anatomical	An expression that relates to anatomy. <i>Anatomical research</i> .
<u>anatomy</u>	A person's body. Every part of his <b>anatomy</b> hurt.
autopsy	Perform an autopsy on a body or organ. On <b>autopsy</b> it was established that he had suffered from a rare brain condition.
<u>cadaver</u>	The dead body of a human being. The <b>cadaver</b> was intended for dissection.
clinical	Relating to the observation and treatment of actual patients rather than theoretical or laboratory studies. <i>Clinical medicine.</i>
corpse	Spoil a piece of acting by forgetting one's lines or laughing uncontrollably. One singer ad libbed and <b>corpse</b> d his colleagues on stage.
cosmetic	Serving an esthetic rather than a useful purpose. The reform package was merely a <b>cosmetic</b> exercise.
dermatology	The branch of medicine dealing with the skin and its diseases.
dissection	A minute and critical analysis. This <b>dissection</b> of modern relationships.
doctor	Remove the sexual organs of (an animal) so that it cannot reproduce. <i>The reports could have been</i> <b>doctor</b> ed.
ear	Good hearing. She offers a sympathetic <b>ear</b> to worried pet owners.
gynecology	The branch of medicine that deals with the diseases and hygiene of women.



hospital	A charitable institution for the education of the young. <i>Christ's</i> <b>Hospital</b> .
medical	Relating to the study or practice of medicine. <i>He was transferred for further treatment to a <b>medical</b> ward.</i>
medicine	Medicine something that treats or prevents or alleviates the symptoms of disease. Fleur was murdering him by use of bad <b>medicine</b> .
microbiology	The branch of biology that studies microorganisms and their effects on humans.
morgue	A newspaper's collection of miscellaneous information for use in future obituaries. The cadavers were bagged and removed to the city <b>morgue</b> .
morphological	Relating to or concerned with the morphology of plants and animals. The geraniums have a number of unusual <b>morphological</b> adaptations.
<u>morphology</u>	The branch of biology that deals with the form of living organisms, and with relationships between their structures. <i>Grammar is organized along two main dimensions</i> <b>morphology</b> and syntax.
neurology	Neurology the branch of medicine that deals with the nervous system and its disorders.
nose	A front that resembles a human nose especially the front of an aircraft. She wanted a good <b>nose</b> round the house.
ophthalmology	The branch of medicine concerned with the study and treatment of disorders and diseases of the eye.
otolaryngology	The study of diseases of the ear and throat.
<u>physiological</u>	Relating to the branch of biology that deals with the normal functions of living organisms and their parts. Slow down your body s <b>physiological</b> response to anger by breathing deeply.
physiology	The branch of the biological sciences dealing with the functioning of organisms. The <b>physiology</b> of the brain.
psychiatry	The branch of medicine dealing with the diagnosis and treatment of mental disorders.
surgical	Done with great precision, especially with reference to a swift and highly accurate military attack from the air. <i>Surgical stockings.</i>



<u>therapy</u>	The treatment of mental or psychological disorders by psychological means. The <b>therapy</b> helps the patient to deal with difficult relationships.
treatment	Care provided to improve a situation (especially medical procedures or applications that are intended to relieve illness or injury. <i>The treatment of water sewage.</i>
vivisection	The practice of performing operations on live animals for the purpose of experimentation or scientific research (used only by opponents of such work. The abolition of <b>vivisection</b> .
