- *Occurring in pairs or as a pair.*
- *Mated sexually.*



## Synonyms of "Paired" as an adjective (26 Words)

<b>alike</b>	(of two or more people or things) similar to each other. <i>Friends are generally <b>alike</b> in background and taste.</i>
<b>all of a piece</b>	Quantifier; used with either mass or count nouns to indicate the whole number or amount of or every one of a class.
<b>analogous</b>	Comparable in certain respects, typically in a way which makes clearer the nature of the things compared. <i>They saw the relationship between a ruler and his subjects as <b>analogous</b> to that of father and children.</i>
<b>comparable</b>	Able to be likened to another; similar. <i>The situation in Holland is <b>comparable</b> to that in England.</i>
<b>complementary</b>	Relating to complementary medicine. <i>A pair of <b>complementary</b> oligonucleotides were synthesized.</i>
<b>concordant</b>	Being of the same opinion. <i>The answers were roughly <b>concordant</b>.</i>
<b>congruent</b>	Corresponding in character or kind. <i>Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely <b>congruent</b>.</i>
<b>consonant</b>	Denoting or relating to a consonant. <i>A <b>consonant</b> phoneme.</i>

<b>coordinating</b>	Serving to connect two grammatical constituents of identical construction. <i>And in John and Mary or in John walked and Mary rode is a <b>coordinating</b> conjunction and so is or in will you go or stay.</i>
<b>correlative</b>	Having a mutual relationship; corresponding. <b>Correlative</b> conjunctions.
<b>corresponding</b>	Analogous or equivalent in character, form, or function; comparable. <i>All rights carry with them <b>corresponding</b> responsibilities.</i>
<b>coupled</b>	(of two electrical components) connected through electromagnetic induction, electrostatic charge, or an optical link. <i>A locomotive with six <b>coupled</b> wheels.</i>
<b>double</b>	Designed to be used by two people. <i>Duple or <b>double</b> time consists of two or a multiple of two beats to a measure.</i>
<b><u>duplicate</u></b>	Having two corresponding or identical parts. <i>A <b>duplicate</b> key.</i>
<b>equivalent</b>	Having the same or a similar effect as. <i>A wish that was <b>equivalent</b> to a command.</i>
<b>harmonious</b>	Suitable and fitting. <i>The decor is a <b>harmonious</b> blend of traditional and modern.</i>
<b><u>identical</u></b>	(of twins) derived from a single egg or ovum. <i>Four girls in <b>identical</b> green outfits.</i>
<b>like</b>	(of a portrait or other image) having a faithful resemblance to the original. <i>Members of the cat family have <b>like</b> dispositions.</i>
<b>like peas in a pod</b>	Equal in amount or value.
<b>like two peas in a pod</b>	Conforming in every respect.
<b>mated</b>	Mated sexually.
<b>opposite</b>	Of leaves or shoots arising in pairs at the same level on opposite sides of the stem. <i>A crowd gathered on the <b>opposite</b> side of the street.</i>
<b><u>parallel</u></b>	(of lines, planes, or surfaces) side by side and having the same distance continuously between them. <i>The road runs <b>parallel</b> to the Ottawa River.</i>
<b>similar</b>	Resembling or similar having the same or some of the same characteristics often used in combination. <i>Problems <b>similar</b> to mine.</i>

- acquaintance** Acquaintances considered collectively.  
*I have trouble remembering the names of all my **acquaintances**.*
- affinity** State of relationship between organisms or groups of organisms resulting in resemblance in structure or structural parts.  
*A semantic **affinity** between two words.*
- buddy** A working companion with whom close cooperation is required.  
*I decided to **buddy** up to them.*
- coordinated** Operating as a unit.  
*She was usually good with her hands and well **coordinated**.*
- couple** Link or combine (something) with something else.  
*He hoped she d be better in a **couple** of days.*
- couplet** A pair of successive lines of verse, typically rhyming and of the same length.

<b>cousin</b>	A child of one's uncle or aunt. <i>The new motorbikes are not proving as popular as their four wheel <b>cousins</b>.</i>
<b>crony</b>	A close friend or companion. <i>He went gambling with his cronies.</i>
<b>doggerel</b>	Comic verse composed in irregular rhythm. <i>He had heard some silly <b>doggerel</b> that kept running through his mind.</i>
<b>duet</b>	Perform a duet. <i>Performing <b>duets</b> with famous foreign artists.</i>
<b>duo</b>	A duet. <i>Two <b>duos</b> for violin and viola.</i>
<b>equal</b>	Make equal uniform corresponding or matching. <i>His work is concerned with why private property <b>equals</b> exploitation.</i>
<b>husband</b>	Use cautiously and frugally. <i>She and her <b>husband</b> are both retired.</i>
<b>lovable</b>	Inspiring or deserving love or affection. <i>He has a <b>lovable</b> sweet personality.</i>
<b>lovingly</b>	With love or great care. <i>They smile <b>lovingly</b> at each other.</i>
<b>match</b>	Make equal uniform corresponding or matching. <i>He tried to <b>match</b> her nonchalance.</i>
<b>matching</b>	Corresponding in pattern, colour, or design; complementary. <i>A blue jacket and <b>matching</b> skirt.</i>
<b>mate</b>	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>He couldn't satisfy his frisky young <b>mate</b>.</i>
<b>neighbour</b>	(of a place or object) be situated next to or very near (another). <i>I chatted with my <b>neighbour</b> on the flight to New York.</i>
<b>newlywed</b>	Someone recently married.
<b>pal</b>	Become friends; act friendly towards. <i>We got acquainted but we never really <b>palled</b> around.</i>
<b>partner</b>	Be the partner of. <i>A <b>partner</b> in a prosperous legal practice.</i>
<b>peer</b>	A nobleman duke or marquis or earl or viscount or baron who is a member of the British peerage. <i>For yet a many of your horsemen <b>peer</b>.</i>

<b>pitch</b>	Hit the ball on to the green with a pitch shot. <i>The traders had already reserved their <b>pitches</b>.</i>
<b>prenuptial</b>	Existing or occurring before marriage. <b>Prenuptial</b> pregnancy.
<b>set</b>	Put or set seeds seedlings or plants into the ground. <i>A <b>set</b> of golf clubs.</i>
<b>similitude</b>	The quality or state of being similar to something. <i>Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply <b>similitude</b>.</i>
<b>together</b>	So as to be in agreement. <i>Taken <b>together</b> these measures would significantly improve people s chances of surviving a coach crash.</i>
<b>twin</b>	Grow as twins. <b>Twin</b> crystals.
<b>yoke</b>	Put a yoke on a pair of animals couple or attach with or to a yoke. <i>Pulled by a <b>yoke</b> of oxen.</i>
