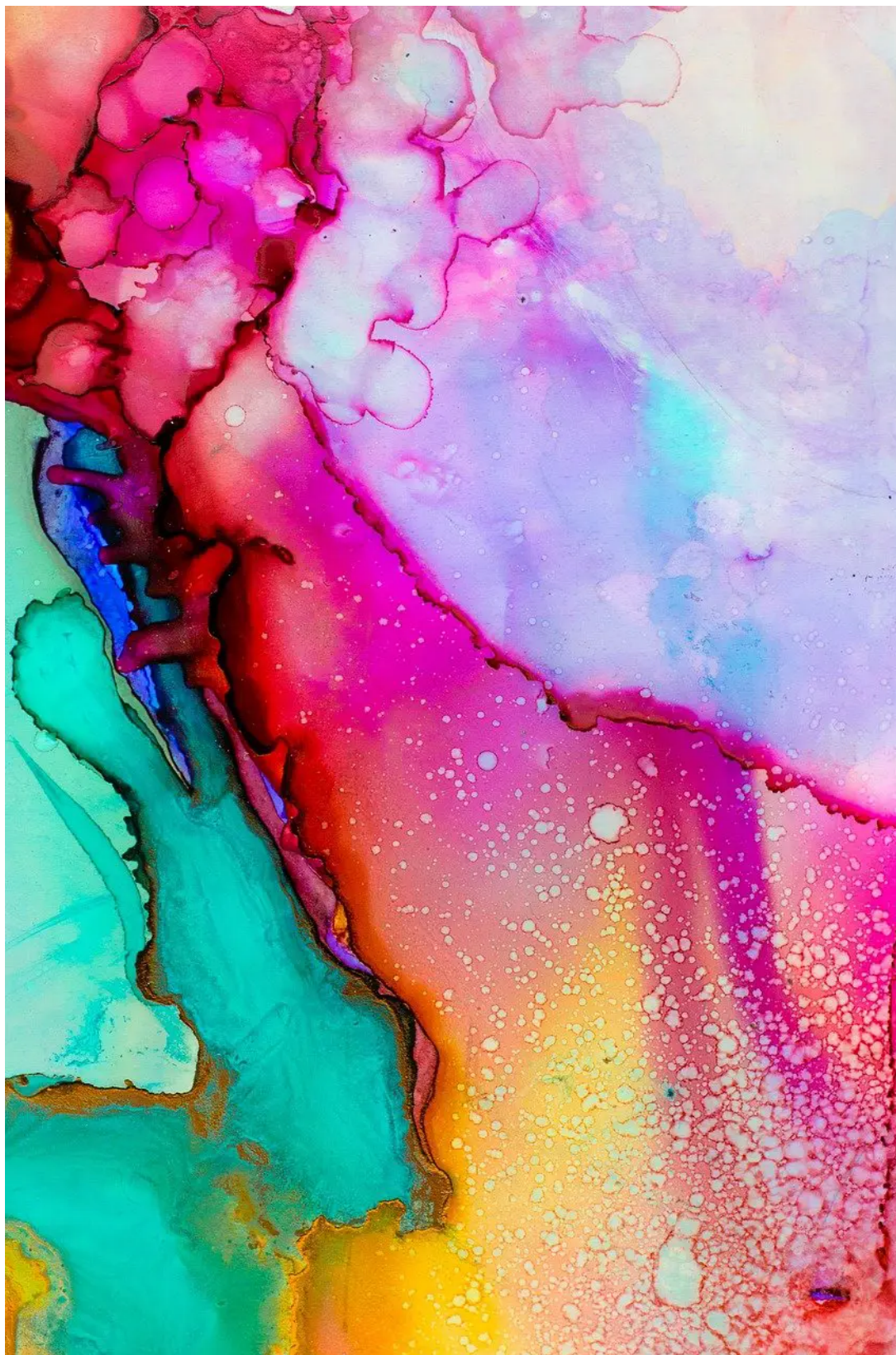

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “painted” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

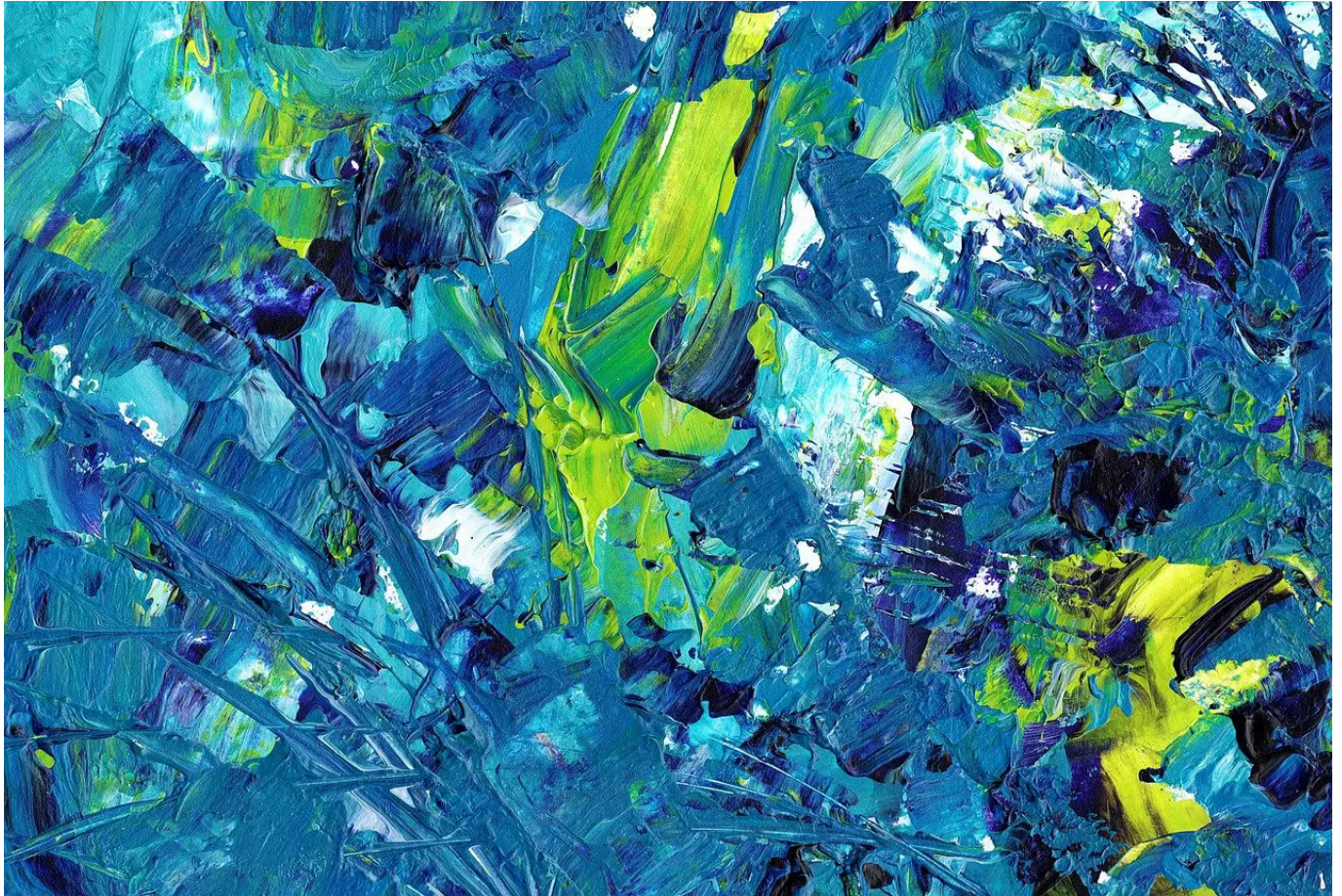
- *Covered or decorated with paint.*

- *Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.*
- *Having makeup applied.*
- *Lacking substance or vitality as if produced by painting.*

<b>motley</b>	Incongruously varied in appearance or character; disparate. <i>A <b>motley</b> crew of discontents and zealots.</i>

<b>multi-colored</b>	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.
<b>multi-colour</b>	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.

<b>multicolor</b>	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly.

<b>particoloured</b>	Having or consisting of two or more different colours. <i><b>Particoloured</b> Devon cattle.</i>
<b>piebald</b>	(of a horse) having irregular patches of two colours, typically black and white. <i>A <b>piebald</b> horse.</i>
<b>pied</b>	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly. <i><b>Pied</b> daisies.</i>
<b>varicolored</b>	Having a variety of colors.
<b>varicoloured</b>	Consisting of several different colours. <i>The <b>varicoloured</b> light from the lanterns.</i>

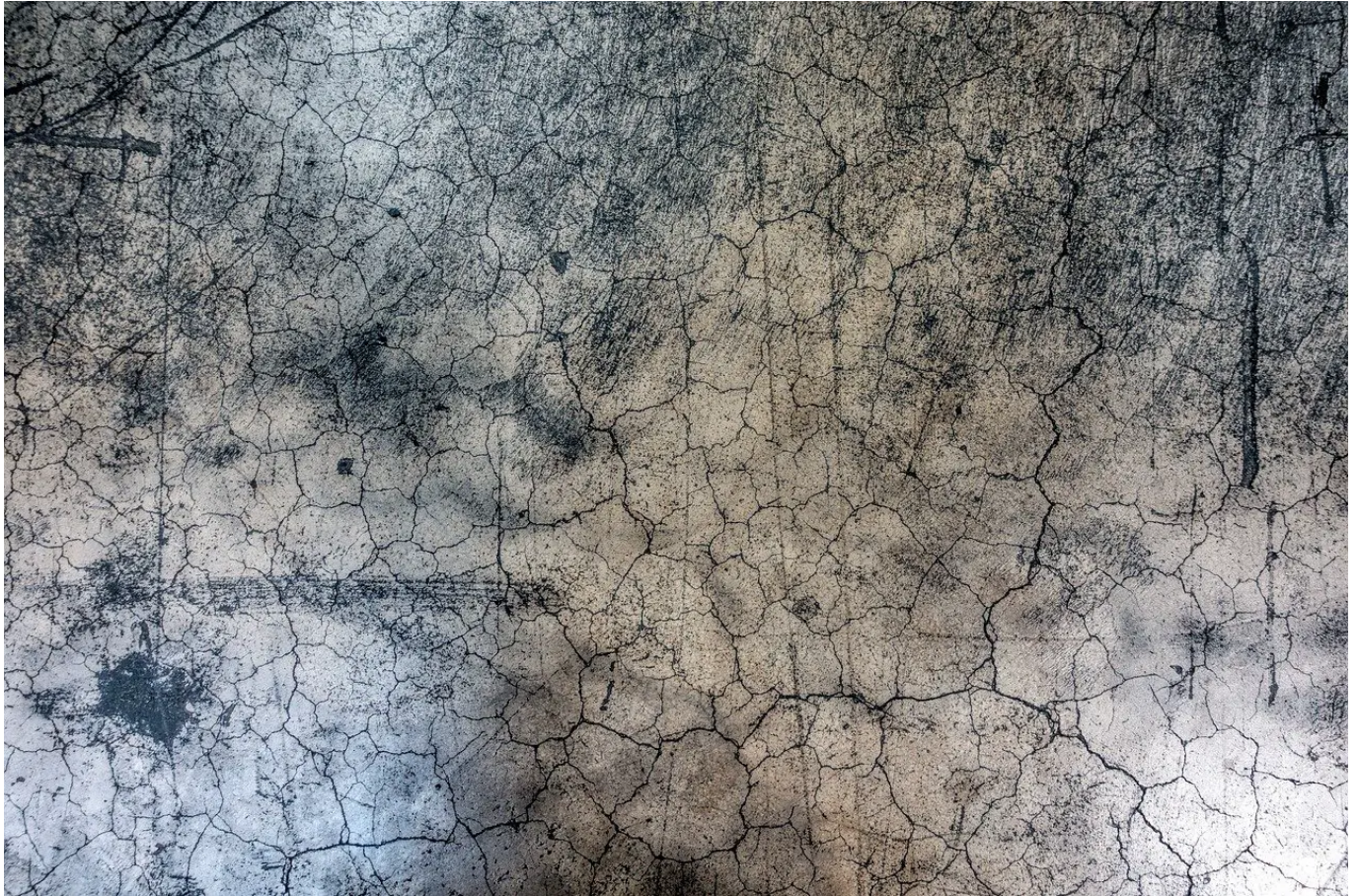




## Usage Examples of "Painted" as an adjective

<b>blob</b>	Put small drops of thick liquid or spots of colour on. <i>A big pink <b>blob</b> of a face was at the window.</i>
<b>blue</b>	Blue clothing. <i>Ashley went <b>blue</b> and I panicked.</i>
<b>brownish</b>	Of a color similar to that of wood or earth. <i>Where I live the soil is <b>brownish</b> red.</i>
<b>color</b>	Add color to. <i>Fall <b>colored</b> the trees.</i>
<b>colored</b>	Artificially produced; not natural. <i>Amber <b>colored</b> heads of grain.</i>
<u><b>colorful</b></u>	Having much or varied color. <i>A <b>colorful</b> character.</i>

<b>dye</b>	Take colour well or badly during the dyeing process. <i>A black <b>dye</b>.</i>
<b>hue</b>	A colour or shade. <i>In highlights it <b>hued</b> to a dull silver grey.</i>
<b>iridescent</b>	Showing luminous colours that seem to change when seen from different angles. <i>A dragonfly hovered vibrating and <b>iridescent</b>.</i>
<b>magenta</b>	A primary subtractive color for light a dark purple red color the dye for magenta was discovered in 1859 the year of the battle of Magenta. <i>A short <b>magenta</b> dress.</i>
<b>monochromatic</b>	Containing or using only one colour. <i><b>Monochromatic</b> light.</i>
<b>monochrome</b>	Having or appearing to have only one color.
<b>motley</b>	Make motley color with different colors. <i>A <b>motley</b> crew of discontents and zealots.</i>
<b>mottled</b>	Having spots or patches of color. <i>A bird with <b>mottled</b> brown plumage.</i>
<b>piebald</b>	A piebald horse. <i>A <b>piebald</b> horse.</i>
<b>pied</b>	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly. <i><b>Pied</b> daisies.</i>
<b>pigmentation</b>	Abnormal colouring of a person's skin, typically resulting from disease.
<b>polychrome</b>	Color with many colors make polychrome. <i>A precious <b>polychrome</b> ikon.</i>
<b>purple</b>	In ancient Rome or Byzantium clothing made from fabric dyed with Tyrian purple. <i>A faded <b>purple</b> T shirt.</i>
<b>red</b>	Of a person s eyes bloodshot or having pink rims especially with tiredness or crying. <i>A <b>red</b> Xhosa wife spends several years in her mother in law s homestead.</i>
<b>roan</b>	A roan animal. <i>A <b>roan</b> horse.</i>
<b>spot</b>	Mark or become marked with spots. <i>A <b>spot</b> of bother flared up.</i>
<b>spotted</b>	Marked or decorated with spots. <i>A red <b>spotted</b> handkerchief.</i>



<b>stain</b>	Produce or leave stains. <i>Wood can always be <b>stained</b> to a darker shade.</i>
<b>stained</b>	(of a material or object) coloured by application of a penetrative dye or chemical. <i>A dark brown <b>stained</b> wood.</i>
<b>tint</b>	Dye someone's hair with a tint. <i>The sky was taking on an apricot <b>tint</b>.</i>
<b>variegate</b>	Change the appearance of, especially by marking with different colors. <i>The designer can <b>variegate</b> the object's colour and physical character as needed.</i>
<b>variegated</b>	Exhibiting different colours, especially as irregular patches or streaks. <i>The <b>variegated</b> form of philadelphus.</i>
<b>variegation</b>	Variability in coloration.
<b>weal</b>	Mark with a weal. <i>His neck was <b>wealed</b> and raw.</i>
