contemptible	Deserving contempt; despicable. A display of <b>contemptible</b> cowardice.
deplorable	Of very poor quality or condition. Children living in <b>deplorable</b> conditions.
despicable	Morally reprehensible. A <b>despicable</b> crime.
<u>feeble</u>	Lacking physical strength, especially as a result of age or illness. <i>A <b>feeble</b> voice.</i>
hapless	Deserving or inciting pity- Galsworthy. The <b>hapless</b> victims of the disaster.
<u>inadequate</u>	Of insufficient quantity to meet a need. A sad solitary <b>inadequate</b> man.
insubstantial	Lacking in nutritive value. The huts are relatively few and <b>insubstantial</b> .



<u>insufficient</u>	Not enough; inadequate. <i>Insufficient</i> funds.
lamentable	(of an event, action, or attitude) unfortunate; regrettable. <i>The industry is in a <b>lamentable</b> state.</i>
meagre	Deficient in amount or quality or extent. They were forced to supplement their <b>meagre</b> earnings.
<u>miserable</u>	Pitiably small or inadequate. Their happiness made Anne feel even more <b>miserable</b> .
misfortunate	Especially of a person: unfortunate.
moving	Producing strong emotion, especially sadness or sympathy. She laid her case of destitution before him in a very <b>moving</b> letter.
<u>negligible</u>	Not worth considering. The effect was <b>negligible</b> .
paltry	Contemptibly small in amount. A <b>paltry</b> wage.
piteous	Deserving or inciting pity. A <b>piteous</b> cry.
pitiable	Contemptibly poor or small. <i>Pitiable</i> lack of character.
<u>pitiful</u>	Compassionate. Two children in a very <b>pitiful</b> state.
<u>plaintive</u>	Expressing sorrow. A <b>plaintive</b> cry.
<u>poignant</u>	Arousing affect. <b>Poignant</b> anxiety.
poor	Deserving or inciting pity. Many people are eating a very <b>poor</b> diet.
ridiculous	Deserving or inviting derision or mockery; absurd. That <b>ridiculous</b> tartan cap.
silly	Denoting fielding positions very close to the batsman. <i>He often drank himself <b>silly</b>.</i>
<u>sorry</u>	Bad; unfortunate. I felt <b>sorry</b> for the poor boys working for him.
stirring	Capable of arousing enthusiasm or excitement. <i>Stirring</i> songs.
touching	Arousing feelings of sympathy or gratitude. <i>His gratitude was simple and <b>touching</b>.</i>



<u>unsatisfactory</u>	Not giving satisfaction. Shops should take back <b>unsatisfactory</b> goods.
woeful	Affected by or full of grief or woe. <b>Woeful</b> errors of judgment.
worthless	Lacking in usefulness or value. That promise is <b>worthless</b> .
wretched	(of a person) in a very unhappy or unfortunate state. <i>A wretched life</i> .

calamitous	Having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. A <b>calamitous</b> defeat.
<u>catastrophic</u>	Relating to geological catastrophism. The body undergoes <b>catastrophic</b> collapse towards the state of a black hole.
defeated	People who are defeated. The <b>defeated</b> enemy.
dejected	Affected or marked by low spirits. Is <b>dejected</b> but trying to look cheerful.
deplorable	Deserving strong condemnation; completely unacceptable. <i>Children living in <b>deplorable</b> conditions.</i>
<u>disastrous</u>	Highly unsuccessful. United made a <b>disastrous</b> start to the season.



hapless	Deserving or inciting pity. A <b>hapless</b> victim.
inauspicious	Not auspicious; boding ill. This is the <b>inauspicious</b> star of disaster.
<u>inferior</u>	An inferior letter figure or symbol. <i>Inferior</i> alveolar artery.
lamentable	(of an event, action, or attitude) unfortunate; regrettable. A <b>lamentable</b> decision.
loser	A contestant who loses the contest. A ragtag community of rejects and <b>loser</b> s.
<u>miserable</u>	Deserving or inciting pity. Their happiness made Anne feel even more <b>miserable</b> .
mournful	Feeling, expressing, or inducing sadness, regret, or grief. <i>Her large <b>mournful</b> eyes.</i>
moving	In motion. Her ambition was to be in <b>moving</b> pictures or the movies.
piteous	Deserving or arousing pity. <b>Piteous</b> appeals for help.
pitiable	Deserving or inciting pity- Galsworthy. A <b>pitiable</b> imitation of the real thing.
<u>pitiful</u>	Compassionate. A <b>pitiful</b> attempt to impress her.
<u>pity</u>	A cause for regret or disappointment. It s a <b>pity</b> he couldn t do it.
regrettable	Deserving regret. It s <b>regrettable</b> that she didn t go to college.
ruinous	Disastrous or destructive. <i>The castle is <b>ruinous</b>.</i>
ruth	A feeling of sympathy and sorrow for the misfortunes of others.
sad	Of things that make you feel sad. Better by far that you should forget and smile Than that you should remember and be <b>sad</b> .
sadly	To a regrettable extent; regrettably. <i>His schemes went <b>sadly</b> awry.</i>
sadness	The state of being sad. It is one of life s <b>sadness</b> es.



<u>sorry</u>	Feeling regret or penitence. <i>He said he was <b>sorry</b> he had upset me.</i>
touching	Arousing affect. <i>His gratitude was simple and <b>touching</b>.</i>
<u>tragic</u>	Causing or characterized by extreme distress or sorrow. A <b>tragic</b> accident.
<u>unfortunate</u>	Not favored by fortune; marked or accompanied by or resulting in ill fortune. <i>An unfortunate</i> turn of events.
unlucky	Marked by or promising bad fortune- W.H.Prescott. An <b>unlucky</b> defeat.
wretched	Used to express anger or annoyance. I felt so <b>wretched</b> because I thought I might never see you again.
