## Associations of "Pass on" (30 Words)

<a href="#">across</a>	Referring to a crossword answer which reads horizontally. <i>He had swum <b>across</b>.</i>
<b>along</b>	In line with a length or direction (often followed by `by' or `beside). <i>He had brought <b>along</b> a friend of his.</i>
<b>bye</b>	An automatic advance to the next round in a tournament without playing an opponent. <i>He has a <b>bye</b> into the second round.</i>
<b>conquer</b>	To put down by force or authority. <i>They ve <b>conquered</b> new markets in Japan.</i>
<b>crisscross</b>	Cross in a pattern, often random. <i><b>Crisscross</b> the sheet of paper.</i>
<a href="#">cross</a>	The cross on which Christ was crucified. <i><b>Cross</b> a horse and a donkey.</i>
<a href="#">exceed</a>	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>This <b>exceeds</b> all my expectations.</i>
<b>excel</b>	Distinguish oneself. <i>She <b>excelled</b> in math.</i>
<b>flit</b>	A sudden quick movement. <i>They did a moonlight <b>flit</b>.</i>
<b>outdo</b>	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>The men tried to <b>outdo</b> each other in their generosity.</i>
<b>outpace</b>	Surpass in speed. <i>Import growth <b>outpaced</b> export growth in the second quarter.</i>
<b>outrun</b>	Run faster than. <i>It s harder than anyone imagines to <b>outrun</b> destiny.</i>
<b>outstrip</b>	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>During the morning warm up he once again <b>outstripped</b> the field.</i>

<b>outwit</b>	Deceive by greater ingenuity. <i>Ray had <b>outwitted</b> many an opponent.</i>
<b>over</b>	Over the entire area. <i>The car flipped <b>over</b>.</i>
<b>overcome</b>	Overcome usually through no fault or weakness of the person that is overcome. <i>You must <b>overcome</b> all difficulties.</i>
<b>overlook</b>	Supervise. <i>He was <b>overlooking</b> his harvest men.</i>
<b>overreach</b>	An injury to a forefoot of a horse resulting from its having overreached. <i>The horse <b>overreached</b> jumping the first hurdle.</i>
<b>overstep</b>	Be superior or better than some standard. <i>He has <b>overstepped</b> the bounds of acceptable discipline.</i>
<b>overtake</b>	Catch up with and possibly overtake. <i>Weariness <b>overtook</b> him and he retired to bed.</i>
<b>route</b>	Send via a specific route. <i>Proposals have been put forward for a new <b>route</b> around the south of the town.</i>
<b>subdue</b>	Hold within limits and control. <i><b>Subdue</b> one's appetites.</i>
<b>surmount</b>	Be on top of. <i>The tomb was <b>surmounted</b> by a sculptured angel.</i>
<b>surpass</b>	Be greater in scope or size than some standard. <i>Her performance <b>surpasses</b> that of any other student I know.</i>
<b>through</b>	Throughout the entire extent. <i>Cut the lemon in half from top to bottom but not all the way <b>through</b>.</i>
<b>track</b>	Make tracks upon. <i><b>Track</b> mud into the house.</i>
<b>transcend</b>	Be or go beyond the range or limits of (a field of activity or conceptual sphere). <i>He doubts that he will ever <b>transcend</b> Shakespeare.</i>
<b>transgress</b>	Act in disregard of laws, rules, contracts, or promises. <i>She had <b>transgressed</b> an unwritten social law.</i>
<b>transit</b>	Revolve the telescope of a surveying transit about its horizontal transverse axis in order to reverse its direction. <i>The canal will <b>transit</b> hundreds of ships every day.</i>
<b>traverse</b>	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>Rivers <b>traverse</b> the valley floor.</i>
