<b>unequaled</b>	Superior to all others in performance or extent. <i>A range of facilities <b>unequaled</b> in London.</i>
<b>unexcelled</b>	Not capable of being improved on. <i>His <b>unexcelled</b> capacity for hard work.</i>
<b><u>unmatched</u></b>	Of the remaining member of a pair. <i>Infamy <b>unmatched</b> in the Western world.</i>
<b><u>unparalleled</u></b>	Having no parallel or equal; exceptional. <i><b>Unparalleled</b> athletic ability.</i>
<b><u>unsurpassed</u></b>	Not capable of being improved on. <i>The quality of workmanship is <b>unsurpassed</b>.</i>
<b>without equal</b>	Having the requisite qualities or resources to meet a task.

<b>headmaster</b>	Presiding officer of a school.
<b>interlinear</b>	(of a book) having the same text in different languages printed on alternate lines. <i>A Greek English <b>interlinear</b> New Testament.</i>
<b>leading</b>	Having the leading position or higher score in a contest. <i>The country s <b>leading</b> poet.</i>
<b>main</b>	Most important element. <i>By <b>main</b> strength.</i>
<b>major</b>	Of a key based on a major scale tending to produce a bright or joyful effect. <i>The <b>majors</b> have swept up the smaller independent companies in licensing deals.</i>
<b>optimum</b>	The most favourable situation or level for growth, reproduction, or success. <i>The plant grows within a range of 68 and 78 F the <b>optimum</b> being 74.</i>
<b>overlord</b>	A person of great power or authority. <i>The Jews rebelled against their Roman <b>overlords</b>.</i>

<b>predominant</b>	Most frequent or common. <i>The <b>predominant</b> political forces.</i>
<b>premier</b>	(in Australia and Canada) the chief minister of a government of a state or province. <i>He holds the <b>premier</b> barony in the UK created in 1269.</i>
<b>preponderant</b>	Having superior power and influence. <i>The <b>preponderant</b> influence of the US within the alliance.</i>
