likeness

Similarity in appearance or character or nature between persons or things.

picture

A situation treated as an observable object.

He had no clear **picture** of himself or his world.

portrayal

A representation by picture or portraiture.

A realistic **portrayal** of war.

representation

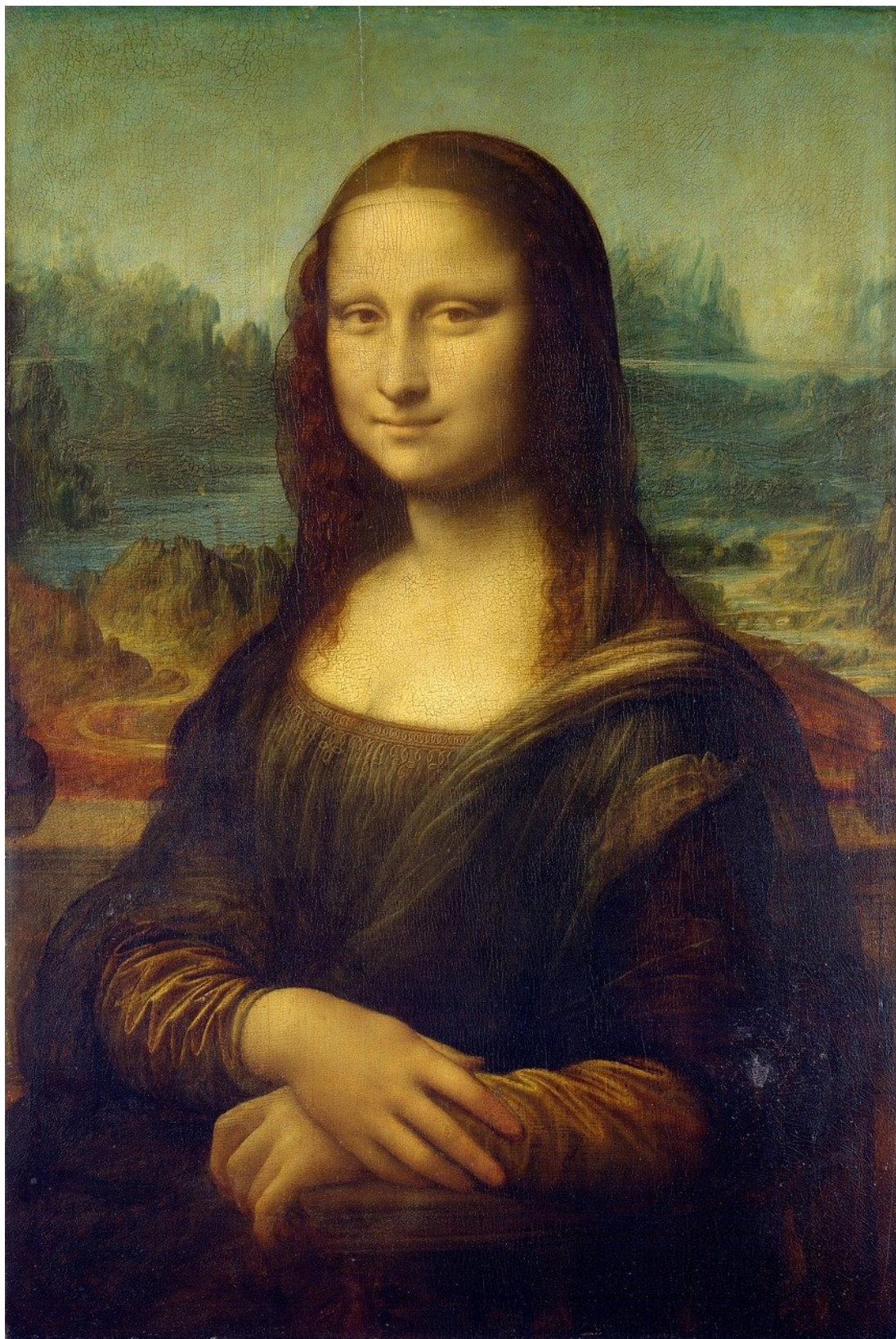
Formal statements made to an authority, especially so as to communicate an opinion or register a protest.

sketch

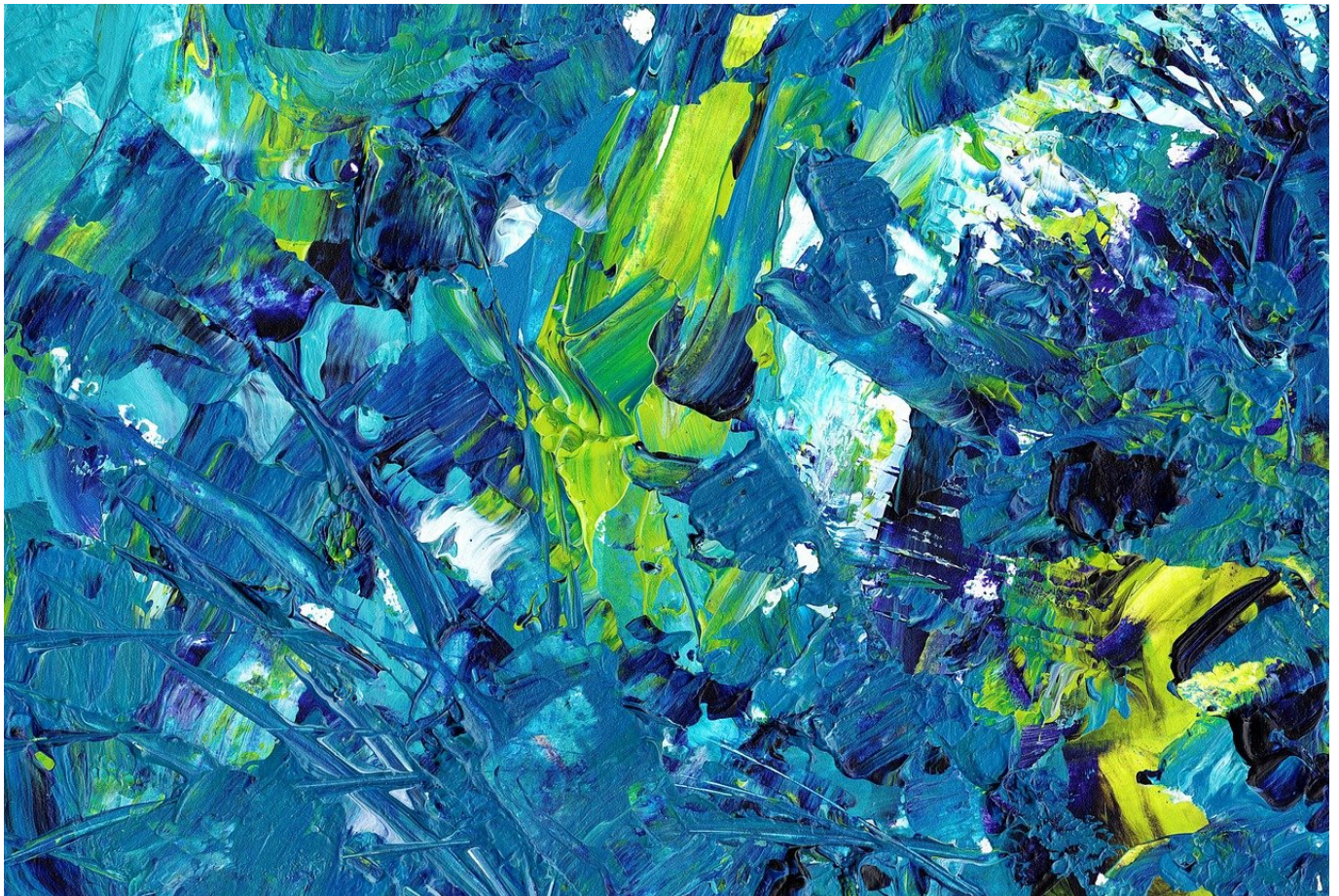
A brief written or spoken account or description, giving only basic details.

You can see how the first movement evolved from the composer s **sketches**.

| illustrator | A person who draws or creates pictures for magazines, books, advertising, etc. |
| masterpiece | The most outstanding work of a creative artist or craftsman. <i>A great literary masterpiece.</i> |
| mosaic | Decorate with a mosaic. <i>The walls and vaults are decorated by marble and mosaic.</i> |
| mural | Relating to or occurring in the wall of a body cavity or blood vessel. <i>Huge murals depicting Norse legends.</i> |
| paint | Make a painting. <i>He painted all day in the garden.</i> |
| photography | The occupation of taking and printing photographs or making movies. |
| picture | Show in or as in a picture. <i>They showed us the pictures of their wedding.</i> |

| pigment | Color or dye with a pigment. <i>Artists use paint and pigment interchangeably.</i> |

| scrawl | An example of hurried, careless writing. <i>Charlie scrawled his signature.</i> |
| subculture | A cultural group within a larger culture, often having beliefs or interests at variance with those of the larger culture. <i>In what ways does the social environment predispose certain individuals to join delinquent subcultures.</i> |
| <u>tasteful</u> | Free from what is tawdry or unbecoming. <i>A tasteful lounge bar.</i> |
| triptych | A picture or relief carving on three panels, typically hinged together vertically and used as an altarpiece. <i>A triptych depicting the Crucifixion.</i> |
| vandalism | Action involving deliberate destruction of or damage to public or private property. <i>An act of mindless vandalism.</i> |
