matchless	Eminent beyond or above comparison. <i>The Parthenon has a matchless beauty.</i>
most important	Quantifier meaning the greatest in number.
of greatest importance	Very good.
of prime importance	First in rank or degree.

of supreme importance	Greatest or maximal in degree; extreme.
overriding	Having superior power and influence. <i>Oceanic lithosphere beneath an overriding continental plate.</i>
peerless	Unequaled; unrivalled. <i>A peerless scholar.</i>
predominant	Having or exerting control or power. <i>The predominant colour was white.</i>
predominate	Having superior power and influence.
preponderant	Having superior power and influence. <i>The preponderant influence of the US within the alliance.</i>
preponderating	Having superior power and influence.
unbeaten	Not conquered. <i>They were the only side to remain unbeaten.</i>
unequaled	Superior to all others in performance or extent. <i>A range of facilities unequaled in London.</i>
unexcelled	Not capable of being improved on. <i>His unexcelled capacity for hard work.</i>
<u>unmatched</u>	Of the remaining member of a pair. <i>Infamy unmatched in the Western world.</i>
<u>unparalleled</u>	Having no parallel or equal; exceptional. <i>Unparalleled athletic ability.</i>
<u>unsurpassed</u>	Not capable of being improved on. <i>The quality of workmanship is unsurpassed.</i>
without equal	Having the requisite qualities or resources to meet a task.
without parallel	Being everywhere equidistant and not intersecting.

<u>basic</u>	A popular programming language that is relatively easy to learn; an acronym for beginner's all-purpose symbolic instruction code; no longer in general use. <i>If your date orders vegetable tempura you know she is totally basic.</i>
best	The supreme effort one can make. <i>It s best if we both go.</i>
chief	Having or denoting the highest rank. <i>The chief of police.</i>
<u>commanding</u>	(in military contexts) having a position of authority. <i>A commanding officer.</i>
<u>directive</u>	An official or authoritative instruction. <i>A new EC directive.</i>
dominant	A dominant trait or gene. <i>The mutant allele is dominant to the wild type.</i>
<u>forefront</u>	The leading or most important position or place. <i>The issue has moved to the forefront of the political agenda.</i>
<u>foremost</u>	Before anything else in rank, importance, or position; in the first place. <i>It was foremost the first unequivocal demonstration of the process.</i>
<u>guiding</u>	Showing the way by conducting or leading; imposing direction on. <i>A guiding principle.</i>
headmaster	Presiding officer of a school.
interlinear	(of a book) having the same text in different languages printed on alternate lines. <i>A Greek English interlinear New Testament.</i>
leading	Having the leading position or higher score in a contest. <i>The country s leading poet.</i>
<u>main</u>	Most important element. <i>By main strength.</i>
major	Of a key based on a major scale tending to produce a bright or joyful effect. <i>The majors have swept up the smaller independent companies in licensing deals.</i>
<u>optimum</u>	The most favourable situation or level for growth, reproduction, or success. <i>The plant grows within a range of 68 and 78 F the optimum being 74.</i>
<u>overlord</u>	A person of great power or authority. <i>The Jews rebelled against their Roman overlords.</i>

predominant	Most frequent or common. <i>The predominant political forces.</i>
premier	(in Australia and Canada) the chief minister of a government of a state or province. <i>He holds the premier barony in the UK created in 1269.</i>
preponderant	Having superior power and influence. <i>The preponderant influence of the US within the alliance.</i>
prevailing	Existing at a particular time; current. <i>The prevailing mood within Whitehall circles.</i>
prima	Used primarily as eating apples. <i>Prima donna.</i>
<u>primal</u>	Relating to or denoting the needs, fears, or behaviour that are postulated (especially in Freudian theory) to form the origins of emotional life. <i>Primal hunting societies.</i>
<u>primarily</u>	For the most part. <i>This is primarily a question of economics.</i>
<u>primary</u>	A primary colour. <i>A primary teacher.</i>
prime	Cover with a primer apply a primer to. <i>Diogenes conclusion that air is the prime matter.</i>
principal	An actor who plays a principal role. <i>Principals in general practice are self employed and controlled by their practice agreements.</i>
producer	A person, company, or country that makes, grows, or supplies goods or commodities for sale. <i>He remains a prolific producer of poems and short stories.</i>
<u>staple</u>	Secure or fasten with a staple or staples. <i>Staple the papers together.</i>
superior	Of high or superior quality or performance. <i>Obeying their superiors orders.</i>
supreme	A dish served in a supreme sauce. <i>He was nerving himself for a supreme effort.</i>
