across	Referring to a crossword answer which reads horizontally. <i>He had swum across.</i>
along	In line with a length or direction (often followed by `by' or `beside). <i>He had brought along a friend of his.</i>
bye	An automatic advance to the next round in a tournament without playing an opponent. <i>He has a bye into the second round.</i>
conquer	To put down by force or authority. <i>They ve conquered new markets in Japan.</i>
crisscross	Cross in a pattern, often random. <i>Crisscross the sheet of paper.</i>
cross	The cross on which Christ was crucified. <i>Cross a horse and a donkey.</i>
exceed	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>This exceeds all my expectations.</i>
excel	Distinguish oneself. <i>She excelled in math.</i>
flit	A sudden quick movement. <i>They did a moonlight flit.</i>
outdo	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>The men tried to outdo each other in their generosity.</i>
outpace	Surpass in speed. <i>Import growth outpaced export growth in the second quarter.</i>
outrun	Run faster than. <i>It s harder than anyone imagines to outrun destiny.</i>
outstrip	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>During the morning warm up he once again outstripped the field.</i>

outwit	Deceive by greater ingenuity. <i>Ray had outwitted many an opponent.</i>
over	Over the entire area. <i>The car flipped over.</i>
overcome	Overcome usually through no fault or weakness of the person that is overcome. <i>You must overcome all difficulties.</i>
overlook	Supervise. <i>He was overlooking his harvest men.</i>
overreach	An injury to a forefoot of a horse resulting from its having overreached. <i>The horse overreached jumping the first hurdle.</i>
overstep	Be superior or better than some standard. <i>He has overstepped the bounds of acceptable discipline.</i>
overtake	Catch up with and possibly overtake. <i>Weariness overtook him and he retired to bed.</i>
route	Send via a specific route. <i>Proposals have been put forward for a new route around the south of the town.</i>
subdue	Hold within limits and control. <i>Subdue one's appetites.</i>
surmount	Be on top of. <i>The tomb was surmounted by a sculptured angel.</i>
surpass	Be greater in scope or size than some standard. <i>Her performance surpasses that of any other student I know.</i>
through	Throughout the entire extent. <i>Cut the lemon in half from top to bottom but not all the way through.</i>
track	Make tracks upon. <i>Track mud into the house.</i>
transcend	Be or go beyond the range or limits of (a field of activity or conceptual sphere). <i>He doubts that he will ever transcend Shakespeare.</i>
transgress	Act in disregard of laws, rules, contracts, or promises. <i>She had transgressed an unwritten social law.</i>
transit	Revolve the telescope of a surveying transit about its horizontal transverse axis in order to reverse its direction. <i>The canal will transit hundreds of ships every day.</i>
traverse	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>Rivers traverse the valley floor.</i>
