- bloomers** Underpants worn by women.
*She was afraid that her **bloomers** might have been showing.*
- boxer shorts** Underpants worn by men.
- boxers** Underpants worn by men.
- briefs** Short, close-fitting underpants or knickers.
*A pair of blue **briefs**.*
- defective** A person with mental disabilities.
- drawers** An artist skilled at drawing.
- imperfect** The imperfect tense.
- inferior** An inferior letter figure or symbol.
*Her social and intellectual **inferiors**.*

knickers	Trousers ending above the knee. <i>Oh knickers to the lot of them.</i>
poor	People without possessions or wealth (considered as a group). <i>The urban poor need assistance.</i>
shoddy	An inferior quality yarn or fabric made from the shredded fibre of waste woollen cloth or clippings. <i>The production of shoddy and mattress stuffing.</i>
slacks	The quality of being loose (not taut).
trousers	An outer garment covering the body from the waist to the ankles, with a separate part for each leg. <i>He had a sharp crease in his trousers.</i>
underpants	An undergarment, especially for men or boys, covering the lower part of the torso and having two holes for the legs.



Usage Examples of "Pants" as a noun

- *He thought we were going to be absolute pants.*

- *Wide pant legs.*
- *Corduroy pants.*



Associations of "Pants" (30 Words)

blouse	A loose linen or cotton garment formerly worn by peasants and manual workers, typically belted at the waist. <i>I bloused my trousers over my boots.</i>
bodice	The close-fitting upper part of a dress, covering the chest and back above the waist.
cape	In bullfighting taunt the bull by flourishing a cape. <i>The robe was decorated with gold lace on the fronts cape and hem.</i>
chiffon	(of a cake or dessert) made with beaten egg to give a light consistency. <i>Chiffon cake.</i>
corset	Dress with a corset.

<u>dress</u>	Put a dressing on. <i>He dressed up in a suit and tie.</i>
garment	An item of clothing. <i>A windproof outer garment.</i>
gown	Dress in a gown. <i>She was gowned in luminous silk.</i>
<u>hat</u>	Headdress that protects the head from bad weather has shaped crown and usually a brim. <i>He was unsuitably hatted.</i>
headdress	An ornamental covering or band for the head, especially one worn on ceremonial occasions. <i>A veil held in place with a pearl headdress.</i>
hoop	Bind or encircle with or as with hoops. <i>A woman in hoops and crinoline.</i>
hosiery	Stockings, socks, and tights collectively.
jacket	A jacket potato. <i>He put his hand in his jacket pocket.</i>
jean	Heavy twilled cotton cloth, especially denim. <i>A jean jacket.</i>
loincloth	A single piece of cloth wrapped round the hips, typically worn by men in some hot countries as their only garment.
pleat	Pleat or gather into a ruffle. <i>She was absently pleating her skirt between her fingers.</i>
<u>robe</u>	A dressing gown or bathrobe. <i>I went into the vestry and robed for the Mass.</i>
<u>scarf</u>	Wrap in or adorn with a scarf. <i>A silk scarf.</i>
<u>shirt</u>	Put a shirt on. <i>Smith increased his chances of a Great Britain shirt with a penalty shot save.</i>
shorts	Men's underpants. <i>Cycling shorts.</i>
skirt	A cut of meat from the lower flank. <i>The river valley skirts along the northern slopes of the hills.</i>
sleeve	A protective paper or cardboard cover for a record, CD, or DVD. <i>A shirt with the sleeves rolled up.</i>

sweater	A person who perspires. <i>A close knit wool sweater for icy weather.</i>
sweatshirt	A loose, warm sweater, typically made of cotton, worn when exercising or as leisurewear.
swimsuit	A woman's one-piece swimming costume.
undergarment	An article of underclothing.
undershirt	A collarless men's undergarment for the upper part of the body.
underwear	Undergarment worn next to the skin and under the outer garments.
vest	Of a chorister or member of the clergy put on vestments. <i>A bulletproof vest.</i>
wear	The wearing of something or the state of being worn as clothing. <i>Wear one's hair in a certain way.</i>
