<b>expressly</b>	Explicitly; clearly. <i>She was <b>expressly</b> forbidden to use the stove.</i>
<b>extra</b>	Unusually or exceptionally. <i>Installation will cost about 60 <b>extra</b>.</i>
<b>extraordinarily</b>	In a very unusual or remarkable way. <i>He did a good job in <b>extraordinarily</b> difficult circumstances.</i>
<b>extremely</b>	To a high degree or extent; favorably or with much respect. <i>This is an <b>extremely</b> difficult thing to do.</i>
<b>in particular</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>incredibly</b>	To a great degree; extremely. <i>Behind you the coastal hills plunge to the <b>incredibly</b> blue sea backed by the Turkish mountains.</i>
<b>markedly</b>	In a clearly noticeable manner. <i>This advice is <b>markedly</b> different to that last year.</i>
<b>notably</b>	Especially; in particular. <i>A diet low in animal fat protects against potentially fatal diseases <b>notably</b> diabetes.</i>

<b>outstandingly</b>	Exceptionally. <b>Outstandingly</b> beautiful gardens.
<b>peculiarly</b>	To a distinctly greater extent or degree than is common. <i>Some patients were <b>peculiarly</b> difficult to cure.</i>
<b>really</b>	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>I think she s <b>really</b> great.</i>
<b>remarkably</b>	In a signal manner. <b>Remarkably</b> she hung on to her job.
<b>singularly</b>	In a strange or eccentric way. <i>You have <b>singularly</b> failed to live up to your promises.</i>
<b>especially</b>	In a special manner. <i>An <b>especially</b> or <b>specially</b> cautious approach to the danger.</i>
<b>specifically</b>	In a way that is exact and clear; precisely. <i>There are three genera in common but these differ <b>specifically</b>.</i>
<b>strikingly</b>	In a way that attracts attention by reason of being unusual, extreme, or prominent. <i>The stories <b>strikingly</b> illustrate the creative power of the imagination.</i>
