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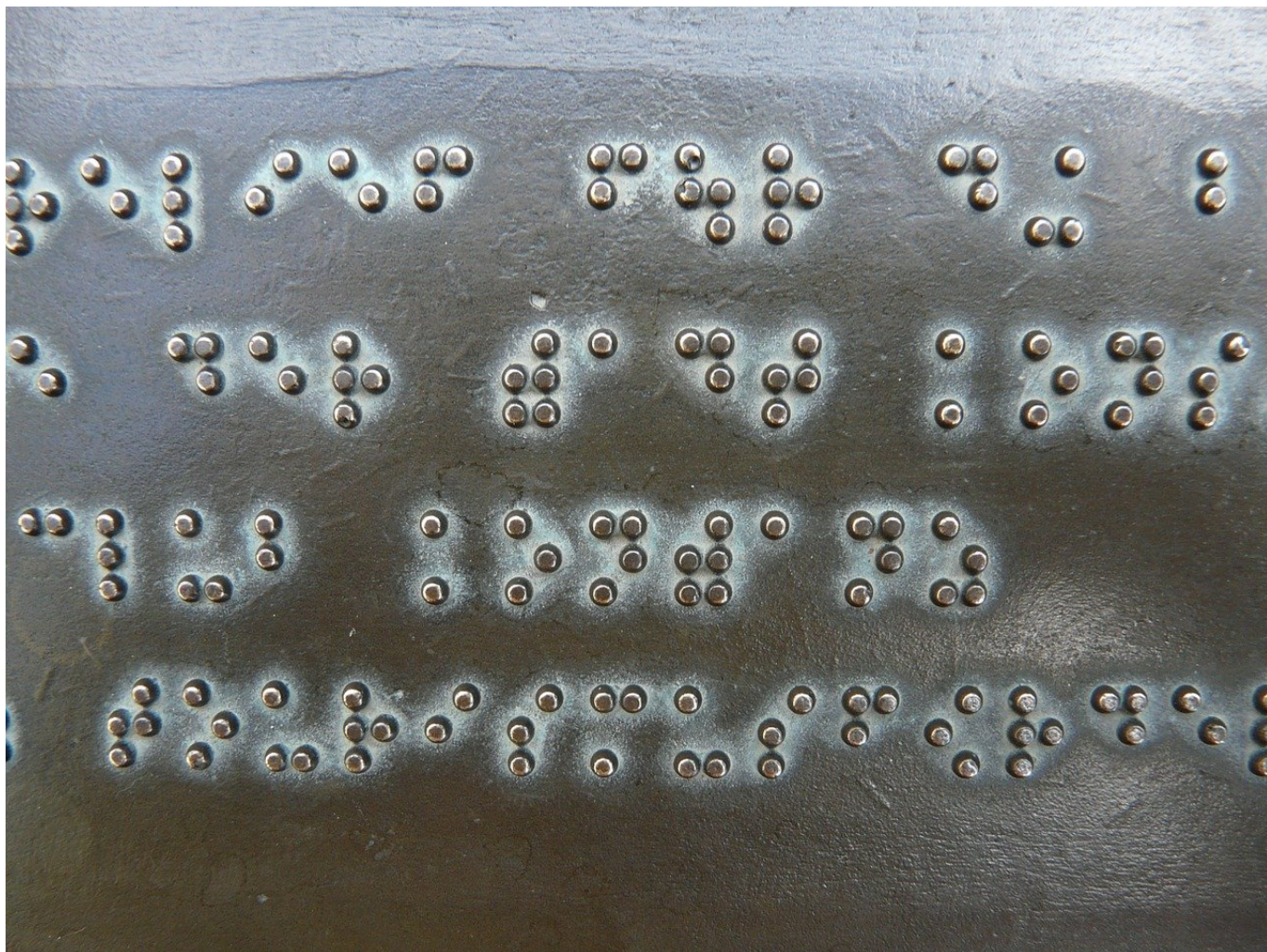

- *Can be felt by palpation.*
- *Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment.*
- *Capable of being perceived; especially capable of being handled or touched or felt.*
- *(of a feeling or atmosphere) so intense as to seem almost tangible.*
- *Plain to see or comprehend.*

### **appreciable**

Enough to be estimated or measured.

*The Nissan had two **bald** tyres.*

### concrete

Specific; definite.

***Concrete** objects like stones.*

### **detectable**

Able to be perceived or noticed; discernible.

*A **detectable** note of sarcasm.*

<b>discernible</b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>The newspaper reports no <b>discernible</b> progress in the negotiations.</i>
<b>evident</b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i><b>Evident</b> hostility.</i>
<b>incontestable</b>	Not open to question; obviously true.
<b>incontrovertible</b>	Necessarily or demonstrably true. <i><b>Incontrovertible</b> proof.</i>
<b>indisputable</b>	Unable to be challenged or denied. <i><b>Indisputable</b> evidence of a witness.</i>
<b>manifest</b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i><b>Manifest</b> disapproval.</i>
<b>material</b>	Having material or physical form or substance Benjamin Jowett. <i><b>Material</b> needs.</i>
<b>notable</b>	Widely known and esteemed. <i>The results with one <b>notable</b> exception have been superb.</i>
<b>noticeable</b>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>After a <b>noticeable</b> pause the lecturer continued.</i>
<b>observable</b>	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i><b>Observable</b> differences.</i>
<b>patent</b>	Made and marketed under a patent proprietary. <i><b>Patent</b> milk powder.</i>
<b>perceivable</b>	Capable of being perceived especially by sight or hearing. <i><b>Perceivable</b> through the mist.</i>
<b>perceptible</b>	(especially of a slight movement or change of state) able to be seen or noticed. <i>He continued after a <b>perceptible</b> pause.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Having no pretensions; not remarkable or special. <i>It is <b>plain</b> that he is no reactionary.</i>
<b>real</b>	Coinciding with reality F A Olafson. <i><b>Real</b> people not ghosts.</i>
<b>recognizable</b>	Easily perceived; easy to become aware of. <i>His car was instantly <b>recognizable</b>.</i>
<b>self-evident</b>	Evident without proof or argument.
<b>simple</b>	Unornamented. <i>A <b>simple</b> solution.</i>
<b>solid</b>	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>The defence is <b>solid</b>.</i>

<u><b>stark</b></u>	Devoid of any qualifications or disguise or adornment. <i><b>Stark</b> poverty.</i>
<u><b>substantial</b></u>	Having substance or capable of being treated as fact; not imaginary. <i>A <b>substantial</b> Devon family.</i>
<u><b>tangible</b></u>	Capable of being treated as fact. <i><b>Tangible</b> evidence.</i>
<b>touchable</b>	Perceptible by the senses especially the sense of touch.
<u><b>transparent</b></u>	Transmitting heat or other radiation without distortion. <i>If you had <b>transparent</b> government procurement corruption would go away.</i>
<b>unadorned</b>	Not decorated with something to increase its beauty or distinction. <i>It was very simple its walls <b>unadorned</b>.</i>
<u><b>undeniable</b></u>	Unable to be denied or disputed. <i>It is an <b>undeniable</b> fact that some dogs are easier to train than others.</i>
<b>undisguised</b>	Plain to see. <i>She looked at him with <b>undisguised</b> contempt.</i>
<b>unexaggerated</b>	Not exaggerated, overblown, or unrealistic. <i>A true <b>unexaggerated</b> statement.</i>
<u><b>unmistakable</b></u>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>His opposition to slavery was <b>unmistakable</b>.</i>
<b>unqualified</b>	Not limited or restricted. <i>An <b>unqualified</b> denial.</i>
<b>unvarnished</b>	(of a statement or manner) plain and straightforward. <i>The <b>unvarnished</b> candor of old people and children.</i>
<b>unveiled</b>	Revealed; especially by having a veil removed. <i>Applauding the <b>unveiled</b> statue of Winston Churchill.</i>
<u><b>visible</b></u>	Obvious to the eye. <i>Mountains <b>visible</b> in the distance.</i>

<b><u>evident</u></b>	Clearly seen or understood; obvious. <i><b>Evident</b> hostility.</i>
<b>identifiable</b>	Able to be recognized; distinguishable. <i>There are no easily <b>identifiable</b> features on the shoreline.</i>
<b>intelligible</b>	Capable of being apprehended or understood. <i>Use vocabulary that is <b>intelligible</b> to your audience.</i>
<b>judicious</b>	Having, showing, or done with good judgement or sense. <i><b>Judicious</b> use of one s money.</i>
<b><u>manifest</u></b>	Record in a ship s manifest. <i>The buildings in Rome <b>manifest</b> a high level of architectural sophistication.</i>
<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A scar <b>marked</b> face.</i>
<b><u>noticeable</u></b>	Undesirably noticeable. <i><b>Noticeable</b> for its vivid historical background.</i>
<b>observable</b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i><b>Observable</b> differences.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i><b>Obvious</b> errors.</i>
<b>palpability</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.

<b>perceptible</b>	Easily seen or detected. <i>A <b>perceptible</b> sense of expectation in the court.</i>
<b><u>preeminent</u></b>	Greatest in importance or degree or significance or achievement. <i>A <b>preeminent</b> archeologist.</i>
<b>pronounced</b>	Strongly marked; easily noticeable. <i>A <b>pronounced</b> flavor of cinnamon.</i>
<b><u>recognizable</u></b>	Easily perceived; easy to become aware of. <i>This situation produces <b>recognizable</b> stress symptoms.</i>
<b>sensible</b>	Aware intuitively or intellectually of something sensed. <i>Even amoeba are <b>sensible</b> creatures.</i>
<b>tactful</b>	Having or showing a sense of what is fitting and considerate in dealing with others. <i>They need a <b>tactful</b> word of advice.</i>
<b>tangibility</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<b><u>tangible</u></b>	(of especially business assets) having physical substance and intrinsic monetary value. <i><b>Tangible</b> property like real estate.</i>
<b><u>verifiable</u></b>	Able to be checked or demonstrated to be true, accurate, or justified. <i>An easily <b>verifiable</b> claim.</i>
<b><u>visible</u></b>	Visible imports or exports. <i><b>Visible</b> resources.</i>
<b>visibly</b>	In a way that can be perceived or noticed easily; clearly. <i>He was <b>visibly</b> irritated at the way he had been undermined.</i>
