abraham's bosom	A close affectionate and protective acceptance.
<u>bliss</u>	A state of extreme happiness. The <b>bliss</b> of heaven.
delight	A feeling of extreme pleasure or satisfaction. The new car is a <b>delight</b> .
<u>ecstasy</u>	An amphetamine-based recreational drug having euphoric effects, typically taken in the form of a pill and particularly associated with clubbing and dance music subcultures. <i>There was a look of <b>ecstasy</b> on his face.</i>

happiness	State of well-being characterized by emotions ranging from contentment to intense joy. <i>Tom s heart swelled with happiness.</i>
heaven	A place regarded in various religions as the abode of God (or the gods) and the angels, and of the good after death, often traditionally depicted as being above the sky. Those who practised good deeds would receive the reward of a place in <b>heaven</b> .
heaven on earth	The abode of God and the angels.
idyll	An episode of such pastoral or romantic charm as to qualify as the subject of a poetic idyll. The rural <b>idyll</b> remains strongly evocative in most industrialized societies.
joy	A thing that causes joy. <i>Tears of <b>joy</b></i> .
nirvana	An ideal or idyllic state or place. The days of socialist <b>nirvana</b> in Europe are over.
promised land	Grounds for feeling hopeful about the future.
rapture	Expressions of intense pleasure or enthusiasm about something. The tabloids went into <b>rapture</b> s about her.
seventh heaven	Position seven in a countable series of things.
shangri-la	Any place of complete bliss and delight and peace.
the abode of god	Any address at which you dwell more than temporarily.
the abode of the saints	Any address at which you dwell more than temporarily.
the city of god	People living in a large densely populated municipality.
the garden of eden	A yard or lawn adjoining a house.
the kingdom of heaven	A domain in which something is dominant.
the promised land	Grounds for feeling hopeful about the future.
<u>utopia</u>	A work of fiction describing a utopia. Misplaced faith in political <b>utopia</b> s has led to ruin.
zion	An imaginary place considered to be perfect or ideal.

<u>angelic</u>	Relating to angels. The <b>angelic</b> hosts.
ascension	The ascent of Christ into heaven on the fortieth day after the Resurrection. <i>His ascension to the presidency.</i>
<u>celestial</u>	Belonging or relating to heaven. <b>Celestial</b> map.
<u>christian</u>	A religious person who believes Jesus is the Christ and who is a member of a Christian denomination.
disbelieve	Have no religious faith. To <b>disbelieve</b> is as much an act of faith as belief.
<u>divine</u>	Resulting from divine providence. Paintings of shipwrecks being prevented by <b>divine</b> intervention.
<u>dreamer</u>	Someone who is dreaming. A rebellious young <b>dreamer</b> .
elysian	Relating to the Elysian Fields. An <b>elysian</b> meal.



<u>ethereal</u>	Of or containing or dissolved in ether. <i>Ethereal</i> melodies.
firmament	The heavens or sky. Thunder shakes the <b>firmament</b> .
heaven	A state of being eternally in the presence of God after death. Lying by the pool with a good book is my idea of <b>heaven</b> .
<u>heavenly</u>	Of the heavens or sky. <i>Heavenly</i> constellations.
idealistic	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style. <i>Idealistic</i> young doctors who went to work for the rebels.
immortality	The quality or state of being immortal. Occasionally a guide book has achieved <b>immortality</b> .
nirvana	The beatitude that transcends the cycle of reincarnation; characterized by the extinction of desire and suffering and individual consciousness. <i>The days of socialist</i> <b>nirvana</b> <i>in Europe are over.</i>
omnipotent	Having great power and influence. God is described as <b>omnipotent</b> and benevolent.
omniscience	The state of knowing everything. <i>His reputation for near <b>omniscience</b> and infallibility.</i>
orison	A prayer.
resurrection	The revitalization or revival of something. The story of the <b>resurrection</b> of Osiris.
resuscitated	Restored to life or consciousness.
sacred	(of writing or text) embodying the laws or doctrines of a religion. <i>Cows are <b>sacred</b> and the eating of beef is taboo.</i>
saintly	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. A <b>saintly</b> concern for his fellow men.
soul	The immaterial part of a person; the actuating cause of an individual life. <i>Brevity is the</i> <b>soul</b> of wit.
<u>sublime</u>	Cause a substance to sublime. Mozart s <b>sublime</b> piano concertos.
supernal	Of exceptional quality or extent. <i>He is the <b>supernal</b> poet of our age.</i>
<u>utopia</u>	A work of fiction describing a utopia. Misplaced faith in political <b>utopia</b> s has led to ruin.
welkin	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected.
