- *(of food or drink) pleasant to taste.*

acceptable	Able to be tolerated or allowed. <i>Performances varied from acceptable to excellent.</i>
agreeable	In keeping. <i>Salaries agreeable with current trends.</i>
appetizing	Appealing to or stimulating the appetite especially in appearance or aroma. <i>The appetizing aroma of sizzling bacon.</i>
easy to take	In fortunate circumstances financially; moderately rich.
nice	Fastidious; scrupulous. <i>That s a nice way to come into my kitchen no greeting.</i>
pleasant	Giving a sense of happy satisfaction or enjoyment. <i>We had a pleasant evening together.</i>
pleasant-tasting	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste.

pleasing	Giving pleasure and satisfaction. <i>A pleasing aroma.</i>
<u>pleasurable</u>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>Pleasurable activities.</i>
<u>satisfactory</u>	Meeting requirements. <i>His grades were satisfactory.</i>
<u>tasty</u>	Involving or good at fighting. <i>A tasty deal at the building society.</i>
toothsome	(of a person) good-looking; attractive. <i>I thought he was toothsome.</i>

- *A device that made increased taxation more palatable.*

acidulous	Sharp-tasting; sour.
ambrosial	Extremely pleasing to the taste; sweet and fragrant. <i>Ambrosial food.</i>
appetizing	Stimulating one's appetite. <i>The appetizing aroma of sizzling bacon.</i>
comestible	Suitable for use as food. <i>Sugar coffee and sundry other comestible requisites.</i>
<u>delectable</u>	(of food or drink) delicious. <i>The delectable Ms Davis.</i>

delicious	Variety of sweet eating apples. <i>Delicious home baked brown bread.</i>
eatable	Suitable for use as food. <i>Eatable fruits.</i>
<u>edible</u>	Fit or suitable to be eaten. <i>The farm grows a variety of tropical plants yielding an amazing assortment of fruits and other edibles.</i>
<u>flavor</u>	Lend flavor to.
<u>flavorful</u>	Full of flavor.
flavour	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>The extracts give a flavour of the content and tone of the conversation.</i>
gastronomy	The practice or art of choosing, cooking, and eating good food. <i>Traditional American gastronomy.</i>
insipid	Lacking taste or flavor or tang. <i>An insipid personality.</i>
<u>luscious</u>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>The luscious brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.</i>
nip	A small sharp bite or snip. <i>The vegetable garden nipped now by frost.</i>
piquancy	The quality of being pleasantly stimulating or exciting; interest. <i>The tangy soy dip gave them a slightly Asian piquancy.</i>
repast	The food served and eaten at one time. <i>A sumptuous repast.</i>
<u>savor</u>	Taste appreciatively. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
<u>savory</u>	Dwarf aromatic shrub of Mediterranean regions. <i>A past that was scarcely savory.</i>
savour	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>The subtle savour of wood smoke.</i>
<u>sour</u>	Make sour or more sour. <i>She sampled the wine and found it was sour.</i>
<u>spicy</u>	Flavoured with or fragrant with spice. <i>Pasta in a spicy tomato sauce.</i>
tang	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>His words came out with a distinct tang of broad Lancashire.</i>
tangy	Tasting sour like a lemon. <i>A tangy salad.</i>

taste Have a distinctive or characteristic taste.
*It was his first **taste** of serious action.*

tasty Pleasing to the sense of taste.
*A **tasty** profit margin of 42.*

victual Provide with food or other stores.
*The ship wasn't even properly **victualled**.*

victuals Any substance that can be used as food.

zesty Having an agreeably pungent taste.
